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## SENATE P. S. R. No. **1602**

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## RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE SENSE OF THE SENATE TO NOMINATE WANG-OD OGGAY AND LIGAYA FERNANDO AMILBANGSA FOR THE MANLILIKHA NG BAYAN AWARD, THEREBY RECOGNIZING THEM AS NATIONAL LIVING TREASURES FOR THEIR IMMENSE CONTRIBUTIONS IN PRESERVING TRADITIONAL FILIPINO ART

1 WHEREAS, the Constitution provides, in Article 14, Sections 14 and 15:

Section 14. The State shall foster the preservation, enrichment, and
dynamic evolution of a Filipino national culture based on the principle of unity in
diversity in a climate of free artistic and intellectual expression.

5 Section 15. Arts and letters shall enjoy the patronage of the State. The 6 State shall conserve, promote, and popularize the nation's historical and cultural 7 heritage and resources, as well as artistic creations.

## 8 WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7355, also known as the "Manlilikha ng Bayan Act," 9 states:

10 Section 3. *Definition of Terms.* – For the purpose of this Act, "Manlilikha 11 ng Bayan" shall mean a citizen or a group of citizens engaged in any traditional 12 art uniquely Filipino, whose distinctive skills have reached such a high level of 13 technical and artistic excellence and have been passed on to and widely practiced 14 by the present generation in his/her community with the same degree of technical 15 and artistic competence.

- 16 "Traditional Folk Art" refers to expressions of distinctiveness and artistic
  17 quality created to serve a decorative and/or utilitarian or sociocultural functions of
  18 traditional folk artists commonly known for such works.
- WHEREAS, Wang-Od Oggay is said to be the last known *mambabatuk* or native tattooartist in Kalinga;

WHEREAS, for many years, Filipinos from all over the country, as well as foreign tourists, have been flocking to Wang-Od's village of Buscalan to be marked with the *batuk*, ancient marks once worn by women of the Cordilleras as symbols of beauty, and by male headhunters as marks of a strong warrior; 3<sup>9</sup>

- WHEREAS, Wang-Od strives to keep the native tattoo tradition alive despite her old age
   of 97;
- WHEREAS, her work has not only preserved an important cultural heritage among
  Filipinos, but has also created for her community a source of livelihood by attracting tourists;
- 5 WHEREAS, a social media campaign has recently been launched to have Wang-Od 6 nominated as National Artist;
- WHEREAS, Ligaya Fernando Amilbangsa has meanwhile gained wide acclaim for
  working to preserve *Pangalay*, a traditional Filipino dance believed to have spread from India to
  the southern Philippines even before Islam and Christianity arrived;
- WHEREAS, *Pangalay* allegedly means "temple dancing" in Sanskrit, but for Filipinos in
  the Mindanao, Sulu, and Palawan areas who have adapted the dance, the local meaning of "gift
  offering" applies;
- WHEREAS, after witnessing the *Pangalay* performed in 1969, Amilbangsa has
  thoroughly studied the dance by interviewing elderly villagers to codify the gestures, and even
  by watching her own shadow on a wall;
- WHEREAS, Amilbangsa, 71, has traveled all over the country and across Asia both to
  study and teach the dance, and has published a book on *Pangalay* in 1983;
- 18 WHEREAS, in August, Amilbangsa was given the Ramon Magsaysay Award, also 19 known as the Asian Nobel Prize, for "her single-minded crusade in preserving the endangered 20 artistic heritage of the southern Philippines";
- 21 WHEREAS, both Wang-Od and Amilbangsa fulfill the minimum requirements to be 22 honored as National Living Treasures, which, according to the *Manlilikha ng Bayan* Act, are:
- 23Technical and creative skill The candidate must possess a mastery of the24tools and materials needed by the art, and must have an established reputation in25the art as master and maker of works of extraordinary technical quality;
- Artistic quality The work of the candidate must be outstanding aesthetically, and he/she must have consistently produced over a significant period, works of superior quality;
- Community tradition The candidate must have transferred and/or willing
   to transfer to other members of the community, skills in the folk art for which the
   community has become nationally known.
- Folk art tradition The candidate must have engaged in a folk art tradition
   that has been in existence and documented for at least fifty (50) years; and

Character and integrity – As a precious treasure of the country, the candidate must command the respect and admiration of the country for his character and integrity.

WHEREAS, the Senate, as a government institution, may nominate individuals or groups
for the *Manlilikha ng Bayan* Award, subject to a selection process administered by the National
Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA);

7 WHEREAS, the *Manlilikha ng Bayan* Act imposes no limit on the number of nominees
8 or awardees for any given year;

9 WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to 10 express the sense of the Senate to nominate Wang-Od Oggay and Ligaya Fernando Amilbangsa 11 for the *Manlilikha ng Bayan* Award, thereby recognizing them as National Living Treasures for 12 their immense contributions in preserving traditional Filipino art;

13 RESOLVED FURTHER, that the NCCA be furnished a copy of this resolution.
