8	WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9147, otherwise known as the "Wildlife Resources	
9	Conservation and Protection Act," states:	
10 11 12	It shall be the policy of the State to conserve the country's wildlife resources and their habitats for sustainability. In the pursuit of this policy, this Act shall have the following objectives:	
13 14	(a)	to conserve and protect wildlife species and their habitats to promote ecological balance and enhance biological diversity;
15 16 17 18	(b) (c)	to regulate the collection and trade of wildlife; to pursue, with due regard to the national interest, the Philippine commitment to international conventions, protection of wildlife and their habitats; and
19 20	(d)	to initiate or support scientific studies on the conservation of biological diversity;
21	WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 6147, Section 1 provides: "It is hereby declared that the	
22	pithecophaga jefferyi commonly known as the monkey-eating Eagle shall be a protected bird in	
23	the Philippines";	
24	WHE	REAS, the Manila Bulletin on 23 April 2015 reported that the illegal cutting of
25	trees, slash and burn (kaingin), charcoal making, and other activities destructive to forests	
26	continue to prevail in Samar Island;	
27	WHE	REAS, the news quoted an appeal from the Department of Environment and
28	Natural Reso	urces (DENR) in Eastern Visayas for the public to help the government stop such

WHEREAS, the presence of the Philippine eagle in Samar forests, which the DENR said
is an indication of the area's rich biodiversity, is threatened by continuous deforestation;

WHEREAS, local governments should be empowered to implement, in partnership with concerned agencies, integrated conservation programs for the protection of wildlife, including the Philippine eagle;

6 WHEREAS, Congress must intensify existing environmental laws to ensure the 7 compliance of all local governments and concerned agencies;

8 WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct 9 the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the report that 10 Philippine eagle habitats in Samar Island are in peril.
