EXPLANATORY NOTE

R. A. 6657 otherwise known as the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Law sought to redistribute ownership of agricultural lands, and free the Filipino farmer from the bondage of poverty and deprivation.

Voluntary land transfers as provided in Section 20 of the CARL encourages both land-owner and farmer-beneficiary to enter directly into a contract for the sale and transfer of agricultural land in order to facilitate the implementation of the law. In reality however, this process has been mired in tedious procedures entailing a multilayered bureaucratic system of review and approval.

This bill seeks to address the situation by simplifying the procedure, and minimizing bureaucratic red tape. As proposed, land-owner and farmer-beneficiary may freely set the terms of such transfer, provided that those terms are not less favorable than those imposed by R.A. 6657. Hence, the land transfer may take effect when the farmer-beneficiary signifies his agreement to the amount and terms of payment. In addition, the bill mandates that the farmer-beneficiary be granted access to financial support from the Land Bank of the Philippines for production, technology transfer and marketing facilities, up to an amount equal to 85% of the selling price of the land acquired under CARL.

The government's commitment to social redistributive justice will be measured by the effectiveness and efficiency with which the agrarian reform law is implemented to deliver a better life for the Filipino farmer. Empowering the farmer also means empowering him to negotiate on equal terms with the land-owner to take possession of what is hi by virtue of the law.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

PROVIDING AMPLE OPPORTUNITY TO ALLOW LANDOWNERS AND TENANTS TO ENTER UNTO VOLUNTARY LAND TRANSFER AND/OR DIRECT PAYMENT SCHEME AND AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NUMBERED SIXTY-SIX HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SEVEN OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE COMPREHENSIVE AGRARIAN REFORM LAW OF NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT, AMENDED

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Republic of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 20 of Republic Act No. 6657, otherwise known as
 the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Law of 1988, as amended, is hereby
 amended to read as follows:
 "Section 20. Voluntary Land Transfer. – Landowners of
 agricultural lands subject to acquisition under this Act may enter into a
 voluntary agreement for direct transfer of their lands to qualified

7 beneficiaries subject to the following guidelines:

"(a) All notices petitions for voluntary land transfer must be 8 submitted to the DAR within the first year of the implementation of the 9 CARP and should be acted upon within thirty (30) days from receipt 10 thereof. Negotiations between the landowners and qualified beneficiaries 11 covering any voluntary land transfer which remain unresolved after one 12 (1) year from submission of petitions shall not be recognized and such 13 land shall instead be acquired by the government and transferred 14 pursuant to this Act; b) The terms and conditions of such transfer shall 15

not be less favorable to the transferee than those of the government's
 standing offer to purchase from the landowner and to resell to the
 beneficiaries, if such offers have been made and are fully known to both
 parties;

(C) THE AGRARIAN REFORM BENEFICIARY AGREES TO THE
 AMOUNT AND THE TERMS OF PAYMENT;

7 (D) THE DAR SHALL ACT AS MEDIATOR IN CASES OF
 8 DISAGREEMENT BETWEEN THELANDOWNER AND THEFARMER
 9 AND/OR FARMER BENEFICIARY;

[c] (E) The voluntary agreement shall include sanctions for non compliance by either party and shall be duly recorded and its
 implementation monitored by the DAR;

(F) TO ENSURE THE VIABILITY OF THIS SCHEME, THE LAND BANK
OF THE PHILIPPINES (LBP) SHALL EXTEND TO THE FARMER
BENEFICIARIES FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR PRODUCTION,
TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AND MARKETING FACILITIES AND/OR
ACTIVITIES; AND

(G) THE FARMER AND/OR FARMER BENEFICIARY SHALL BE
ELIGIBLE TO BORROW FROM THE LBP AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO
EIGHTY FIVE PERCENT (85%) OF THESELLING PRICE OF THE LAND
THAT THEY HAVE ACQUIRED."

22 SEC.2. All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations, or 23 parts hereof inconsistent with the provision of this Act are hereby repealed, 24 amended or modified accordingly.

25 SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in 26 the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation 27 whichever comes earlier.
