AN ACT PENALIZING THE FAILURE TO REPORT ACTS OF HAZING, AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8049

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Republic Act No. 8049, also known as the "Hazing Regulation Act" does not require a person, who knows of an ongoing hazing activity, to notify the proper authorities. The failure to report the matter allows acts of violence to go unchecked, which could lead to injury or even death.

This bill seeks to amend the Hazing Regulation Act to penalize the failure to report hazing, in order to ensure the timely notification and intervention of the proper authorities and to deter further acts of hazing.<sup>1</sup>
