EXPLANATORY NOTE

Reckless driving is a mental state in which the driver displays a wanton disregard for the rules of the road and the driver often misjudges common driving procedures, often causing accidents and other damages.

Road traffic accidents are now mentioned in the same breath as killer diseases. The World Health Organization (WHO) ranks it among the top ten (ninth as of 2004) causes of death. This year alone, the number of traffic related accidents has increased to 30 to 40 percent. A total of 6,845 accidents had already been recorded across the country from January to July. Over-speeding caused at least 2,161 cases, followed by bad overtaking with 1,971, and bad turning, 1,732. From 2007 to July 2009, "human error" was the biggest factor in the accidents.

The opportunity for genuine reforms that would lead to safer roads is here and it is imperative that that the legislative branch act decisively. Needless to say, this will require strong commitment and cooperation among various stakeholders to ensure success in reducing the rate of traffic accidents and making our roads safe for the present and future generations. The proposed bill seeks to impose the accessory penalty of a driver's license suspension or revocation in order to curb traffic accidents caused by reckless driving.

SECTION 4. *Certificate of Completion.* – A certificate issued by the driving school that the person has completed the refresher course required in the previous section shall be presented to the Land Transportation Office for purposes of reinstating a suspended license.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. – If any provision or part thereof, is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 6. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or issuance,
executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to,
or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended
accordingly.

31 SECTION 7. *Effectivity Clause*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
 32 after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
