A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CONCERN OF THE SENATE THAT HUMAN TRAFFICKING WORSENS IN THE PHILIPPINES

- Whereas, human trafficking situation in the Philippines has worsen according to the 2009 US Department of State Trafficking in Persons Report;
- Whereas, the Trafficking in Persons (TIP) Report is an annual account of foreign governments' efforts to eliminate severe forms of trafficking in persons;
- Whereas, the United States' Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (TVPA), as amended, mandates the submission of the US Congress of the TIP report;
- Whereas, the TVPA guides efforts to combat human trafficking;
- Whereas, the report summarizes the evaluation on countries' prosecution, convictions, and legislation tied to human trafficking;
- Whereas, the 2009 TIP report places the Philippines to Tier 2 Watch List, one notch lower from last year's Tier 2 status;
- Whereas, Tier 2 Watch List countries do not comply to the obligations set by the TVPA and the number of victims is significant or rising;
- Whereas, the TIP Report describes the Philippines as a source, transit, and destination country for men, women, and children trafficked for commercial sexual exploitation and forced labor;
- Whereas, the report also discloses that organized crime syndicates were heavily involved in Manila's commercial sex industry;
- Whereas, there may be a need for legislation to provide government policy capable to immediately address the problem of worsening problem of human trafficking in the country.

Be it resolved, as it is hereby resolved, to express the concern of the Senate that human trafficking worsens in the Philippines.
