EXPLANATORY NOTE

The attached bill seeks to create the Cebu Water Resources Development and Management Authority primarily to integrate, plan, develop and manage all water supply and distribution services in Metro Cebu and Cebu Province.

Cebu's burgeoning economic development and population growth demand a corresponding effective and efficient water supply both for domestic and commercial purposes. To achieve this goal, there is a need to integrate the planning, development, and management, embracing all the concerns and activities of various agencies which have to do with water supply, from the conservation of the watersheds, maintenance of ecological and environmental factors for preserving the potability of water to the distribution services of water to users.

For Cebu to fulfill its role as the major catalyst of development, as a trading center for the Central Philippines and Northern Mindanao, this pressing and critical problem of adequate water supply must be solved expeditiously. The integration of the direction and activities of all the agencies having a stake in this crucial concern is necessary to attain an accelerated and cost-effective solution to this urgent problem.

With those grave considerations in mind, it is felt that a system of integrated planning, development and management of water supply and distribution services could best be achieved by a separate agency specifically established and tasked for the purpose.

Accordingly, the approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

CREATING THE CEBU WATER RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY, CHARGED WITH INTEGRATING AND COORDINATING VARIOUS AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONAL INSTRUMENTALITIES DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY HAVING TO DO WITH THE WATER SUPPLY AND SERVICES FOR METRO CEBU AND CEBU PROVINCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. *Title.* This Act shall be known and cited as the "Charter of the Cebu Water Resources Development and Management Authority."
- 3 SEC. 2. Creation of the Cebu Water Resources Development and
- 4 Management Authority. There is hereby established a body corporate to be
- 5 known as the Cebu Water Resources and Management Authority which shall be
- 6 attached to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources for the
- 7 purpose of policy coordination. The principal office of the Authority shall be
- 8 located in Cebu City.
- The Authority may have such branches, agencies or subsidiaries as it may deem proper and necessary.
- SEC. 3. *Primary Purpose and Objectives.* The Authority shall principally undertake the economical, efficient and effective control for the protection of watersheds, including the ecological and environmental requirements for safe water supply; likewise the planning, construction, and management of water impounding structures, reservoirs and extraction of water from natural aquifers; further, the supervision of water supply services to be

undertaken in Metro Cebu, as well as the entire Cebu Province.	In addition, it
shall have the following objectives:	

- a) To encourage and promote the conservation and development of all watershed areas of the Province in line with the objectives of ecological and environmental protection in general, and, the maintenance of unpolluted and safe potable water supply, in particular.
- b) To develop and upgrade surface water resources, as well as, to monitor and control the exploitation of underground aquifers.
- c) To upgrade the water supply system to effectively render efficient water service to domestic and commercial consumers.
- **SEC. 4.** Functions, Powers and Duties. The Authority shall have the following functions, powers and duties:
 - a) To formulate a comprehensive and integrated development policy and program for the over-all water resources of Metro Cebu and Cebu Province and to implement, review and update such policy and program periodically;
 - b) To control, supervise and construct, maintain, and operate all infrastructure and facilities attendant to the services of providing efficiently adequate water supply to the Cebu Metropolis and Province.
 - c) To promulgate rules and regulations governing the planning, development, maintenance, operation, and improvements of water sourcing facilities and to control and supervise its construction of any structure or distribution system rendering any water service in Metro Cebu and Province:
 - d) To exercise all powers of a corporation under the Corporation Code of the Philippines, insofar as those powers are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

e) To acquire, purchase, own, administer, lease, mortgage, sell or otherwise dispose of any property granted, ceded or purchase pursuant to its business functions and services;

- f) To exercise the power of eminent domain in the pursuit of its purposes and objectives;
- g) To control and service the levying and collecting of dues, charges, fees or assessments for the services of providing water system and use of water by consumers and for any other services provided by the Authority.
- h) To retain and appropriate dues, fees and charges collected by the Authority relative to the supplying of water for such measures as may be necessary to make the Authority more effective and efficient in the discharge of its assigned tasks;
- i) To invest its idle funds, as it may deem proper, in government securities and other evidences in indebtedness; and
- j) To provide services, whether on its own or otherwise, in the watersheds, water supply source areas, and water distribution system as may be necessary or in connection with the maintenance and operations of supplying water systems and other facilities.
- SEC. 5. Police Authority. The Authority shall have the power to exercise such police authority as may be necessary to maintain the security of watershed areas, dams and water reservoirs, water extraction facilities and supply systems or areas of operation to carry out its functions and attain its purpose and obligations: Provided, That the Authority may request assistance of law enforcement agencies, including request for deputization as may be required. Such police authority shall be exercised in connection with the following, among others:
 - a) Control of habitation and farming activities in watershed areas;

2	environmental conditions of reserved areas for purposes of water
3	conservation, safety and anti-pollution measures;
4	c) Guarding and supervising the security of pipe lines and water
5	distribution systems against vandalism and illegal tapping;
6	d) Regulation and supervision of private security agencies
7	operating within areas of jurisdiction of the Authority;
8	e) Enforcement of rules and regulations promulgated by the
9	Authority pursuant to law; and
10	f) In case of emergencies or imminent danger involving threat to
11	the infrastructure of the water supply and water systems caused by natural
12	calamities as well as deeds of terrorism.
13	SEC. 6. Board of Directors The Board shall be composed of eleven
14	(11) members. The chairman shall be the Secretary of Environment and Natural
15	Resources. The vice-chairman shall be the General Manager of the Authority.
16	The following shall be the members:
17	a) Chairman of LWUA;
18	b) Secretary of the Department of Finance or his duly authorized
19	representative;
20	c) Secretary of the Department of Justice or his duly authorized
21	representative;
22	d) Secretary of the Department of Interior and Local Government
23	or his duly authorized representative;
24	e) A representative from the MCWD;
25	f) Three (3) members from the private sector recommended by the
26	Governor of the province of Cebu who shall serve for a term of three (3)
27	years.
28	g) The Governor of Cebu or his duly authorized representative.

2	requirements and compensation or allowances of the members of the Board.
3	SEC. 7. Functions, Powers and Duties of the Board In addition to
4	the powers vested in the Board under the other sections of this Act, the Board
5	shall have the following functions, powers and duties:
6	a) To define and approve the programs, plans, policies,
7	procedures and guidelines of the Authority for the development and
8	management of the water supply and distribution system of Metro Cebu
9	and the Province;
10	b) To approve the Authority's organizational and administrative
11	structure, staffing patterns, operating and capital expenditures, and
12	financial budgets, upon recommendation of the General Manager, subject
13	to existing laws, rules and regulations;
14	c) To approve salary ranges, benefits and other terms and
15	conditions of service for all officers and employees of the Authority, upon
16	recommendation of the General Manager, which shall, as far as possible,
17	be competitive with those offered in the private sector, subject to existing
18	laws, rules and regulations;
19	d) To fix the rate of dues, charges, fees and assessments for the
20	supply and use of water upon recommendation by the General Manager;
21	and
22	e) Generally, to exercise all the function and powers necessary or
23	incidental to attain the purposes and objective of this Act.
24	SEC. 8. Functions, Powers and Duties of the General Manager
25	The General Manager shall be directly responsible to the Board and shall have
26	the following functions, powers, and duties:
27	a) To direct and supervise the day-to-day management, operation
28	and administration of the Central office of Water Resources Supply

Development and Distribution System;

b) To implement and enforce decisions, orders, rules and regulations issued, prescribed or adopted by the Board;

- c) To undertake research, studies, investigations and other activities related to the integrated operation and future improvements of watershed management, development of water supply and distribution system, and to submit comprehensive reports and appropriate recommendations to the Board for proper actions;
- d) To appoint, transfer, suspend, remove or otherwise discipline and subordinate officer or employee of the Authority, subject to the approval of the Board and in accordance with the existing rules and regulations of the Civil Service Commission and the Commission on Audit.
- e) Within the limits of the authority delegated to him by the Board, to execute contracts, incur obligations, acquire and dispose of assets, and deliver documents on behalf of the Authority.
- f) To perform such other duties as the Board may delegate or assign, and such acts as may be necessary and proper to implement this Act.
- **SEC. 9.** Capital. The Authority shall have an authorized capital stock equal to and consisting of:
 - a) The value of fixed assets acquired for the establishment of the Central Office and such other properties, movable and immovable, as may be ceded from agencies and institutions integrated or merged with or which come under the direct management of the Authority as valued on the date of the effectivity of this Act;
 - b) The value of such real estate owned and/or ceded by the Cebu City Government, Cebu Provincial Government, other political subdivisions, and other government instrumentalities and agencies.
 - c) Government contributions in such amount as may be deemed an appropriate initial balance. Such initial amount approved by the

President of the Philippines which shall be more or less equivalent to six

(6) months working capital requirement of the Authority, is hereby authorized to be appropriated in the General Appropriation's Act of the year following its enactment into law.

Thereafter, the government contribution to the capital of the Authority, shall be provided for in the General Appropriation's Act.

SEC. 10. Auditor. - The Commission on Audit shall appoint a representative who shall be the auditor of the Authority, together with the necessary personnel to assist said representative in the performance of his duties. The number and salaries of the auditor and said personnel shall be determined by the Chairman of the Commission on Audit, subject to the rules and regulations of the Commission on Audit.

The auditor shall, as soon as possible, but not later than three (3) months after the accounts have been submitted for audit, send an annual report to the Board. The auditor may also submit such periodic or special reports as the Board may deem necessary.

- **SEC. 11.** Annual Report. The Board shall submit to the President of the Philippines through the Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and to the both Houses of the Congress of the Philippines, together with the audit report on the relevant accounts, an annual report generally dealing with the activities and operations of the Authority.
- SEC. 12. Applicability of Civil Service Laws. The Authority and its officials and employees shall be subject to Civil Service law and its rules and regulations.
 - SEC. 13. Borrowing Power. The Authority may, in accordance with Section 21, Article XII of the Constitution and other existing laws, rules and regulations on local or foreign borrowing, raise funds, either from local or international sources by way of loans, credit or securities, and other borrowing instruments with the power to create pledges, mortgages and other voluntary

loans or encumbrances on any of its assets or properties, subject to the prior 2 approval of the President of the Philippines.

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All loans contracted by the Authority under this section, together with all interests and others sums payable in respect thereof, shall constitute a charge upon all the revenues and assets of the Authority and shall rank equally with one another, but shall have priority over any other claim or charge on the revenue and assets of the Authority: Provided, That this provision shall not be construed as a prohibition or restriction on the power of the Authority to create pledges, mortgages and other voluntary liens or encumbrances on any assets or property of the Authority.

The payment of the loans or other indebtedness of the Authority shall be guaranteed by the National Government subject to the approval of the President of the Philippines.

SEC. 14. Tax Exemptions. - The Authority shall be exempt from realty taxes imposed by the National Government or any of its political subdivisions, agencies and instrumentalities: Provided. That no tax exemption herein granted shall extend to any subsidiary which may be organized by the Authority.

SEC. 15. Transfer of Existing Facilities and Intangible Assets. - All existing land, building and other properties, movable and immovable, belonging to or presently administered by MCWD and all assets, powers, rights, interests and privileges relating to water sourcing and supply, including all equipment which are necessary for their operations, likewise the authority and prerogatives of LWUA, WRB and Watershed Management Agency pertaining and relevant to the development of water resources and supply in Cebu Province and Metro Cebu including a share of the annual appropriations for the purposes and projects of these entities intended for Cebu Province and Metro Cebu with all their pertinent records and personnel of their respective branch offices are hereby transferred to the Authority: Provided, however, That the operation and

- services of MCWD be maintained under a management team subject to the Authority.
- SEC. 16. *Projects in Progress.* All planned and on-going projects related to water sourcing development and supply of MCWD as well as those of LWUA intended for the Cebu Province and Watershed Rehabilitation and Restoration Projects of these and other government agencies shall be administered and undertaken by the Authority.

- SEC. 17. Transfer of Liabilities and Debts. Upon the transfer to and acceptance by the Authority of the existing physical facilities, intangible assets and completed projects referred to in the preceding sections, all debts, liabilities, and obligations of government agencies or entities concerned with respect to such physical facilities, tangible assets and completed projects within Metro Cebu and Province shall likewise be assumed by the Authority.
- SEC. 18. Abolition or Taking Over of Entities. The PAWS and provincial watershed units of PENRO, CENRO, LWUA Provincial Office and such other agencies having supervision and control of the watershed rehabilitation and restoration are hereby abolished. The powers, functions, responsibilities of MCWD taken over by the Authority, as well as the determination of personnel are to be retained: *Provided*, That all officials and employees whose service are terminated shall, if not eligible for retirement be given gratuities equivalent to one (1) month salary for every year of continuous satisfactory service on the basis of the highest salary received in addition to other benefits accorded by them by existing laws.
- **SEC. 19.** *Repealing Clause.* All laws, executive orders, letters of instruction, rules and regulations, or provisions thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

- SEC. 20. Separability Clause. If any portion hereof shall be held
- 2 invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the
- 3 other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 4 SEC. 21. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
- 5 its publication in at least two (2) national newspaper of general circulation.
