**“AN ACT
DECLARING DECEMBER 6 A SPECIAL NONWORKING
HOLIDAY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF INOPACAN, PROVINCE
OF LEYTE TO BE KNOWN AS ‘INOPACAN DAY’”**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the
Philippines in Congress assembled:*

SECTION 1. December 6 of every year is hereby declared a special nonworking holiday in the Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte to commemorate its founding day and to be known as “Inopacan Day”.

SEC. 2. During its founding day, the Municipality of Inopacan shall engage in festivities and conduct ceremonies and programs in cognizance of its history and culture, to be led by its officials and employees in coordination with civic, sports, religious and nongovernmental organizations and private businesses.

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a national newspaper of general circulation.
