EXPLANATORY NOTE

The right to medical care is one of the fundamental rights of every human being. It is the policy of the State to "adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all people at affordable costs." Consequently, Republic Act No. 7875, otherwise known as National Health Insurance Act of 1995 was enacted to "provide health insurance coverage and ensure affordable, acceptable, available and accessible health care services for all citizens of the Philippines". Unfortunately, fifteen years after the passage of RA No. 7875, access to health care remains to be a problem particularly for the poor and underprivileged.

This bill amends specific provisions of RA 7875 in order to provide a definite targeting strategy in identifying the poorest forty percent (40%) of the Filipino population through the use of a means test set by the national government. This targeting strategy will allow the national government to effectively use funds to provide said indigent beneficiaries with health insurance coverage. Thus, contributions for the poorest twenty percent (20%) of the population shall be subsidized entirely by the national government. The contributions for the next poorest twenty percent (20%) of the population shall be subsidized entirely by the local government units or by cost sharing mechanism between the LGU and the private sector.

This comprehensive approach to health and human development deviates from the practice of treating public health as just another area of political patronage. Instead, it recognizes the advancement and protection of public health particularly of the poorest of the poor as a key measure of governance. Lastly, by strengthening the powers and functions of the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation, we shall be better equipped at achieving our goal of universal health care coverage.

Foregoing considered, the approval of this bill is hereby requested.

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
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AN ACT

PROVIDING A DEFINITE TARGETING STRATEGY IN IDENTIFYING THE POOR, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7875, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE A'CT OF 1995", AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representative of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Sec. 4, Article II of Republic Act No. 7875, is hereby further amended by 1 2 inserting a new paragraph after paragraph 11), to read as follows: "SEC. 4. "C) CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE INFORMAL SECTOR SHALL BE BASED PRIMARILY ON HOUSEHOLD EARNINGS AND ASSETS.

SEC. 5. Section 29 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 29. Payment for Indigent Contributions. - [Contributions for indigent members shall be subsidized partially by the local government unit where the member resides. The Corporation shall provide counterpart financing equal to the LGU's subsidy for indigents: Provided, That in the case of fourth, fifth or sixth class LGU's, the National Government shall provide up to ninety percent (90%) of subsidy for indigents for a period not exceeding five (5) years. The share of the LGU's shall be progressively increased until such time that its share becomes equal to that of the National Government.] CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THE POOREST 20% OF THE POPULATION AS IDENTIFIED BY A MEANS TEST DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH) SHALL BE SUBSIDIZED ENTIRELY BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT. ALLOCATION FOR THE ENROLLMENT OF THESE INDIGENTS SHALL BE APPROPRIATED IN THE GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT AS A SEPARATE LINE ITEM IN THE DOH BUDGET AND ADJUSTED ANNUALLY TO COVER FOR PROPORTIONATE CHANGE IN THE NUMBER OF THE POOR BASED ON THE NATIONAL STATISTICS OFFICE POVERTY STATISTICS. THE NEXT POOREST 20% OF THE POPULATION OR THE POOR AS IDENTIFIED BY THE SAME MEANS TEST SHALL BE SUBSIDIZED ENTIRELY BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS OR BY COST SHARING MECHANISMS BETWEEN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

SEC. 6. Implementing Rules and Regulations – The DOH and the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) shall issue the necessary rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 7. Repealing Clause – All laws, issuances or any part thereof inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 8. Effectivity – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
