RESOLUTION NO. 110

RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING
WILLY WANG FOR WINNING A GOLD
MEDAL IN THE WUSHU DEMONSTRATION
EVENT IN THE 2008 BEIJING OLYMPICS

WHEREAS, the Philippine delegates, composed of 15 athletes, participated in various sports like boxing, taekwondo, archery, swimming, diving, track and field, trap shooting, weightlifting and wushu in the 2008 Beijing Olympics;


WHEREAS, in the wushu event, 24-year old Willy Wang, who trained for eight months, won the gold besting 20 other competitors in the men's nanguan and nangun events;

WHEREAS, wushu, an ancient martial arts which consists of two Chinese characters: wu, meaning, martial or military, and shu which translates into discipline, skill or method, is still an exhibition or demonstration sport in the Olympics, thus, medals won in the sport, do not count in the official medal tally of nations;


WHEREAS, for bagging the top prize in the said special event, Wang brought honor and glory to the country: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, as it is hereby, resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, To commend Willy Wang for winning a gold medal in the Wushu demonstration event in the 2008 Beijing Olympics.
