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EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article X, Sec. 11 of the 1987 Constitution provides that "The Congress may, by law, create special metropolitan political subdivisions, subject to a plebiscite, The jurisdiction of the metropolitan authority that will thereby be created shall be limited to basic services requiring coordination. Pursuant thereto, this bill seeks to create a special political subdivision to be known as the Metropolitan Cebu.

Introduced by Senator S. R. Osmeña III

Over the years, Cebu has developed into a bustling metropolis. It is second to Metro Manila in terms of level of urbanization and economic growth. As in any other urbanized area, the demands for more effective delivery of basic services is tremendous. Immediate response to these needs is key to a sustained development of the Metropolitan Cebu Area. This bill therefor proposes the creation of an entity that will coordinate and best administer the efficient delivery of basic services.

In view of the foregoing, early passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

AN ACT

CREATING METROPOLITAN CEBU, ESTABLISHING THE METROPOLITAN CEBU DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. *Declaration OF Policies.-* It is the declared policy of the 2 State to accelerate the improvement of the physical, economic and social 3 structure of local government units and consistent therewith, services and 4 resources to achieve commonly beneficial purposes.

SECTION 2. Creation and Jurisdiction of Metropolitan Cebu: the

6 *Metropolitan Cebu Development Authority.-* There is hereby created a 7 special metropolitan political subdivision to be known as Metropolitan Cebu, 8 embracing the cities of Cebu, Mandaue, Lapu-Lapu and Talisay and the 9 Municipalities of Cordova, Consolacion, Liloan, Compostela, Minglanilla and 10 Naga.

The affairs of Metropolitan Cebu shall be administered by the Metropolitan
 Cebu Development Authority, hereinafter referred to as "MCDA".

13 SECTION 3. Scope of MCDA Services.- The MCDA shall primarily 14 render services that have metro-wide impact, transcending local political 15 boundaries of entailing huge expenditures, such that it would not be viable for 16 said services to be provided by the individual local government units (LGUs) 17 comprising Metropolitan Cebu. These services shall include:

1.

a) Development planning that includes the preparation of medium and long term development plans, the development and evaluation projects and investment programs, the coordination of plans, programs and projects, and the monitoring and evaluation of the progress and effects of project implementation;

b) Transport and traffic management designed to promote the safe and convenient movement of persons and goods, which shall include the formulation, coordination, and monitoring of policies, standards, programs and projects to rationalize transport and traffic management operations and services, their infrastructure requirement, provisions for the mass transport system and the institution of a system to regulate road users;

11 c) Solid waste disposal and management that includes the formulation 12 and implementation of policies, standards, programs and projects for proper 13 sanitary waste disposal. It shall likewise include the establishment and operation 14 of sanitary land fill and related facilities and implementation of other alternative 15 programs intended to reduce, reuse and recycle solid waste;

d) Flood control and sewerage management that includes the formulation
 and implementation of policies, standards, programs and projects for an
 integrated flood control, drainage and sewerage system;

e) Urban renewal, zoning and land use planning, and shelter services that shall include the formulation, adoption and implementation of policies, guidelines, standards, rules and regulations, programs and projects to rationalize and optimize urban land use and provide direction to urban growth and expansion, the rehabilitation and development of slum and blighted areas, the development of shelter and housing facilities and the provision of necessary social services;

f) Health and sanitation and environment pollution control that includes
the formulation and implementation of policies, rules and regulations, standards,
programs and projects for the promotion and safeguarding of the health and
sanitation of the region and for the enhancement of ecological balance;

g) Public safety that includes the formulation and implementation of programs and policies and procedures to achieve public safety, especially preparedness for preventive or rescue operations during times of calamities and disasters such as conflagration, earthquakes, flood and tidal waves, and coordination and mobilization of resources and the implementation of contingency plans for the rehabilitation and relief operations in coordination with national agencies concerned.

8 SECTION 4. *Metro Cebu Council.-* The governing board and policy 9 making body of the MCDA shall be the Metro Cebu Council, hereinafter referred 10 to as the "Council", composed of the mayors of the cities and municipalities 11 enumerated in Section 2 hereof and two (2) representatives from the private 12 sector to be appointed by them.

The heads of the Department of Transportation and Communications (DOTC) Department Works and Highways (DPWH), Department of Tourism (DOT), Department of Budget and Management (DBM), Housing and Urban Development Coordinating Committee (HUDCC), and Philippine National Police (PNP) or their duly authorized representatives, shall attend meetings of the council as non-voting members.

The Council shall be headed by a Chairman who shall be annually elected from among its members, including the private sector representatives, He shall be vested with the rank, rights and privileges, and subject to the disqualifications and prohibitions of a cabinet member.

The Chairman shall be assisted by a general manager, an assistant general manager for finance and administration, an assistant general manager for planning and an assistant general manager for operations, all of whom shall be appointed by the President with the consent and concurrence of the majority Council, subject to civil service laws, rules and regulations. They shall enjoy security of tenure and may be removed only for cause in accordance with law.

1 The chairman and members of the Council shall be entitled to allowances 2 and per diems in accordance with existing policies, rules and regulations.

3 SECTION 5. Functions and Powers of the Metro Cebu Development
 4 Authority.- The MCDA shall have the following functions and powers:

a) Formulate, coordinate and regulate the implementation of medium and
long-term plans and programs for the delivery of metro-wide services, land use
and physical development within Metropolitan Cebu, consistent with national
development objectives and priorities;

b) Prepare, coordinate and regulate the implementation of medium-term
investment programs for metro-wide services which shall indicate the sources
and used of funds for priority programs and projects, and shall include the
packaging of projects and their presentation of funding institutions;

c) Undertake and manage, through appropriate project management
 offices it may create, metro-wide programs and projects for the delivery of
 specific services under its jurisdiction, subject to the approval of the Council;

d) Coordinate and monitor the implementation of such plans, programs
 and projects in Metro Cebu; identify bottlenecks and adopt solutions to problems
 of implementation; Promulgate policies concerning traffic in Metro-Cebu and
 coordinate and regulate the implementation of all programs and projects,
 concerning traffic operation, enforcement and management and other activities
 and undertakings allied thereto;

e) Install and administer a single ticketing system, fix, impose and collect 22 fines and penalties for all kinds of violations of traffic rules and regulations, 23 whether moving or non-moving in nature, and confiscate and suspend or revoke 24 drivers licenses in the enforcement of such traffic laws and regulations, the 25 26 provisions of Republic Act No. 4136 and Presidential Decree No. 1605 to the 27 contrary notwithstanding. For this purpose, the Authority shall enforce all traffic laws and regulations in Metro Cebu, through its traffic operation center, and may 28 29 deputize members of the PNP, traffic enforces of all local government units, duly

licensed security guards, or members of non-governmental organizations to
 whom may be delegated certain authority, subject to such conditions and
 requirements as the Authority may impose;

f) Assess, levy and collect fees and charges for the use of facilities or
services rendered and impose such fines as it may deem necessary and proper
in connection therewith;

g) Perform other related functions required to achieve the objectives of
MCDA, including the undertaking of delivery of basic services to the local
government units when deemed necessary, subject to prior coordination with
and consent of the local government unit concerned.

SECTION 6. *Function of the Metro Cebu Council.* The Council shall
 have the following powers and functions:

a) Approve metro-wide plans, programs and projects and issue rules and
 regulations and resolutions deemed necessary by the MCDA to carry our the
 purposes of this Act;

b) Increase the rate of allowance and per diems of the members of theCouncil to be effective during the term of the succeeding Council:

18 c) Fix the compensation of the officers and personnel of the MCDA, and 19 approve the annual budget thereof for submission to the (DBM); and

d) Promulgate rules and regulations and set policies and standards for
metro-wide application governing the delivery of basic services, the assessment,
levy and collection of service and regulatory fees, and the imposition and
collection of fines and penalties.

24 SECTION 7. *Powers and Functions of the Chairman.- the* Chairman of 25 the Council shall have the following powers and functions:

a) Appoint, subject to civil service laws, rules and regulations, all
subordinate officers and employees, who shall enjoy security of tenure and may
be removed only for cause in accordance with law;

b) Engage the services of experts/ consultants either on full time or part
time bases, as may be required in the performance of his functions and duties
as may be determined by the Chairman;

c) Execute and administer the policies, measures and decisions
approved by the Council and be responsible for the efficient and effective dayto-day management of the operations of the MCDA;

7 d) Prepare the annual budget for the operations of the MCDA for
8 submission to the Council;

e) Submit for consideration of the Council such other policies and
measures as he may deem necessary to carry out the purposes and provisions
of this Act;

12 f) Subject to the guidelines and policies set by the Council, prepare the 13 staffing pattern and fix the number of subordinate officials and employees of the 14 MCDA; and exercise the power to discipline subordinate officials and employees 15 under the provisions of the law;

16 g) Prepare an annual report on the accomplishments of the MCDA at the 17 close of each calendar year for submission to the Council and to the President 18 of the Philippines; and

h) Perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the President
or by the Council.

21 SECTION 8. *Functions of the General Manager.* The general 22 manager shall:

a) Assist the chairman in the administration of the MCDA and supervision
of subordinate personnel;

25 b) Assist the chairman in the supervision of the operation of the various
26 operating centers and units of MCDA;

c) Assist the chairman in the review of plans and programs for the MCDA
and for the Metro Cebu in the preparation of the annual report of the activities
and accomplishment of the MCDA; and

d) Perform such other duties and functions as may be lawfully delegated
or assigned by the Chairman from time to time.

SECTION 9. Institutional Linkages of the MCDA.- The MCDA shall, in 3 carrying out its functions, consult, coordinate and work closely with the local 4 government units (LGUs), the National Economic and Development Authority 5 (NEDA) and other national government agencies mentioned in Section 4 6 hereof, and accredited people's organization (POs), non-governmental 7 organizations (NGOs), and the private sector operating in Metro Cebu, The 8 MCDA chairman or his authorized representative from among the Council 9 10 members, shall be ex-officio members of the boards of government corporations and committees of the department and offices of government 11 whose activities are relevant to the objectives and responsibilities of the MCDA, 12 and which shall include, but not be limited to, MCWD, DOTC, DPWH, HUDCC 13 14 and the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG).

15 The MCDA, upon consultation with the Regional Development Council 16 (RDC), as far as practicable, shall have a master plan that shall serve as the 17 framework for the local development plans of the component LGUs.

18 The MCDA shall submit its development plans and investment programs 19 to the NEDA for integration into the Medium-Term Philippine Development Plan 20 (MTPDP) and public investment program.

The implementation of the MCDA's plans, programs and projects shall be undertaken by the LGUs, the concerned national government agencies, the POs, NGOs and the private sector and the MCDA itself where appropriate. For this purpose, the MCDA may enter into contracts, memoranda of agreement and other cooperative arrangements with these bodies for the delivery of the required services within Metropolitan Cebu.

The MCDA, shall, in coordination with the NEDA and the Department of Finance, interface with the foreign assistance agencies for purposes of

obtaining financing support, grants and donations in support of its programs
 and projects.

3 SECTION 10. Sources of Funds; Operating Budget of MCDA.- TO 4 carry out the purposes of this Act, the amount of THREE HUNDRED MILLION 5 PESOS (P300,000,000.00) is hereby authorized to be appropriated for the initial 6 operation of the MCDA. Thereafter, the annual expenditures, including capital 7 outlays, shall be provided in the General Appropriations Act.

8 In addition, to strengthen MCDA's operational requirements, the proceeds 9 from the revenue-raising powers under Section 5 hereof shall accrue exclusively 10 to MCDA;

11 The MCDA shall also assess and collect from its member local. 12 government units mentioned in Section 2 hereof the following fixed contributions.

a. Five (5%) percent of the total annual gross revenue of the
immediately preceding year including their IRA, in the case of municipalities;
and

b. Two and one-half (2 ¹/₂) percent of the total annual gross revenue of
 the immediately preceding year including their IRA, in the case of the cities.

The contributions shall accrue and become payable monthly to the MCDA by each city or municipality. In case of failure to remit the said contributions, the DBM shall cause the disbursement of the equivalent amount to the MCDA, chargeable against the IRA of the city or municipality concerned, the provisions of Section 286 of the Local Government Code to the contrary notwithstanding.

23 SECTION 11. *Repealing Clause.-* All other laws, decrees, executive 24 orders, rules and regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with or contrary to the 25 provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

26 SECTION 12. *Separability Clause.* - If any part of provision of this Act is 27 held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions thereof which are not 28 affected shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

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SECTION 13. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following
 the completion of its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general
 circulation.
