## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Constitution, Article 15, Section 3, paragraph 2, provides:

Section 3. The State shall defend:

2. The right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition, and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation and other conditions prejudicial to their development;

Republic Act No. 7610, also known as the Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act, defines and penalizes child prostitution and other sexual abuse. However, according to Minette Rimando, a spokeswoman for the U.N.'S International Labour Organization's Manila office, an estimated 60,000 to 100,000 children in the Philippines were involved in prostitution rings in 2010. This shows that despite the law, there is still a large number of prostituted children in the country.

It should be noted that R.A. No. 7610 does not specifically provide for the indemnification of child victims, instead, it leaves the determination of the fine to the court. The fine is then imposed and administered as a cash fund by the Department of

Social Welfare and Development and disbursed for the rehabilitation of each child victim.

To serve as a deterrent to the proliferation of child prostitution in the Philippines, it is imperative for the State to impose stiffer penalties against those involved or engaged in child prostitution and child abuse. This bill therefore proposes to strengthen R.A. No. 7610 by providing a specific range for the fines to be imposed against the perpetrator of the crime, in addition to the penalty of incarceration.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 7 SECTION 3. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
- 8 its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
