## RESOLUTION

# DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, TO INVESTIGATE THE INCREASING INCIDENCE OF HEPATITIS B IN THE PHILIPPINES

WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 15 provides: "The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them";

WHEREAS, *Manila Bulletin* on 28 January 2015 reported that the number of Filipinos with Hepatitis B is even larger than the crowd that came out during the visit of Pope Francis to the Philippines;

WHEREAS, according to Eric Ueda, secretary of the Yellow Warriors Society of the Philippines, there are about sixteen million cases of Hepatitis B in the Philippines, or 16 percent of the population are suffering from the disease;

WHEREAS, likewise stated in the report, one in eight adult Filipinos has Hepatitis B, while one in four will develop liver cirrhosis and cancer;

WHEREAS, Dr. Eternity Labio, president of the Hepatology Society of the Philippines, reportedly claimed that in the Philippines, the prevalence of Hepatitis B is double of what is considered high, or 16.7 percent of the population;

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization (WHO) revealed on its website that Hepatitis B is a major global health problem and a potentially life-threatening liver disease that causes liver cirrhosis and eventually lead to liver cancer;

WHEREAS, Labio explained that the liver functions as the refinery, filtration, repackaging and detoxification center of the body;

WHEREAS, Hepatitis B virus can cause an acute illness with symptoms that last several weeks, such as jaundice (yellow skin pigmentation) dark urine, extreme fatigue, nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain;

WHEREAS, Labio further explained that Hepatitis B is the common cause of liver cancer and ranks as the fourth common cancer in the Philippines and it the second leading cause of cancer death;

WHEREAS, in observance of the "Liver Cancer and Viral Hepatitis Awareness and Prevention Month," organizations advocating for the prevention of Hepatitis B urged the Department of Health (DOH) to heed the call of World Health Organization (WHO) to help control the increasing incidence of Hepatitis B in the country;

WHEREAS, the DOH has the capacity to plan and implement programs to prevent, if not to eradicate, the spread of the deadly Hepatitis B;

WHEREAS, it is the duty and responsibility of the DOH to increase public awareness on how to prevent the occurrence of Hepatitis B especially in health institutions like hospitals and other facilities;

WHEREAS, the DOH should promote Hepatitis B vaccine by making it affordable for everyone in the community to protect the people from acquiring the deadly liver infection;

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct the proper Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, to investigate the increasing incidence of Hepatitis B in the Philippines.
