INTRODUCED BY SEN. JINGGOY EJERCITO ESTRADA

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The passage of R.A. No. 1161 on 18 June 1954 marks the establishment of the Social Security System (SSS) for our country's wage earners and lowsalaried employees. It took three (3) years from the time the law was enacted to formulate a complex system for a pension plan that will provide lifetime retirement income to employees. The creation of SSS is the response of the state to its duty to promote social justice by insuring the well-being and economic stability of the people in all phases of national development as stated in Section 10 of the Constitution. Henceforth, R.A. No. 1161 was enacted pursuant to the "policy of the Republic of the Philippines to develop, establish gradually and perfect a social security system which shall be suitable to the needs of the people throughout the Philippines and shall provide protection to employees against the hazards of disability, sickness, old age and death."

This bill seeks to address the fund deficiencies that the SSS will face in the future if these problems are not addressed. Specifically, this bill ensures that increases in the value or additions to the kinds of benefits should be supported by a corresponding increase in the rate of contribution. It will also free four percent (4%) of administrative and operating costs to more productive and profitable uses for the institution. Furthermore, to reduce the incidence of delinquent payments by employers and other offenses, the fine was increased by ten times.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

INTRODUCED BY SEN. JINGGOY EJERCITO ESTRADA

AN ACT

TO STRENGTHEN THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM THEREBY AMENDING FOR THIS PURPOSE, REPUBLIC ACT NO. 1161, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE SOCIAL SECURITY LAW

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Paragraph (2) of Section 4(b) of Republic Act No. 1161, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 4. Powers and Duties of the Commission and SSS. - (a) The Commission. – For the attainment of its main objectives as set forth in Section 2 hereof, the Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

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"(b) *The Social Security System.* - Subject to the provision of Section four (4), paragraph seven (7) hereof, the SSS shall have the following powers and duties:

"(1) To submit annually not later than April 30, a public report to the President of the Philippines and to the Congress of the Philippines THROUGH THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT ENTERPRISES AND PRIVATIZATION AND THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT CORPORATIONS AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES, covering its activities in the administration and enforcement of this Act during the preceding year including information ON THE ACTUARIAL/VALUATION REPORT AND OTHER DATA [information] and recommendations on broad policies for the development and perfection of the program of the SSS;

"(2) To require the actuary to submit a valuation report on the SSS benefit program every four (4) years, or more frequently as may be necessary, to undertake the necessary actuarial studies and calculations concerning increases in benefits taking into account inflation and the financial stability of the SSS, and to provide for feasible increases in benefits every four (4) years, including the addition of new ones, under such rules and regulations as the Commission may adopt, subject to the approval of the President of the Philippines: *Provided*, That the actuarial soundness of the

reserve fund shall be guaranteed *Provided, further,* That such increases in benefits [shall not require any increase in the rate of contribution] CAN BE SUPPORTED BY THE CURRENT RATE OF CONTRIBUTION, OTHERWISE ANY INCREASE IN BENEFITS OR ANY ADDITION THEREOF SHALL ONLY BE IMPLEMENTED IF THE CURRENT CONTRIBUTION AND INCOME LEVELS CAN SUSTAIN SUCH AN INCREASE;"

SEC. 2. Section 18 of Republic Act No. 1161, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 18. Employee's Contributions. - (a) Beginning as of the last day of the calendar month when an employee's compulsory coverage takes effect and every month thereafter during his employment, the employer shall deduct and withhold from such employee's monthly salary, wage, compensation or earnings, as the employee's contribution in an amount corresponding to his salary, wage, compensation or earnings during the month in accordance with the following schedule:

"The foregoing schedule of contribution shall also apply to self-employed and voluntary members. IT SHALL ALSO BE ADJUSTED EVERY FOUR (4) YEARS, OR WHENEVER NECESSARY, TO THE PREVAILING COST OF LIVING INDEX AS DETERMINED BY THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (NEDA); PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT THE SAME SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED ONLY UPON APPROVAL OF CONGRESS.

"The maximum monthly salary credit shall be Nine thousand pesos (P9,000.00) effective January Nineteen hundred and ninety six (1996); *Provided*, That it shall be increased by One thousand pesos (P1,000.00) every year thereafter until it shall have reached Twelve thousand pesos (P12,000.00) by Nineteen hundred and ninety nine (1999): *Provided, further*, That the minimum and maximum monthly salary credits as well as the rate of contributions may be fixed from time to time by the Commission through rules and regulations taking into consideration actuarial calculations and rate of benefits, subject to the approval of the President of the Philippines.

SEC. 3. Section 25 of Republic Act No. 1161, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 25. Deposits and Disbursements. - All money paid to or collected by the SSS every year under this Act, and all accruals thereto shall be deposited, administered and disbursed in the same manner and under the same conditions and requirements as provided by law for other public special funds: *Provided*, That not more than [twelve] EIGHT percent [(12%)] (8%) of the total yearly contributions plus three percent (3%) of other revenues shall be disbursed for operational expenses such; as salaries and wages, supplies and materials, depreciation and the maintenance of offices of the SSS: *Provided, further*, That if the expenses in any year are less than the maximum amount permissible, the difference shall not be availed of as additional expenses in the following years.

SEC. 4. Section 28 of Republic Act No. 1161, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 28. Penal Clause. - (a) Whoever, for the purpose of causing any payment to be made under this Act, or under an agreement thereunder, where none is authorized to be paid, shall make or cause to be made false statement or representation as to any compensation paid or received or whoever makes or causes to be made any false statement of a material Fact in any claim for any benefit payable under this Act, or application for loan with the SSS, or whoever makes or causes to be made any false statement, representation, affidavit or document in connection with such claim or loan, shall suffer the penalties provided for in Article One hundred seventy-two of the Revised Penal Code.

"(b) Whoever shall obtain or receive any money or check under this Act or any agreement thereunder, without being entitled thereto with intent to defraud any member, employer or the SSS, shall be fined not less than [five] FIFTY thousand pesos [(P5,000.00)] P50,000.00 nor more than [twenty] TWO HUNDRED thousand pesos [(P20,000.00)] P200,000.00 and imprisoned for not less than six (6) years and one (1) day nor more than twelve (12) years.

"(c) Whoever buys, sells, offers for sale, uses, transfers or takes or gives in exchange, or pledges or gives in pledge, except as authorized in this Act or in regulations made pursuant thereto, any stamp, coupon, ticket, book or other device, prescribed pursuant to Section Twenty-three hereof by the Commission for the collection or payment of contributions required herein, shall be fined not less than [five] FIFTY thousand pesos [(P5.000.00)] P50,000.00 nor HUNDRED than [twenty] TWO thousand more pesos [(P20,000.00)] P200,000.00, or imprisoned for not less than six (6) years and one (1) day nor more than twelve (12) years, or both, at the discretion of the court.

"(d) Whoever, with intent to defraud, alters, forges, makes or counterfeits any stamp, coupon, ticket, book or other device prescribed by the Commission for the collection or payment of any contribution required herein, or uses, sells, lends, or has in his possession any such altered, forged or counterfeited materials, or makes, uses, sells or has in his possession any such altered, forged, material in imitation of the material used in the manufacture of such stamp, coupon, ticket, book or other device, shall be fined not less than [five] FIFTY thousand pesos [(P5,000.00)] P50,000.00 nor more than [twenty] TWO HUNDRED thousand pesos [(P20,000.00)] P200,000.00 or imprisoned for not less than six years (6) and one (1) day nor more than twelve (12) years, or both, at the discretion of the court.

"(e) Whoever fails or refuses to comply with the provisions of this Act or with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission, shall be punished by a fine of not less than [five] FIFTY thousand pesos [(P5,000.00)] P50,000.00 nor more than [twenty] TWO HUNDRED thousand pesos [(P20,000.00)] P200,000.00, or imprisonment for not less than six (6) years and one (1) day nor more than twelve (12) years, or both, at the discretion of the court: *Provided*, That where the violation consists in failure or refusal to register employees or himself, in case of the covered self-employed or to deduct contributions from the employees' compensation and remit the same to the SSS, the penalty shall be a fine of not less Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) nor more than Twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00) and imprisonment for not less than six (6) years and one (1) day nor more than twelve (12) years.

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"(J) WHENEVER THERE IS A DELAY IN THE REMITTANCE OF CONTRIBUTION TO THE COMMISSION, THE SAME AMOUNT SHALL BE PAID TO THE LATTER AND SHALL INCLUDE THREE PERCENT (3%) INTEREST PAYMENT MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF MONTHS BY WHICH THE REMITTANCE WAS DELAYED."

SEC. 5. Separability Clause. -If any provision of this Act is declared invalid, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid.

SEC. 6. Repealing Clause. - All laws, proclamations, executive orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly: *Provided*, That no person shall be deemed to be vested with any property or other right by virtue of the enactment or operation of this Act.

SEC. 7. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the *Official Gazette* or in at least two (2) national newspapers of general circulation whichever comes earlier.
