EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to simplify the procedures for the disposition of perishable agricultural goods imported into the country to prevent their deterioration while in storage and subsequent wastage.

Under the present provisions of the Tariff and Customs Code, perishable goods end up entering the domestic market under such state of deterioration that they endanger the safety of consumers. These products are also dumped at such low prices as to threaten the viability of local agricultural products.

In view of the foregoing, early passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

AN ACT AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1464, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE TARIFF AND CUSTOMS CODE OF 1978. AND

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OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE TARIFF AND CUSTOMS CODE OF 1978, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Republic of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 2607 of the Tariff and Customs Code is hereby modified as follows:

"Section 2607. Disposition of Articles Liable to Deterioration. – Perishable articles shall NOT be deposited in a[ny] bonded warehouse; and, if not immediately entered for export or for transportation from the vessel or aircraft in which it is imported or entered for consumption and the duties and taxes paid thereon, [such articles may be sold at auction, after such public notice, not exceeding three days, as the necessities of the case permit] THE COLLECTOR SHALL IMMEDIATELY DECLARE THE SEIZURE OF THE SAME. THEREAFTER, IF THE CONSIGNEE FAILS TO APPEAR BEFORE THE COLLECTOR WITHIN SEVEN (7) DAYS FROM THE DECLARATION OF SEIZURE OF SUCH ARTICLES, THE COLLECTOR SHALL MOTU PROPRIO DONATE THE ARTICLES TO ANY GOVERNMENT AGENCY OR CHARITABLE INSTITUTION,

SELL THEM ON THE BASIS OF QUICK CANVASS, OR HAVE THEM DESTROYED. AS MAY BE APPROPRIATE."

["When seizure shall be made of property which, in the opinion of the Collector, is liable to perish or be wasted or to depreciate greatly in value by keeping or which cannot be kept without great disproportionate expense, whether such property consists of live animals or of any article, the appraiser shall so certify in his appraisal, then the Collector may proceed to advertise and sell the same at auction, upon notice as he shall deem to be reasonable']

["The same disposition may be made of any warehoused articles when the opinion of the Collector it is likely that the cost of depreciation, damage, leakage or other causes, may so reduce its value as to be insufficient to pay the duties, taxes and other charges due thereon, if it should be permitted to be kept so and be subjected to sale in the usual course."]

Sec. 2. Section 2608 of the Tariff and Customs Code is likewise amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2608. Disposition of Articles Unfit for Use or Sale or Injurious to Public Health. – When any article, which in the opinion of the Collector, is a menace to public health, is seized or otherwise comes into the custody of the Bureau of Customs, the Collector of the port shall, if the matter is not disposable under the provisions relating to food and drugs, appoint a board of three members to examine the article. Whenever possible, THE BOARD SHALL BE COMPOSED OF [one member shall be] a representative [of] FROM the Department of Health or [of] A local health officer, A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, and [the tow others shall be responsible officials of] AN APPRAISER FROM the Bureau of Customs [at least one of whom shall be an appraiser.] Such board shall examine said article, and if the same is

1	found to be unfit or a menace to the public health, the board shall so
2	report in writing to the Collector, who shall forthwith order its destruction in
3	such manner, as the case may require.
4	"Health authorities at ports shall collaborate with the collectors in
5	such matters with reasonable dispatch."
6	Sec. 3. The Bureau of Customs, with prior consultation with and approval
7	of the Secretary of Finance, shall issue the rules and regulations for the effective
8	implementation of this Act.
9	Sec. 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at
10	least two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
