EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution under Article 14, Section 12 provides:

The State shall regulate the transfer and promote the adaptation of technology from all sources for the national benefit....

Historically, our country has produced countless great scientists that have been recognized for their work, both locally and internationally. Many of our scientists have had the opportunity to train and interact with scientists from other countries, and to work for foreign research firms on projects funded by foreign countries with their national policies behind it. As a sovereign nation, we must also find a way to support out national policies with solid research and development, building upon collective advances in science and technology around the world.

This bill provides for the establishment of an office that will ensure science and technology cooperation with our international partners.

	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:		
6	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as "International Science and		
7	Technology Cooperation Act."		
8	SECTION 2. Establishment The Secretary of Science and Technology shall establish a		
9	committee under the National Academy of Science and Technology Executive Council with the		
10	responsibility to identify and coordinate international science and technology cooperation that		
11	can strengthen the Philippine science and technology enterprise, improve economic and national		
12	security, and support Philippine foreign policy goals.		
13	SECTION 3. Committee Leadership The committee established under Section 2 shall		
14	be co-chaired by senior level officials from the National Academy of Science and Technology		
15	Executive Council and the Department of Foreign Affairs.		
16	SECTION 4. Responsibilities The committee established under Section 2 shall-		
17	(a) plan and coordinate interagency international science and technology cooperative		
18	research and training activities and partnerships supported or managed by government agencies		
19	to help plan and coordinate the international component of national science and technology		
20	priorities;		
21	(b) establish national priorities and policies for aligning, as appropriate, international		
22	science and technology cooperative research and training activities and partnerships supported or		

managed by government agencies with the foreign policy goals of the Philippines;

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1	(c)	identify opportunities for new international science and technology cooperative
2	research and	training partnerships that advance both the science and technology and the foreign
3	policy priorit	ies of the Philippines;

- (d) in carrying out paragraph (c), solicit input and recommendations from non-government science and technology stakeholders, including universities, scientific and professional societies, industry, and relevant organizations and institutions, through workshops and other appropriate venues;
- (e) work with international science and technology counterparts, both non-governmental and governmental (in coordination with the Department of Foreign Affairs), to establish and maintain international science and technology cooperative research and training partnerships, as identified under paragraph (c); and
- (f) address broad issues that influence the ability of Philippine scientists and engineers to collaborate with foreign counterparts, including barriers to collaboration and access to scientific information.
- SECTION 5. Report to Congress. The Secretary of Science and Technology shall transmit a report annually to Congress containing a description of the priorities and policies established under Section 4(b), the ongoing and new partnerships established in the previous fiscal year, and how stakeholder input, as required under Section 4(d), was received.
- SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
- SECTION 7. Separability Clause. If, for any reason, any provision of this Act is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
- 25 SECTION 8. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
