1 2 3 4	RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORT THAT METRO MANILA IS NOT READY FOR A HIGH-MAGNITUDE EARTHQUAKE	
5	WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 15 provides: "The State shall protect and	
6	promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them";	
7	WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the "Philippine Disaster Risk	
8	Reduction and Management Act of 2010," Section 2, states:	
9	It shall be the policy of the State to:	
10 11 12 13 14	(a) Uphold the people's constitutional rights to life and property by addressing the root causes of vulnerabilities to disasters, strengthening the country's institutional capacity for disaster risk reduction and management and building the resilience of local communities to disasters including climate change impacts;	
15 16 17 18	(b) Adhere to and adopt the universal norms, principles and standards of humanitarian assistance and the global effort on risk reduction as concrete expression of the country's commitment to overcome human sufferings due to recurring disasters;	
19 20 21 22	(c) Incorporate internationally accepted principles of disaster risk management in the creation and implementation of national, regional and local sustainable development and poverty reduction strategies, policies, plans and budgets;	
23 24 25 26 27	(d) Adopt a disaster risk reduction and management approach that is holistic, comprehensive, integrated, and proactive in lessening the socioeconomic and environmental impacts of disasters including climate change, and promote the involvement and participation of all sectors and all stakeholders concerned, at all levels, especially the local community;	
28	WHEREAS, following the massive earthquake that killed thousands in Nepal, various	
29	broadsheets in April reported that Metro Manila is not ready for an earthquake of similar	
30	magnitude;	

- WHEREAS, quoted in the news, Filipino architect and urban planner Jun Palafox said
  that in case a 7.2-magnitude quake hits the National Capital Region, an estimated 20 percent of
  the structures would probably collapse;
  WHEREAS, Palafox cited a 2004 study of the Japan International Cooperation Agency
  which estimated that 50,000 people would be killed should a megaquake hit Metro Manila;
  WHEREAS, the expert claimed that preparations should include:
- 7 (1) the identification of 10-hectare evacuation areas for Metro Manila residents and
  8 workers;
- 9 (2) the determination and retrofitting of structures that may collapse; and
- 10 (3) the transfer of structures above faultlines;
- 11 WHEREAS, Palafox reportedly added that the bridges and structures that have the 12 tendency to collapse should already be marked and identified;
- WHEREAS, the urban planner was further quoted as saying that addressing earthquake
  hazards is 90 percent cheaper than rehabilitation;
- 15 WHEREAS, Congress must consider drafting legislation that will spur government
- 16 agencies to urgently implement measures aimed at mitigating the impact of a high-magnitude
- 17 earthquake

- 18 WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct
- 19 the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the report that Metro
- 20 Manila is not ready for a high-magnitude earthquake.
