## INTRODUCED BY Senator TEOFISTO "TG" GUINGONA III

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is considered the "principal government agency for raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance, and services, and charities of national character." As its primary mandate is to provide funding for charity, the PCSO should not further be saddled with implementing the government's charitable programs.

Charitable programs sponsored by the government should be delegated to government agencies with the expertise in and the familiarity with putting into operation health programs, medical assistance, and charities. To allow PCSO to focus singularly on revenue-generation, the health program should be managed by the Department of Social Welfare and Development. By providing the PCSO more leeway to generate revenues for these programs- without the additional burden of concerning itself with the responsibility of ensuring their implementation – the PCSO will have the opportunity to establish more efficient ways of increasing funding for its charitable pursuit.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate enactment of this measure is earnestly sought.

## INTRODUCED BY Senator TEOFISTO "TG" GUINGONA III

## AN ACT

TO FURTHER STRENGTHEN THE PCSO CHARTER AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE Republic Act 1169, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR CHARITY SWEEPSTAKES, HORSE RACES, AND LOTTERIES" AS AMENDED BY B.P. BLDG. 42 AND P.D. NO. 1157

SECTION 1. SECTION 1 OF REPUBLIC ACT 1169 HEREBY AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

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Section 1. The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office – The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office, hereinafter designated the Office, WHICH SHALL BE UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, IS TASKED TO RAISE AND PROVIDE [the principal government agency for raising and providing for funds for health programs AND WELFARE **AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES** SOCIAL PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT, RESPECTIVELY [medical assistance and services, and charities of national character], and as such shall have the general powers conferred in section thirteen of Act Numbered One thousand four hundred fiftynine, as amended, and shall have the authority:

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- A. To hold and conduct [charity sweepstakes races,] CHARITY lotteries and other similar activities, in such frequency and manner, as shall be determined, and subject to such rules and regulations as shall be promulgated by the Board of Directors.
- B. ASIDE FROM THE ACTIVITIES MENTIONED IN PARAGRAPH (A), subject to the approval of the SECRETARY

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, [ Minister of Human Settlements] to [engage in health and welfare-related investments,] INVEST IN programs, projects, and activities which ARE [may be] profit-oriented, by itself or in collaboration, association, or joint venture with any person, association, company or entity, whether domestic or foreign, [except for the activities mentioned in the preceding paragraph (A)], for the purpose of providing for ADDITIONAL, permanent and continuing sources of funds for health programs AND SOCIAL SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH **AND** DEPARTMENT SOCIAL WELFARE AND  $\mathbf{OF}$ **DEVELOPMENT, RESPECTIVELY.** [including the expansion of existing ones, medical assistance and services, and/or charitable grants: Provided, That such investments will not compete with the private sector in areas where investments are adequate, as may be determined by the National Economic and Development Authority.]

[C. To undertake any other activity that will enhance its funds generation operations and funds management capabilities, subject to the same limitations provided for in the preceding paragraph.]

It shall have a Board of Directors, hereinafter designated the Board, composed of five members who shall be appointed, and whose compensation and term of office shall be fixed, by the President (Prime Minister). [Amended by Batas Pambansa Blg. 42 dated 24 September 1979]

SECTION 2. SECTION 3 OF REPUBLIC ACT 1169, AS AMENDED, IS HEREBY REPEALED.

SECTION 3. SECTIONS 4 AND 6 OF REPUBLIC ACT 1169, AS AMENDED, ARE HEREBY REPEALED.

SECTION 4. SECTION 6 OF REPUBLIC ACT 1169, AS AMENDED, IS HEREBY AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Section 6: Allocation of Net Receipts – [From] The gross receipts OF ITS OPERATIONS AND INVESTMENTS SHALL BE ALLOCATED, ON A MONTHLY BASIS, AS FOLLOWS [from the sale of sweepstakes tickets, whether for sweepstakes races, lotteries, or similar activities, shall be deducted the printing cost of such tickets, which in no case shall exceed two percent of such gross receipts to arrive at the net receipts. The net receipts shall be allocated as follows]:

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A. [Fifty-five (55%)] **THIRTY PERCENT (30%)** shall be set aside as a prize fund for the payment of prizes [including those] for the owners [jockeys of running horses, and sellers] of winning tickets. **THE USE AND MANAGEMENT OF THIS FUND SHALL BE UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE.** 

Prizes not claimed by the public within one year from date of draw shall be considered forfeited, and shall form part of the charity fund for disposition as stated below.

B. [Thirty] FORTY percent (40%) [(30%)] shall be set aside as contributions to the charity fund AND THE USE AND MANAGEMENT THEREOF SHALL BE UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT: 20% FOR THE DOH AND 20% FOR THE DSWD. THIS FUND SHALL BE USED FOR THE HEALTH PROGRAMS AND SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES OF THE DEPARTMENTS MENTIONED.

[from which the Board of Directors, in consultation with the Ministry of Human Settlement on identified priority programs, needs, and requirements, in specific communities and with approval of the Office of the President (Prime Minister), shall make payments or grants for health programs, including the expansion of existing ones, medical assistance and services and/or charities of national character, such as the Philippine National Red Cross, under such policies and subject to such rules and regulations as the Board may from time establish and promulgate. The Board may apply part of the contributions to the charity fund to approved investment of the Office pursuant to Section 1(B) hereof, but in no case shall such application to investments exceed ten percent (10%) of the net redeipts from the sale of sweepstakes tickets in any given year.]

Any property acquired by an institution or organization with funds given to it under this Act shall not be sold or otherwise disposed of without the approval of the Office of the President (Prime Minister), and that in the event of its dissolution all such property shall be transferred to and shall automatically become the property of the Philippine Government.

- C. [Fifteen (15%] **THIRTY** percent (30%) shall be set aside as contributions to the operating expenses and capital expenditures of the Office.
  - THE BOARD MAY APPLY PART OF THIS FUND TO APPROVED INVESTMENTS OF THE OFFICE PURSUANT TO SECTION 1(B)
