#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991," Section 138 authorizes provinces to levy taxes on sand, gravel, and other quarrying activities. It has been observed that a province is often cheated by unscrupulous operators as the local government units cannot monitor the actual number of cubic meters extracted on non-working days. Also, the quarries are situated far from provincial offices. City and municipal officials have also complained that the shares of the city, municipality, or barangay concerned in the taxes levied are not often remitted by the province.

The bill shifts the power to levy taxes on sand, gravel, and other quarry resources from the province to the city or municipality concerned where the quarry is located. It also provides for efficient monitoring by authorizing barangay officials where the quarry is located to monitor the activities of quarry operators. This will result not only in efficient monitoring of quarry activities, but also in higher revenues for all local government units.<sup>\*</sup>

	Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
5	SECTION 1. Section 138 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local
6	Government Code of 1991," is hereby amended to read as follows:
7	"SECTION 138. Tax on Sand, Gravel and Other Quarry Resources The
8	CITY AND MUNICIPALITY [province] may levy and collect not more than
9	ten percent (10%) of fair market value in the locality per cubic meter of ordinary
10	stones, sand, gravel, earth, and other quarry resources, as defined under the
11	National Internal Revenue Code, as amended, extracted from public lands or from
12	the beds of seas, lakes, rivers, streams, creeks, and other public waters within its
13	territorial jurisdiction.
14	The permit to extract sand, gravel and other quarry resources shall be
15	issued exclusively by the CITY OR MUNICIPAL MAYOR AS THE CASE
16	MAY BE, PURSUANT TO THE ORDINANCE OF THE SANGGUNIAN
17	CONCERNED AND SHALL BE CLOSELY MONITORED BY THE
18	BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHERE THE ACTUAL QUARRYING IS
19	TAKING PLACE [provincial governor, pursuant to the ordinance of the
20	sangguniang panlalawigan].
21	The proceeds of the tax on sand, gravel and other quarry resources shall be
22	distributed as follows:

(1) Province - Thirty percent (30%);

- (2) Component City or Municipality where the sand, gravel, and other
   quarry resources are extracted Thirty percent (30%); and
- 3 (3) Barangay where the sand, gravel, and other quarry resources are
  4 extracted Forty percent (40%).

5 SECTION 2. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, presidential decrees or issuances, executive 6 orders, letters of instruction, administrative orders, rules, and regulations or parts thereof 7 inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, modified, or amended 8 accordingly.

9 SECTION 3. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
10 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
