


RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE

TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION,
ON THE RECENT COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT
THE PHILIPPINE COUNCIL FOR INDUSTRY, ENERGY, AND EMERGING
TECHNOLOGY RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT FAILED TO LIQUIDATE A
SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF DISBURSED FUNDS TO THE DETRIMENT OF THE STATE

	SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF DISBURSED FUNDS TO THE DETRIMENT OF THE STATE
1	WHEREAS, the Constitution provides, in Article 2, Sections 27 and 28:
2	Section 27. The State shall maintain honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measures against graft and corruption.
4 5 6	Section 28. Subject to reasonable conditions prescribed by law, the State adopts and implements a policy of full public disclosure of all its transactions involving public interest;
7	WHEREAS, state auditors claimed that the Philippine Council for Industry, Energy, and
8	Emerging Technology Research and Development (PCIEERD) stated that P1.75 billion in funds
9	the agency disbursed to national government agencies and P78.9 billion of fund transfers to non-
10	government and people's organizations remained unliquidated as of the end of 2014;
11	WHEREAS, the Commission on Audit (COA) said in its recently released report that the
12	unliquidated funds resulted from the non-submission of liquidation reports and insufficient
13	monitoring of projects implemented;
14	WHEREAS, state auditors also criticized the agency's practice of granting additional
15	funds to implementing agencies or partner organizations even when previously disbursed funds
16	have yet to be accounted for;
17	WHEREAS, such unconscionable amounts of unliquidated funds are indicative of gross
18	inefficiency at best, and graft and corruption at worst;
19	WHEREAS, the government has a duty to ensure that state funds are used in a timely,

- WHEREAS, Congress, through relevant legislation, must provide for effective measures to ensure the proper utilization of government funds;
- WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the report that the Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technology Research and Development

6 failed to liquidate a significant amount of funds to the detriment of the state.
