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"AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND PROMOTION OF ORGANIC AGRICULTURE IN THE PHILIPPINES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Organic Agriculture Act of 2009."

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote, propagate, develop further, and implement the practice of

to promote, propagate, develop further, and implement the practice of organic agriculture in the Philippines that will cumulatively condition and enrich the fertility of the soil, increase farm productivity, reduce pollution and destruction of the environment, prevent the depletion of natural resources, protect the health of farmers, consumers, and the general public, and save on imported farm inputs. Towards this end, a comprehensive program for the promotion of community-based organic agriculture systems which include, among others, farmer-produced purely organic fertilizers such as compost.

among others, farmer-produced purely organic fertilizers such as compost, pesticides and other farm inputs, not those that are commercially processed; together with a nationwide educational and promotional campaign for their use and processing, as well as the adoption of organic agricultural system as a viable alternative, shall be undertaken.

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- The State recognizes and supports the central role of the farmers,
- 2 indigenous people and other stakeholders at the grassroots in this program.
- 3 SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. For purposes of this Act, the following terms

a. Organic Agriculture - includes all agricultural systems that promote

4 shall be defined as follows:

- the ecologically sound, socially acceptable, economically viable and technically feasible production of food and fibers. Organic agriculture dramatically reduces external inputs by refraining from the use of chemical fertilizers, pesticides and pharmaceuticals. It also covers areas such as but not limited to soil fertility management, varietal breeding and selection under chemical and pesticide-free conditions, and other cultural practices that enhance productivity without destroying the soil and harming farmers,
 - b. Organic refers to the particular farming and processing systems, described in the standards and not in the classical chemical sense. The term "organic" is synonymous in other languages to "biological" or "ecological". It is also a labeling term that denotes products according to organic standards.

consumers and the environment as defined by the International Federation of

Organic Agriculture Movement (IFOAM).

c. Biodegradable wastes – refer to organic matter for compost/organic fertilizer for the organic cultivation, farming of food crops and include discards segregated farm non-biodegradable wastes coming from the kitchen/household (leftovers, vegetables and fruit peelings and trims, fish/fowl cleanings, seeds, bones, soft paper used as food wrap and the like), yard or garden (leaves, grasses, weeds and twigs), market (wilted, decayed or rotten vegetables and fruits, fish/fowl cleanings, bones) and farm wastes (grass clippings, dead or decayed plants, leaves, fruits, vegetables, branches, twigs and the like).

- d. Ecologically-sound refers to a state, quality, or condition of a
- 2 product, practice, system, development mode, culture, environment and the
- 3 like, in accord with the 1987 Philippine Constitution, and as expounded in
- 4 the above definition of organic agriculture.
- e. Commercialization is a process of introducing a new agricultural
- 6 and fishery technology either as product, process, or service that has
- 7 undergone the intensive innovative activities of assessment, promotion, and
- 8 transfer for economic benefit.
- 9 f. Certification is the procedure by which official certification bodies
- 10 or officially recognized certification bodies provide written or equivalent
- assurance that foods or food control systems conform to requirements.
- g. Accreditation is the procedure by which a government agency
- 13 having jurisdiction formally recognizes the competence of an inspection
- 14 and/or certification body to provide inspection and certification services.
- 15 h. First Party Verification is defined as when the verification criteria
- and rules are set and monitored/enforced by the producer or company itself.
- i. Second Party Verification is defined as when the verification
- 18 criteria and rules are set by buyers or industry organizations.
- j. Third Party Verification or independent certification is defined as
- 20 when a firm requires that its suppliers meet a certain standard and requests
- 21 an independent organization that is not involved in the business relationship
- 22 to control the compliance of the suppliers.
- 23 **SEC. 4.** Coverage The provisions of this Act shall apply to the development
- 24 and promotion of organic agriculture and shall include, but not limited to the
- 25 following:
- a. Policy formulation on regulation, registration, accreditation.
- 27 certification and labeling on organic agriculture;

b. Research, development, and extension of appropriate, sustainable environment and gender-friendly organic agriculture;

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- c. Promotion and encouragement of the establishment of facilities,

 equipment and processing plants that would accelerate the production and

 commercialization of organic fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides and other

 appropriate farm inputs; and
- d. Implementation of organic agricultural programs, projects and activities, including the provision and delivery of support services with focus on the farmers and other stakeholders.
 - SEC. 5. Program. There is thereby established a comprehensive organic agricultural program through the promotion and commercialization of organic farming practices, cultivation and adoption of production methods which have already been developed, continuing research and upgrading thereof, the education of more farmers and consumers thereon, the extension of assistance to Local Government Units (LGUs), Peoples' Organizations (POs), Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and civil society including individuals and groups who are practicing and promoting these methods as well as those who are willing to do other pertinent activities, and documentation and evaluation of the program. The Department of Agriculture (DA) through the Bureau of Agriculture and Fisheries Product Standards (BAFPS) shall take the lead role, supported by the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR) and Department of Education (DEPED) and other relevant government agencies such as but not limited to Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), Department of Science and Technology (DOST), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), Department of Health (DOH) and Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), in their respective areas of concern.

- 1 SEC. 6. Research, Development and Extension The Bureau of Agricultural
- 2 Research (BAR) shall be the lead agency in the coordination and
- 3 management with the other agencies of the DA, DAR, DOST, DEPED, DILG,
- 4 strategic agricultural-based State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) including
- 5 private organizations, for the formulation and implementation of a unified and
- 6 integrated organic agriculture Research, Development and Extension Plans
- 7 and Programs (RDEP) from the national to the field level. The Organic
- 8 Agriculture RDE Plans and Programs shall include but not be limited to the
- 9 following:
- a. Research, development and commercialization of appropriate,
- 11 innovative and viable organic agricultural technologies;
- b. Nationwide promotion of developed and commercially viable
- 13 biodegradable farm wastes and by-products through various extension
- 14 strategies to accelerate the production, use and distribution of organic
- 15 fertilizers; and
- 16 c. Conduct research for market development, policy formulation,
- 17 regulation and certification.
- 18 SEC. 7. Creation of Organic Agriculture RDE Network. An Organic
- 19 Agriculture Research, Development and Extension (RDE) Network shall be
- 20 organized by BAR, composed of research and educational institutions, local
- 21 government units, non-government agencies and the recognized association
- 22 of organic fertilizer manufacturers and distributors, agricultural engineers,
- 23 agriculturists, soil technologists, farmers groups and/or associations.
- 24 SEC. 8. Research Development and Extension Centers. National, Regional
- 25 and Provincial Organic R&D and Extension Centers shall be organized and
- established within ninety (90) days following the approval of this Act, which
- 27 shall be integrated as a major component of the existing RDE Centers of DA,
- 28 DOST, DENR, SUCs and LGUs. These will be strengthened and enhanced to

spearhead the integrated program to develop and promote organic

2 agriculture throughout the country.

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SEC. 9. Creation of the National Organic Agriculture Board (NOAB). - In 3 pursuance of the abovementioned policies, the NOAB is hereby created. It 4 shall be composed of the Secretary of the DA or his designate with a rank of 5 Undersecretary from among the undersecretaries of DA, as Chairman, and 6 one (1) representative each, who shall be not less than a bureau director 7 level, from the following agencies: DAR, DEPED, DTI, DOST, DILG, DOH and 8 9 DENR, and shall be designated by their respective Secretaries on a 10 permanent basis; and one representative each from the following private sectors: farmer operating an organic farm, organic handler and processor; 11 12 organic fertilizer producer; NGO/PO representing consumer interest; 13 organic certifying body; and the academe, duly endorsed by their respective 14 industry associations and all to be appointed by the President of the Republic of the Philippines and shall serve for a term of three (3) years without 15 16 reappointment.

The Chairman shall, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, convene the NOAB.

The NOAB shall be assisted by a technical secretariat from the BAFPS of the DA, and shall directly report to the Office of the Secretary on matters pertaining to the activities of the NOAB. The number of staff of the technical secretariat and the creation of corresponding positions necessary to complement and/or augment the existing plantilla of the NOAB shall be determined by the Board, subject to approval by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and the existing civil service rules and regulations.

During the transition period which begins upon the approval of this Act, the existing NOAB created under Executive Order No. 481 Series of 2005, shall continue to function until the new NOAB created under Section 9 of this

- 1 Act shall have been organized and constituted. Within thirty (30) working
- 2 days from the effectivity of this Act, the national organizations of organic
- 3 farmers, of NGOs/POs, and of agricultural SUCs shall submit their respective
- 4 nominees to the Chairman of NOAB, who shall evaluate the qualifications of
- 5 the nominees and submit a final list of at least three (3) nominees from each
- 6 sector to the President for appointment. The nominees shall be
- 7 knowledgeable and have gained relevant experience on organic agriculture.
- 8 SEC. 10. Powers and Functions of the NOAB. The NOAB shall have the
- 9 following powers and functions:
- a. Formulate policies, plans, programs and projects to develop and promote organic agriculture;
- b. Oversee the successful implementation of the organic agriculture
 programs and projects;
- c. Identify sources of financing to expand organic agriculture:
- d. Monitor and evaluate the performance of programs for appropriate incentives;
- e. Call upon any government agency to carry out and implement programs and projects identified by the board;
- f. Call upon private sectors, POs and NGOs, and the academe to provide
 advice on matters pertaining to organic agriculture and conduct of
 capability-building initiatives to farmers, producers, extension
 workers, consumers and other stakeholders in agriculture sector in
 collaboration with the Agricultural Training Institute of the DA;
- g. Submit annual and other periodic reports to the President, Secretary of
 the DA and the Congress of the Philippines through the Congressional
 Oversight Committee on Agricultural and Fisheries Modernization
 (COCAFM);

1	h.	Promulgate such rules and regulations and exercise such other powers
2		and functions as may be necessary to carry out effectively the purpose

- and objectives of this Act; and
- 4 i. Perform such other functions as may be necessary for its effective
- 5 operations and for the continued enhancement, growth or development
- 6 of organic agriculture.
- 7 The Chairman shall call the members of the NOAB, or a majority thereof if
- 8 not all have been designated, to a meeting to organize themselves and
- 9 prescribe its rules and procedures for the attainment of the objectives of this
- 10 Act. A majority of all the members of the NOAB shall constitute a quorum.
- The NOAB shall also determine its budget, including travel expenses,
- 12 allowances and per diems of its non-government members when attending
- official board meetings or attending to matters assigned to them.
- 14 SEC. 11. The Bureau of Agriculture and Fisheries Product Standards
- 15 (BAFPS) of the Department of Agriculture. The BAFPS of the DA shall serve
- 16 as the national technical and administrative secretariat of the NOAB with the
- 17 member agencies providing additional staff support as the need arises.
- 18 SEC. 12. Functions, Duties and Responsibilities of the BAFPS. The BAFPS,
- 19 in addition to its existing functions and responsibilities shall perform the
- 20 following functions, duties and responsibilities for purposes of this Act:
- a. Implement organic agriculture programs and projects approved by the
- 22 NOAB;
- 23 b. Update the NOAB on the status of the programs, projects and activities
- 24 undertaken for the development and promotion of organic agriculture;
- c. Create effective networking with the various stakeholders involved in
- organic production; and
- 27 d. Perform such other functions, duties and responsibilities as may be
- 28 necessary to implement this Act and as directed by the NOAB.

- 1 SEC. 13. Local Technical Committees. Every provincial governor shall, in
- 2 so far as practicable, form a local technical committee, and which shall
- 3 operate within his province in coordination and mutual assistance with the
- 4 BAFPS, pursuant to the provisions of this Act. The governor shall see to it that
- 5 the city and municipal mayors and barangay chairmen will do the same
- 6 within the area of their respective jurisdiction.
- 7 SEC. 14. Accreditation of Organic Certifying Body. The BAFPS is hereby
- 8 designated and authorized to grant Official Accreditation to Organic
- 9 Certifying Body or entity. The BAFPS is tasked to formulate the necessary
- 10 rules and procedures in the Accreditation of Organic Certifying Body:
- 11 Provided, however, that there shall be at least one (1) accredited Organic
- 12 Certifying Body each in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao or in case of only one
- 13 (1) Organic Certifying Body is accredited, it shall have at least one (1) satellite
- office or processing unit each in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.
- 15 **SEC. 15.** Certification of Organic Produce. There shall be a certification
- 16 process which shall attest that a particular agricultural product has adhered to
- 17 and followed organic agriculture standards, systems and practices. The
- 18 Certification process shall include but not be limited to the following elements
- 19 of certification:
- a. Standards:
- 21 b. Contracts;
- c. Inspection;
- 23 d. Certification or Approval; and
- e. Management

- 26 SEC. 16. Labeling of Organic Produce. The label of organic produce shall
- 27 contain the name, logo or seal of the Organic Certifying Body and the
- 28 Accreditation Number issued by the BAFPS. Only Third Party Verification or

- 1 Independent Certification is required to be labeled, however, the organic
- 2 producer may put label on his produce for First Party or Second Party
- 3 Verification: Provided, That such labeling shall clearly and conspicuously
- 4 indicate that it is a First Party or Second Party Verification.
- 5 SEC. 17. Retailing of Organic Produce. Retail establishments or stores of
- 6 organic produce shall designate a separate area to display the organic
- 7 produce to avoid mixing it with non-organic produce.
- 8 SEC. 18. Incentives. The Government shall extend incentives for the
- 9 production and propagation of organic farm inputs by maximizing their use in
- all government and government-supported agricultural production, research
- and demonstration programs. The DA, DAR, DOST, DEPED, DILG, DTI,
- 12 Department of Finance (DOF), Land Bank of the Philippines (LBP) and other
- 13 government lending or financial institutions, shall assist organic input
- 14 producers and organic farmers in conversion through the provision of
- 15 adequate financial, technical, marketing and other support services. These
- 16 include the following:
- a. Vat and duty-free importation of agricultural equipment/machinery/implements for use in organic agriculture;
- b. LGUs to identify local taxes that may be offered as incentives to
- 20 organic inputs, organic input producers and manufacturers, and
- 21 farmers utilizing organic agriculture;
- c. LBP to give preferential loan rates and to open a special loan
- window to organic input producers and manufacturers and farmers
- 24 utilizing organic agriculture;
- 25 d. Tax incentives, including tax holiday, in accordance with the
- 26 provisions of EO 226 of the Omnibus Investment Code; and
- e. Subsidies for certification fees and other support services to
- 28 facilitate organic certification.

- 1 SEC. 19. Appropriations. The sum of Fifty million pesos (P50,000,000.00) for
- 2 the initial year of implementation of this Act is hereby appropriated.
- 3 Thereafter, such amount as may be necessary for the continuous
- 4 implementation of the program shall be included in the annual General
- 5 Appropriations Act (GAA).
- The NOAB is hereby authorized to solicit and accept assistance from
- 7 individuals and entities here and abroad, and to utilize these funds and
- 8 resources for purposes of this Act subject to the usual budget, accounting and
- 9 auditing rules and regulations.
- 10 SEC. 20. Implementing Rules and Regulations. The NOAB shall adopt
- rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Act within ninety (90)
- days from the effectivity of this Act and submit the same to the COCAFM for
- 13 review and approval.
- 14 SEC. 21. Annual Report. The NOAB shall render annual report to both
- 15 Houses of Congress on the accomplishment of the program. A review on the
- viability of the program shall be made by the concerned agencies after five
- 17 (5) years of its implementation.
- 18 SEC. 22. Congressional Oversight Committee. The Congressional
- 19 Oversight Committee on Agricultural and Fisheries Modernization (COCAFM)
- 20 shall be the congressional oversight committee for purposes of this Act. The
- 21 COCAFM shall review and approve the implementing rules and regulations of
- 22 this Act and also perform the following functions:
- a. Monitor and ensure the proper implementation of this Act;
- b. Review the proper implementation of the programs of the
- 25 organic agriculture and the use of its funds;
- 26 c. Review the performance of the NOAB; and
- d. Such other functions it deems necessary.

- 1 SEC. 23. Penal Provision . Any person who willfully and deliberately
- a. obstructs the development and propagation of organic
- agriculture, or the production, sale or use of organic
- 4 agricultural inputs;
- b. refuses without just cause to extend the support and assistance
- 6 required under this Act; or
- 7 c. mislabels or claims that the product is organic when it is not in
- 8 accordance with the existing standards for Philippine organic
- 9 agriculture
- shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment of not less than one (1)
- 11 year nor more than six (6) years, or a fine of not less than Fifty thousand pesos
- 12 (P50,000.00) or both, at the discretion of the court. If the offender is a
- 13 corporation or juridical entity, the official who ordered or allowed the
- 14 commission of the offense shall be punished with the same penalty. If the
- offender is in the government service, he shall, in addition, be dismissed from
- 16 office.
- 17 SEC. 24. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act is declared
- 18 invalid or unconstitutional, the other provision not affected thereby shall
- 19 remain in full force and effect.
- 20 SEC. 25. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive
- 21 orders, presidential proclamation, rules and regulations or parts thereof
- 22 contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified
- 23 accordingly.
- 24 **SEC. 26.** Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its
- 25 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation or in the
- 26 Official Gazette, whichever comes first.
