AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10361, OR THE DOMESTIC WORKERS ACT, BY CLARIFYING THAT THE FINE IMPOSED THEREIN SHALL INURE TO THE SOLE BENEFIT OF THE AGGRIEVED DOMESTIC WORKER, WHICH MAY BE AWARDED IN THE SAME LABOR, CIVIL OR CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED BY THE DOMESTIC WORKER

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Philippine Congress, in enacting Republic Act No. 10361, otherwise known as the "Domestic Workers Act" or "Batas Kasambahay" sought to protect the interest and welfare of domestic workers. The penal provision of the "Domestic Workers Act" provides that a fine shall be imposed for any violation of the Domestic Workers Act declared to be unlawful and shall be punishable, as follows:

"SEC. 40. *Penalty.* – Any violation of the provisions of this Act declared unlawful shall be punishable with a fine of not less than Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) but not more than Forty thousand pesos (P40,000.00) without prejudice to the filing of appropriate civil or criminal action by the aggrieved party."

In order to protect the welfare and interest of domestic workers, the law should be clarified on the following points: (a) the fine imposed under the law shall inure to the sole benefit and interest of the domestic worker, without prejudice to civil or criminal liability of the employer under applicable law; (b) the fine imposed under the law shall be without prejudice to the filing of appropriate labor, civil, or criminal action by the aggrieved party; and (c) the fine may be awarded in the same labor, civil, or criminal proceedings.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly recommended.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Amendment. Section 40 of Republic Act No. 10361, otherwise known as the "Domestic Workers Act", is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 40. Penalty. - Any violation of the provisions of this Act declared unlawful shall be punishable with a fine of not less than Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) but not more than Forty thousand pesos (P40,000.00) without prejudice to the filing of appropriate LABOR, civil or criminal action by the aggrieved party.

THE FINE IMPOSED HEREIN SHALL BE FOR THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE BENEFIT OF THE AGGRIEVED DOMESTIC WORKER, WHICH MAY BE AWARDED IN THE SAME LABOR, CIVIL, OR CRIMINAL PROCEEDING INSTITUTED BY THE AGGRIEVED DOMESTIC WORKER."

SECTION 2. Separability Clause. If any provision or part of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be held unconstitutional or be invalid, such parts not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, executive orders, proclamations, rules and regulations and other issuance of parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 4. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
