EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act No. 6539, or the Anti-Carnapping Act of 1972, was enacted to curb theft of motor vehicles. Apparently, this law has considerably failed to address this problem as carnapping has become even more rampant over the past years.

This bill amends the present law as it eliminates the defense of good faith on the part of a person who may have purchased a stolen or carnapped motor vehicle. Thus, a carnapped motor vehicle, even if found in the possession of a purchaser in good faith, may still be rightfully recovered by the registered owner thereof.*

AN ACT REQUIRING THE IMMEDIATE RETURN OF CARNAPPED VEHICLES TO THE LAWFUL OWNERS THEREOF, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6539, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "ANTI-CARNAPPING ACT OF 1972"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. A new section, Section 6-A, is hereby inserted between Sections 6 and 7 of Republic Act No. 6539, otherwise known as the "Anti-Carnapping Act of 1972," which shall read as follows:

SEC. 6-A WHERE A MOTOR VEHICLE HAS BEEN FOUND TO BE INCLUDED IN THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE LIST CARNAPPED MOTOR VEHICLES AND SAID VEHICLE IS IN THE POSSESSION OF A PURCHASER, THE LATTER, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER HE IS A BUYER IN GOOD FAITH, UPON DEMAND BY THE REGISTERED OWNER OR HIS DULY AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE SHALL RETURN THE STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE TO SAID OWNER OR HIS REPRESENTATIVE WITHIN SEVENTY TWO (72) HOURS FROM DEMAND. ANY REFUSAL ON THE PART OF THE SAID PURCHASER SHALL BE PRIMA FACIE EVIDENCE OF HIS KNOWLEDGE OF THE ILLEGAL SOURCE OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE HE BOUGHT AND SHALL RENDER HIM CRIMINALLY LIABLE UNDER SECTION 13 OF THIS ACT; RESTRAINING ORDER OR WRIT THAT NO PROVIDED, PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION SHALL BE ISSUED BY ANY COURT TO PREVENT THE RECOVERY BY THE OWNER; PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT IN THE EVENT THAT THE STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE HAS BEEN
