### AN ACT RECOGNIZING AND PROTECTING THE RIGHTS OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACCOMPANIED BY SERVICE ANIMALS

In 1992, the Philippine Legislature passed the Magna Carta for Disabled In 2013, the Philippines became a signatory to the United Nations Convention on Rights of Persons with Disabilities. These two actions show the country's commitment to achieve the full realization of rights of persons with disabilities.

Nevertheless, there are no existing laws recognizing and providing for the rights of persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals. Without such a law, persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals do not have full access to employment, transportation, and public accommodation and services by virtue of company or even government policies against animals inside establishments. This in turn prejudices persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals from fully enjoying their rights under the Magna Carta for Disabled Persons.

This bill aims to address the lack in legislation recognizing and protecting the rights of persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals. As such, the immediate passage of this bill is therefore requested.

# AN ACT RECOGNIZING AND PROTECTING THE RIGHTS OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACCOMPANIED BY SERVICE ANIMALS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Title This Act shall be knows and cited as the "Service As	nimals
2	Act of 2014"	

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**SECTION 2**. Declaration of Policy. – The grant of the rights and privileges for persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals shall be guided by the following principles:

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(a) Persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals are part of the Philippine society, and thus the State shall give full support to the improvement of their wellbeing and their integration into the mainstream of society. Toward this end, the State shall adopt policies ensuring the self-development and self-reliance of persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals.

Persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals shall have the same rights as other people to take their proper place in society. They should be able to live freely and as independently as possible.

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(c) The State shall exert all efforts to remove all social, cultural, economic, and environmental, and attitudinal barriers that are prejudicial to persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals.

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**SECTION 3**. Coverage. – This Act shall cover all persons with disabilities accompanied by service animals, and to the extent herein provided, departments, offices, and agencies of the government, non-government organizations, and private corporations necessary for the attainment of the objectives of this Act.

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**SECTION 4**. Definition of Terms. – For purposes of this Act, these terms are defined as follows:

- (a) Persons with disabilities are those suffering form restriction or different abilities, as a result of a mental, physical or sensory impairment, to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for a human being;
- (b) Impairment is any loss, diminution, or aberration of psychological, physiological, or anatomical structure or function;
- (c) Disability shall mean 1) physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more psychological, physiological or anatomical function of an individual or activities of such an individual; 2) a record of such an impairment; or 3) being regarded as having such an impairment;
- (d) Service animals refer to animals that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. The work or task a service animal has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability certified as such by the National Council on Disability Affairs;
- (e) Discrimination refers to 1) any act defined as discrimination under the Magna Carta for Disabled Persons performed against a person with disability accompanied by a service animal, by virtue of the presence of the service animal; or 2) any act isolating or treating less favorably any person with disability accompanied by a service animal, by virtue of the presence of the service animal

**SECTION 5**. Use of Service Animals. – All departments, offices, and agencies of the government, non-government organizations, and private corporations, businesses and establishments are required to allow service animals to accompany persons with disabilities in all areas of the facility where the public is normally allowed to go; provided that the service animals must be harnessed leashed, or tethered, unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices. In the latter case, the individual must maintain control of the service animal through voice, signal, or other effective tools.

**SECTION 6.** Prohibited Acts. - All departments, offices, and agencies of the government, non-government organizations, and private corporations, businesses and establishments, and any person, directly or indirectly, alone or with another, by himself or herself or by the interposition of another, are prohibited from the following:

10	and those found who are guilty thereof will suffer the same penalty.
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12	SECTION 12. Appropriations The amount necessary to carry out the provisions
13	of this Act shall be included in the General Appropriations Act of the year following its
14	enactment into law and thereafter.
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16	SECTION 13. Separability Clause Should any provisions of this Act be found
17	unconstitutional by a court of law, such provisions shall be severed from the remainder of
18	this Act, and such action shall not affect the enforceability of the remaining provisions of
19	this Act.
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21	SECTION 14. Repealing Clause All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders
22	and rules and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed
23	or modified accordingly.
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25	SECTION 15. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
26	publication in any two (2) newspaper of general circulation.
