
## THIRTEENTH CONGRESS OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES

Introduced by Senator S. R. Osmeña III

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This bill seeks the reorganization of the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) so that it can be more responsive to the needs of the public and the industry which it oversees.

Under the proposed provision of this bill,

- a) The NTC shall be a collegial body of five members, with a chairman and four associate commissioners, appointed for a term of three years. The increase in membership and reduction in the tenure of the commissioners, as well as stricter qualification requirements for members will upgrade the quality of leadership and policy-making within the commission;
- b) The expanded powers and functions of the Commission shall include the issuance of Certificates of Authority for the operation of various types of public utilities engaged in the telecommunications business; the monitoring of the activities of telecommunications public utilities; and adjudicatory powers to settle disputes and controversies involving violations of its rules and regulations and other related laws.
- c) There will be greater transparency in the exercise of the NTC's power to suspend, cancel or revoke permits or authorizations. In the determination of rates and charges, public hearings will be required.

The NTC needs a restructuring to enable it to provide good governance over telecommunications industry which has benefitted from remarkably rapid technological advances.


In view of the foregoing, early passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

#### AN ACT

## REORGANIZING THE NATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress Assembled:

SECTION 1. - Short Title - This Act shall be known as the "National Telecommunications Commission Reorganization Act of 2004."

Sec 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the Date to develop and maintain viable, efficient, reliable, universal and affordable communications systems as an effective instrument for economic growth and development. It is committed to encourage the participation of the private sector in the development the telecommunications, broadcasting and other communications services industry. It warrants the formulation of policies designed to create a viable, fair, competitive and responsive economic environment.

**Sec. 3.** *Reorganization.* - In accordance with the provisions of this Act, the National Telecommunications Commission, an attached agency of the Department of Transportation and Communications, hereinafter referred to as the Commission, is hereby reorganized with its structure, powers and functions modified.

**Sec. 4.** The Commissioners. - The Commission shall be reorganized into a collegial body of five (5) members, composed of a Chairman and four (4) Associate Commissioners, who shall be appointed by the President of the Philippines each

member serving for a term of three (3) years: *Provided*, That the term of the first appointed Chairman shall be three (3) years and the first appointed Associate Commissioners two (2) and one (1) year, respectively: *Provided further*, That no member shall be reappointed for more than one (1) term.

The Commissioners shall serve in a hold-over capacity until their successors are duly appointed. All vacancies, except through the expiration of a term, shall be filled for the unexpired term only. In no case shall any Commissioner be designated or appointed in a temporary or acting capacity.

The Commissioners shall be members of the bar or licensed engineers of unquestioned integrity, proven competence, and recognized as experts in the field of telecommunications, broadcasting, and other communications services. Upon assumption of office, the Commissioners shall divest themselves of any affiliation with or interest in any public utility, company or entity falling under the jurisdiction of the Commission.

The Commissioners shall enjoy the rank, salary and privileges of a Department Undersecretary.

- **Sec. 5.** *Powers and Functions. -* The Commission shall exercise the following powers and functions:
  - a) To issue different classes of Certificates of Authority for the operation of varied types of telecommunications, broadcasting and other communications utilities and services conformable with the Constitution, the issued legislative franchises and other applicable laws;
  - b) To establish and prescribe rules, regulations, standards, specifications in all cases related to the issued legislative franchises or Certificates of Authority and administer and enforce the same.
    - c) To grant permits and licenses for the use of radio frequencies;
  - d) To establish, prescribe and regulate areas of operation of particular operators of telecommunications and broadcast stations;

- f) To monitor all telecommunications, broadcast and other communications service activities and investigate illegal or inappropriate utilization of radio stations, equipments and/or frequencies, and to exercise the necessary police powers for the enforcement thereof, including deputation of such police, military or civilian entities or agencies for the purpose.
- g) To suspend, cancel and/or revoke any certificate, permits or licenses or any authorization, upon notice and hearing called for the purpose for any violations of the provisions of an order of the Commission and other applicable laws; Provided, That the Commission may suspend immediately permits/licenses and/or certificates as national security, public safety, public welfare and public interest may require; Provided, however, That a hearing shall immediately be called within five (5) days from said suspension.
- h) To require any public service or utility to produce before the Commission any and all records, data, statistics, and documents deemed proper or necessary in the exercise of its powers and functions, and to cite in contempt, direct or indirect, any person who fails or refuses to comply with any lawful order of the Commission.
- i) To assign radio frequencies based from the national frequency allocation as recommended in those frequency bands allocated by the International Telecommunications Union to the specific services and to coordinate its uses at the national and international level of coordination;
- j) To conduct qualifying examinations for radio operators and technicians and to issue the appropriate certificate to successful examinees;

k) To coordinate and cooperate with government agencies and other entities concerned with any aspect involving communications with a view to continuously improve the communications service in the country.

l) To perform such other functions not inconsistent herewith as may be necessary to achieve the purpose of this Act or as maybe prescribed by law.

Sec. 6. Administrative Adjudication. - The Commission shall exercise original and exclusive jurisdiction to hear and decide cases and controversies involving violations of the provisions of the rules and regulations it promulgated under this Act and under other laws it administer. This shall likewise include provisions of the Constitution, legislative franchises and laws relating to the ownership, establishment, operation and maintenance of public utilities engaged in business of telecommunications, broadcasting, and other communications services.

The Commission shall a adopt uniform rule or procedure to achieve a just, expeditious and inexpensive determination and settlement of disputes presented before it.

Any case or controversy presented before the Commission shall decided within thirty (30) days after it is submitted for resolution. Only one (1) motion of reconsideration shall be allowed. Any order, ruling or decision shall become final and executory after the lapse of fifteen (15) days from the receipt of by the parties a copy thereof.

- Sec. 7. Judicial Review. Any order, ruling, award or decision of the Commission may be appealed to the Court of Appeals on questions of law and facts following the procedures for appeals from the Regional Trial Courts to the Court of Appeals as far as practicable and consistent with this Act. If the appeal is only on questions of law, the same shall be brought to the Supreme Court on certiorari.
- **Sec. 8.** *Administrative Organization.* The Chairman of the Commission shall be the Chief Executive Officer, directly responsible for the administrative operation and management of the Commission.

There shall be Regional Offices to be located in each geographical region of the country to function as regional extension of the Commission in serving the public.

These offices shall function as line organizations, interfacing directly with the public in their respective regions. There shall be at least one (1) field office in every region that will handle, the renewal of permits and licenses, handling and hearing of complaints by the public against telecommunications, broadcast and other communication service operators and supervision of field facilities of these telecommunication, broadcast and other communication service operators.

The Commission *en banc* shall reform the existing organizational set-up and shall ensure that it will function with maximum operational efficiency, with the staff organization providing specialized advises and services to the Commissioners. To the extent reasonably justified, all existing employees shall be retained, reclassified or retrained and transferred to an appropriate position or function. Otherwise, employees separated from the Commission as a result of the reorganization provided herein shall be entitled to the appropriated separation pay, and other benefits accruing to them under pertinent laws in force at the time of their separation.

- Sec. 9. Promulgation of Implementing Rules. Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Commission shall promulgate the rules, regulations, measures, guidelines and other standards with the appropriate sanctions thereof and shall make a biennial review to determine whether such rules and regulations conform to the provisions of this Act or have to be repealed or modified as they are no longer necessary or have to be updated in the public interest as a result of technological advances or meaningful economic competitions between the operators of such services.
- **Sec. 10.** *Annual Report.* The Commission shall submit an annual report to the Congress not later than thirty-first (31st) of March of each year. The report shall include:
- a) List the specific goals, objectives, and priorities of the Commission which shall be projected over a five (5) year plan;
- b) Describe in detail the programs which are, or shall be, established to meet or carry out goals, objectives, and priorities and their implementations;

- c) Provide an evaluation of actions taken during the preceding year with regard to fulfilling the functions of the Commission, including a report on the performance and status of all franchise grantees; and
- d) Contain recommendations for legislative action required to enable the Commission to meet its objectives.
- Sec. 11. Repealing Clause. The provisions of Executive Order No. Five
  Hundred Forty-Six and all other laws, decrees, charters, executive orders,
  administrative orders, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are
  hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.
  - All Provisional Authorities (PAs), permits or licenses issued in favor of telecommunications and broadcast operators without legislative franchises are hereby revoked.
  - **Sec. 12.** Separability Clause. If any of the sections or provisions of this Act is held invalid, all the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid.
  - **Sec. 13.** *Effectivity Clause.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after the completion of its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
