RESOLUTION CONCURRING IN THE RATIFICATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION ON THE SIMPLIFICATION AND HARMONIZATION OF CUSTOMS PROCEDURES (AS AMENDED)

WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 7, Section 21 states, "No treaty or international agreement shall be valid and effective unless concurred in by at least two-thirds of all the members of the Senate";

WHEREAS, the International Convention on the Simplification and Harmonization of Customs Procedures (Kyoto Convention) was adopted in Kyoto on 18 May 1973 and entered into force on 25 September 1974;

WHEREAS, in its 94th Session last June 1999, 114 customs administrations of the World Customs Organization (WCO) including the Philippines, adopted the International Convention on the Simplification and Harmonization of Customs Procedures (as amended), known as the Revised Kyoto Convention (RKC), which entered into force on 3 February 2006;

WHEREAS, the RKC endeavors to accomplish the following:

- 1. Promote international trade by establishing a universal system of simplified and harmonized customs procedures;
- 2. Create better understanding of compliance requirements leading to increased transparency and predictability in customs procedures;
- 3. Impact positively on border security as it promotes the secure movement of legitimate trade across the globe;
- 4. Prevent the passing of national legislation contrary to the principles of the Convention:
- 5. Implement special procedures for low-risk importers; and
- 6. Reduce the time and cost of clearing customs in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, in the two hearings conducted by the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations on 15 May 2008 and 22 May 2009, the following agencies endorsed the concurrence in the ratification of the Revised Kyoto Convention:
