1 2 3 4 5 6	RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT \$\mathbb{P}670\$ MILLION IN PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE FUND AND DEVELOPMENT ACCELERATION PROGRAM ALLOCATIONS FOR FILIPINO MUSLIMS WENT TO DUBIOUS NON-GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATIONS
7	WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 27 provides: "The State shall maintain
8	honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measures against graft
9	and corruption";
10	WHEREAS, the Constitution also states, in Article 2, Section 28: "Subject to reasonable
11	conditions prescribed by law, the State adopts and implements a policy of full public disclosure
12	of all its transactions involving public interest";
13	WHEREAS, the <i>Philippine Star</i> on 29 April 2015 reported that ₽670.3 million in
14	lawmakers' Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) and Disbursement Acceleration
15	Program (DAP) allocations for Filipino Muslims went to questionable non-government
16	organizations (NGOs) in 2013;
17	WHEREAS, quoting the state auditors, the report said that of the ₽670.3 million the
18	National Commission on Muslim Filipinos (NCMF) received in 2013, it released ₱155.596
19	million to various groups unlawfully identified by the legislators;
20	WHEREAS, the Commission on Audit questioned such practice, noting that it violated
21	rules on the selection of NGO beneficiaries, which, should have been undertaken by the NCMF,
22	not the legislators;
23	WHEREAS, apart from the unlawful selection process for beneficiaries, the COA also
24	claimed that of the 21 NGOs that received PDAF or DAP funds, 12 were without offices at given
25	addresses, 10 with unlocated addresses, seven with located addresses but unknown in the area,
26	and one with located address but already moved out;
27	WHEREAS, 18 of the NGOs were also allegedly without financial and accounting
28	records, while another 18 purportedly has no separate savings account;
29	WHEREAS, state auditors also claimed that the documents supporting the transfer of

₽670.3 million to NGOs, and the liquidation of sum ₽451.8 million of that amount, were

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insufficient;

WHEREAS, some ₱324.7 million worth of projects also allegedly lacked various documents and proof of proper utilization;

WHEREAS, upon ascertaining the veracity of reports from the COA, Congress must determine the accountability of its members who allocated their PDAF funds to NCMF and identified NGO beneficiaries;

WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the on the Commission on Audit report that \$\frac{1}{2}\$670 million in Priority Development Assistance Fund and Development Acceleration Program allocations for Filipino Muslims went to dubious non-government organizations.
