AN ACT

MANDATING ALL STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES TO ANNUALLY CONFER AUTOMATIC ADMISSION AND PROVIDE SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS TO THE TOP TEN (10) PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS OF THEIR GRADUATING CLASS, AND ALLOCATE FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Iskolar Ng Bayan Act of 2014."

SECTION 2. *Declaration of Policy.* – The State is mandated to increase access to quality education to alleviate poverty and promote the intellectual wellbeing of the youth. It shall likewise give priority to measures that reduce social and economic inequalities. As such, it is the policy of the State to democratize access to education at the tertiary level and make higher education available to underprivileged but deserving students.

SECTION 3. *Iskolar ng Bayan Program.* - The Top Ten (10) public high school students of their graduating class, based on the cumulative results at the final grading period, shall be given automatic admission to State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) of his or her choice subject to the provisions of this Act.

The scholar shall be entitled to automatic admission in the SUCs of his or her choice within his or her province, subject to evaluation or admission criteria of each school with respect to the course that the scholar wants to take, given the following guidelines:

- a. Given the various sizes of the SUCs in the different provinces and the diverse course offerings in each SUC, CHED is tasked with the responsibility to ensure that the *Iskolars ng Bayan* are accommodated in an SUC within their provinces, or in an SUC in another province should there be limited slots or course offerings in their own province;
- b. CHED, in coordination with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and the Department of Education (DepEd), and in consultation with the business industry, Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), National Economic

- and Development Authority (NEDA), Department of Science and Technology (DOST) and other related agencies, are directed to identify priority disciplines, programs and courses, taking into account labor market realities. The SUCs shall have the option to offer scholarship for these preferred courses; *Provided*, That the *Iskolar ng Bayan* shall be given preference in the slots available;

 c. SUCs that are recognized as centers of excellence in their regions
 - SUCs that are recognized as centers of excellence in their regions shall accordingly allocate more slots for the *Iskolar ng Bayan* program; and
 - d. Within Metro Manila, the *Iskolar ng Bayan* can apply without cost to at most three (3) SUCs.
 - **SECTION 4.** Coverage. This act shall cover all SUCs except the University of the Philippines because of its institutional autonomy as the national university under Republic Act No. 9500 or the "University of the Philippines Charter of 2008"; Provided, that the University of the Philippines shall come up with its own scholarship programs for the Top Ten (10) students from public high schools.
 - **SECTION 5.** Requirements for Automatic Admission. The CHED shall issue guidelines to implement the *Iskolar ng Bayan* program, subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The students graduated in the Top Ten (10) of their batch from public high schools within two (2) years prior to the academic year for which the student is applying;
 - b. The students submitted a complete application as defined by the SUC within the given deadline; and
 - c. The applicants' high school principal/administrators shall submit a certificate bearing the school's name, location, number of students, rank of applicant/s in his/her graduating class and other relevant information.
- CHED may impose other reasonable requirements after consultation with the SUCs.
 - **SECTION 6.** Assistance to Iskolar ng Bayan. For the full and successful implementation of the Iskolar ng Bayan program, assistance may be given by the following stakeholders:
 - Government Agencies these government agencies shall implement the following mandates:

A. CHED

- 1. Conduct seminars for the SUCs regarding the *Iskolar ng Bayan* program;
- 2. Together with the SUCs, develop a system, including the appointment of advisers, which shall provide assistance and guidance to the scholars in the determination of the appropriate course and SUC which will best suit their aspirations and strengths;
- 3. Ensure compliance with the law by the SUCs which are under their supervision; and
- 4. In coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd) and the SUCs, issue guidelines for the proper

Form of Scholarship Grants. - Scholarship grants are 29 hereby provided in the form of: 30 a. Free tuition fee and other school fees to the Iskolar ng Bayan in all SUCs; 31 b. Reasonable textbook allowance per academic year as may be determined 32 by CHED based on annual inflationary rates; and 33 c. Reasonable monthly living allowance based on the cost of living as 34 determined by NEDA for Full Scholarship. 35 SECTION 8. Annual Reporting. Each SUC shall annually report to CHED 36 set Act on or before а date under this 37 Commission/Department. This report shall likewise be submitted to Congress. 38 The report shall include the number of students admitted under the Iskolar ng 39 Bayan Program, the courses they are enrolled in, and other relevant information 40 that will help improve the Program. 41 SECTION 9. - Implementing Rules and Regulations. - CHED and 42 DepEd shall issue the necessary implementing rules and regulations for the 43 speedy and effective implementation of this scholarship Act. 44 The implementation of this Act shall commence on the next school year' 45

- SECTION 10. Funding The amount needed to carry out the implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act (GAA).
- SECTION 11. Separability Clause. If any part or provision of this Act shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions thereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
 - **SECTION 12.** Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are not consistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
 - **SECTION 13.** *Effectivity Clause.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
