RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT THE BOARD OF CLAIMS UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FAILED TO RETURN MORE THAN ₱136 MILLION FROM THE ACCUMULATED VICTIMS COMPENSATION FUND TO THE NATIONAL TREASURY IN 2014

WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 27 provides: "The State shall maintain honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measures against graft and corruption";

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 338, which directs the deposit of cash balances to the National Treasury provides: "All existing balances of trust receipts deposited with authorized government depository banks or any forthcoming trust receipt which are intended to be deposited with authorized government depository banks are hereby required to be deposited also with the National Treasury";

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7309 also known as "An Act Creating a Board of Claims under the Department of Justice for Victims of Unjunst Imprisonment or Detention and Victims of Violent Crimes and for other purposes," Section 9 provides: "To ensure the continuity of the funding requirements under this Act, the amount of five pesos shall be set aside from each filing fee in every civil case filed with the court, the total proceeds of which shall constitute the Victim Compensation Fund (VCF) to be administered by the Department of Justice";

WHEREAS, based on the 2014 COA report, the VCF maintained at the Land Bank of the Philippines has an accumulated balance of ₱136,777,486.94;

WHEREAS, since 2008, state auditors have already included in their audit observation such undue accumulation of the VCF and even recommended for the immediate remittance of the balance to the National Treasury;

WHEREAS, until 2014, the VCF was incessantly utilized for the payment of expenses for BOC, such as office supplies, honorarium, office equipment, contrary to its legislated purpose and should have been charged to the General Fund;

WHEREAS, it is imperative for Board of Claims to comply with the law in order to ensure that funds will be available for the grant of claims for victims of unjust imprisonment or detention and victims of violent crimes under the General Appropriations Act;



1 WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct

2 the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the Commission on

3 Audit report that the Board of Claims under the Department of Justice failed to return more than

P136 million worth of accumulated Victims Compensation Fund to the National Treasury.
