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RESOLUTION
DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT SOME P 460 MILLION IN FUND TRANSFERS MADE BY THE PHILIPPINE COUNCIL FOR HEALTH RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT REMAINED OUTSTANDING AND/OR UNLIQUIDATED AS OF THE END OF 2014
WHEREAS, the Constitution provides, in Article 2, Sections 27 and 28:
Section 27. The State shall maintain honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measures against graft and corruption.
Section 28. Subject to reasonable conditions prescribed by law, the State adopts and implements a policy of full public disclosure of all its transactions involving public interest.
WHEREAS, state auditors claimed in a recently released report that the Philippine
Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD) has not been able to monitor the fund
transfers and the submission of liquidation reports by implementing agencies in 2014;
WHEREAS, the Commission on Audit (COA) said that this resulted in the accumulation
of some P460.526 million in outstanding fund transfers, of which P117.674 million have
remained unliquidated for one to over five years under the account of the Agency;
WHEREAS, the subject funds included:
- P 351.737 million allocated to national government agencies (NGAs) for research projects
which remained outstanding, of which #96.357 million have not been liquidated for one
to over five years, and 36 percent or #129.817 million of which pertains to unliquidated
balances of projects already completed as early as CY 2007;
- P108.789 million allocated to non-government institutions and private entities for
research projects which remained outstanding, of which #21.317 million have not been
liquidated for one to over five years, and 30 percent or #32.943 million of which pertains

WHEREAS, all government agencies must be responsible for funds allocated to them,
 and must diligently require utilization or liquidation reports from implementing agencies for all
 funds they disburse;

WHEREAS, Congress, through relevant legislation, must ensure that the PCHRD will adhere to COA guidelines, especially amid the more than 500 percent increase of the granted budget of the agency under the National Expenditure Program in the past five years;

WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct
the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the Commission on
Audit report that some P460 million in fund transfers made by the Philippine Council for Health
Research and Development remained outstanding and/or unliquidated as of the end of 2014.
