RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING THE UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES PRESIDENT EDGARDO J. ANGARA (UP PEJA) FELLOWSHIP AWARDEES

WHEREAS, the University of the Philippines President Edgardo J. Angara (UP PEJA) Fellowship Award was established on 29 September 2008 by the UP Board of Regents;

WHEREAS, the UP PEJA Fellowship Award aims to promote high-level policy discussions and research on a wide range of topics that address national development goals and initiatives, including fiscal budget and financial studies, politics, public administration, good governance, employment policy, and job creation;

WHEREAS, in 2023, the UP PEJA Fellowship Award was relaunched to support the work of the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM II), established pursuant to Republic Act No. 11899, in undertaking a comprehensive national assessment and evaluation of the performance of the Philippine education sector;

WHEREAS, the UP PEJA Fellowship Award is given to faculty members, researchers, and scholars based in the Philippines or abroad who have distinguished themselves in policy research, have leadership potential, have demonstrated commitment to service in both the public and private sectors, and have shown experience, aptitude, and interest in conducting research for the improvement of the education sector;
