RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE

TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION,
ON THE REPORT THAT SOME 10,000 FILIPINOS ARE AFFLICTED WITH DISEASES
THAT ARE DIFFICULT TO DIAGNOSE AND COSTLY TO TREAT

WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 15 provides: "The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them";

WHEREAS, the *Manila Bulletin* on 3 September reported that some 10,000 Filipinos are afflicted with rare diseases, that are difficult to diagnose and require expensive treatment;

WHEREAS, Dr. Mary Ann Abacan of the Institute of Human Genetics, University of the Philippines, Manila, National Institute of Health, reportedly used measures for rare disease incidence made by the World Health Organization to estimate that the Philippines, with a population of 100 million, would have 6,000 to 10,000 Filipinos suffering from rare diseases;

WHEREAS, Abacan claimed that 75 percent of the afflicted are likely children, and 30 percent of infant deaths are probably due to rare diseases;

WHEREAS, Congress, through relevant legislation, should improve health services, with the goal of making early detection of rare diseases possible and treatment for such conditions more accessible;

WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the report that some 10,000 Filipinos are afflicted with diseases that are difficult to diagnose and costly to treat.
