1 2 3 4	RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORT THAT FOREIGN POACHERS ARE SPOTTED DAILY IN THE KALAYAAN ISLAND GROUP
5	WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 16, provides: "The State shall protect
6	and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the
7	rhythm and harmony of nature";
8	WHEREAS, the Philippine Star on 2 March 2015 reported that boats of foreign poachers
9	are spotted daily in Kalayaan Island Group;
0	WHEREAS, the officials reportedly said that more than 300 boats carrying foreign
1	poachers can be seen every day in the Kalayaan Island Group, but could not be arrested by
2	government forces due to lack of equipment;
3	WHEREAS, Kalayaan Mayor Eugenio Bito-onon reportedly said that poachers from
4	countries like China, Vietnam, and Malaysia outnumber local fishermen in their area, which is
5	part of the disputed Spratlys archipelago;
6	WHEREAS, Bito-onon claimed that there are 300 boats per day from China, Vietnam,
7	and Malaysia that did not secure a mayor's permit and they are not registered in the Philippines;
8	WHEREAS, one study said that the island is losing about #18 billion worth of marine
9	products per year;
:0	WHEREAS, Bito-onon explained that since the Philippines has a lot of internal waters,
1	many fishermen do not see the need to venture into the West Philippine Sea and the ones who
2	reportedly benefit from the marine resources are poachers;

1 WHEREAS, Bito-onon said some poachers even use dynamite, smuggle endangered 2 turtles, and harvest and destroy clams, and if the destruction of the environment continues, the 3 marine resources will run out;

WHEREAS, the Scarborough Shoal, known locally as Panatag Shoal, is located only 124
nautical miles from its nearest point in Zambales;

6 WHEREAS, Chinese ships started occupying the area in 2012 after the Philippine Navy 7 tried to arrest Chinese poachers who had harvested endangered marine species, as Bito-onon 8 explained, China and Vietnam have strong mobile phone signals here that would allow arrested 9 poachers to ask help from their respective countries;

WHEREAS, China has since barred local fishermen from entering what was once
 considered a traditional fishing route;

12 WHEREAS, Armed Forces Western Command Chief Vice Admiral Alexander Lopez 13 admitted that the lack of naval assets prevents them from enforcing the country's laws against 14 poaching;

WHEREAS, it is unfortunate that while we are monitoring these poachers and the degradation of our marine resources, we simply do not have the resources to monitor them on a 24-hour basis;

18 WHEREAS, since they are at sea, we need to have water assets;

WHEREAS, Kalayaan is a fifth-class municipality in Palawan located in Pag-Asa, the
biggest Philippine island in the Spratlys archipelago, which is also being claimed in whole or in
part by China, Vietnam, Brunei, Malaysia and Taiwan;

WHEREAS, the government should provide the Army Navy with enough naval assets to
assist and help them in enforcing the our existing laws against poaching;

1 WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct 2 the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the report that 3 poachers are spotted daily in the Kalayaan Island Group.
