RESOLUTION No. 112

RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING AND
COMMENDING EUMIR FELIX MARCIAL FOR
WINNING THE BRONZE MEDAL IN THE
MEN'S MIDDLEWEIGHT BOXING EVENT OF
THE 2020 TOKYO OLYMPICS

WHEREAS, on 5 August 2021, Mr. Eumir Felix Marcial won the bronze medal in the men's middleweight boxing event of the 2020 Tokyo Olympics and became the country's fourth Olympic bronze medalist in boxing after Jose Luis Villanueva in 1932, Leopoldo Serrantes in 1988, and Roel Velasco in 1992;


WHEREAS, hailing from a family of boxers in Lunzuran, Zamboanga City, Mr. Marcial started training at the age of seven under the supervision of his father, Eulalio, and like most of the members of the Philippine team, he sees boxing as a means to help and support his family;

WHEREAS, Mr. Marcial became the first Filipino boxer to win a gold medal in the light bantamweight category of the AIBA Junior World Championships in 2011, was named Best Asian Youth Boxer of the Year in 2013, and won a gold medal at the 2015 Southeast Asian Games, a silver medal at the 2019 AIBA World Championships and at the 2015 ASBC Asian Confederation Boxing Championships, and a bronze medal at the 2018 Asian Games;


WHEREAS, his bronze-medal performance at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics has brought pride, glory, and inspiration to the Filipino people and has once again proven to the world the persistence and indomitable spirit of the Filipino athlete, for which he deserves to be honored and commended: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, To congratulate and commend, as it hereby congratulates and commends, Mr. Eumir Felix Marcial for winning the bronze medal in the Men's Middleweight Boxing event of the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.
