RESOLUTION

CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING FILIPINO BOXER NONITO "THE FILIPINO FLASH" DONAIRE JR. FOR WINNING THE WORLD BOXING COUNCIL AND WORLD BOXING ORGANIZATION WORLD CHAMPION TITLES IN THE BANTAMWEIGHT DIVISION AFTER DEFEATING MEXICAN BOXER FERNANDO MONTIEL JR. AT THE MANDALAY BAY EVENTS CENTER IN LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, U.S.A. ON 19 FEBRUARY 2011.

WHEREAS, the Philippine Senate has in several occasions paid tribute to outstanding Filipino athletes for their astonishing feat of bringing home pride and glory to the country by becoming champions in international sporting competitions;

WHEREAS, this outstanding performance by our Filipino boxer deserves to be commended for the honor and recognition he has brought to our country.
