EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to provide for disclosure of fire safety standards and measures with respect to campus buildings of higher learning by calling upon colleges and universities to report information on the level of fire safety on their campuses to the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and to the public.

This legislation will help parents to identify schools that set a strong emphasis on fire safety. When selecting a school, students and parents must also consider the school's track record when it comes to fire safety. The Campus Fire Safety Right-to-Know Act will provide them with the vital information they need to make an informed decision.*

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

Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Campus Fire Safety Right-to-5 Know Act." 6 SECTION 2. Disclosure of Fire Safety Standards and Measures of Campus Buildings. -7 Fire Safety Reports Required – Colleges and universities shall, beginning in the (A) academic year next following the effectivity of this Act, and each year thereafter, prepare, 8 9 publish, and distribute, through appropriate publications or mailings, to all current students and 10 employees, and to any applicant for enrollment or employment upon request, an annual fire 11 safety report containing at least the following information with respect to the campus fire safety 12 practices and standards of that institution: 13 A statement that identifies each student housing facility of the institution, 14 and whether or not that facility is equipped with a fire sprinkler system or 15 other fire safety systems, or both; Statistics concerning the occurrence on campus, during the two (2) (b)

- preceding calendar years for which data are available, of fires and false fire alarms in student housing facilities.
- (c) For each such occurrence, a statement of the human injuries or deaths and the structural damage caused by the occurrence.

- 1 (C) An estimate of the cost of bringing all nonconforming dormitories and other 2 campus buildings up to current new building and fire safety codes; and
- 3 (D) Recommendations from the CHED concerning the best means of meeting fire 4 safety standards in all college and university facilities, including recommendations for methods 5 to fund such cost.
- SECTION 4. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
- 9 SECTION 5. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive 10 order, letter of instruction, administrative rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the 11 provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
- SECTION 6. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
