RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE
TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION,
ON THE RECENT COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT THE MEDICAL
ASSISTANCE FUNDS FOR INDIGENT PATIENTS REMAINED UNUTILIZED
IN 14 HOSPITALS UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IN 2014

WHEREAS, the Constitution provides, in Article 2, Sections 27 and 28:

Section 27. The State shall maintain honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measures against graft and corruption.

Section 28. Subject to reasonable conditions prescribed by law, the State adopts and implements a policy of full public disclosure of all its transactions involving public interest.

WHEREAS, The Commission on Audit (COA) reported that funds under the Medical Assistance Program (MAP) of the Department of Health (DOH) were not fully utilized in 14 hospitals in the National Capital, Central Luzon, and Davao Regions;

WHEREAS, state auditors said that the Medical Assistance Program was established to grant medical assistance to indigent or poor patients, but only a total of P139.565 million or 32.41 percent of P430.643 million distributed to hospitals was actually utilized;

WHEREAS, state auditors also noted the lapses in the grant and use of \$\mathbb{P}32.117\$ million in financial assistance out of MAP cast doubts on the propriety and veracity of such transactions;

WHEREAS, the Congress, through relevant legislation, should mandate strict adherence to the guidelines in the use of MAP allocations for efficient utilization of funds;

WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the recent Commission on Audit Report that medical assistance funds for indigent patients remained unutilized in 14 hospitals under the Department of Health in 2014.

RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE

TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION,
ON THE COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT P170 MILLION
IN LEYTE HOSPITAL SUPPLY CONTRACTS IN 2014 WERE ANOMALOUS

WHEREAS, the Constitution provides, in Article 2, Sections 27 and 28:

Section 27. The State shall maintain honesty and integrity in the public service and take positive and effective measurement against graft and corruption.

Section 28. Subject to reasonable conditions prescribed by law, the State adopts and implements a policy of full public disclosure of all its transactions involving public interest.

WHEREAS, Rappler.com on 20 October 2015 reported that the Commission on Audit (COA) found \$\mathbb{P}\$170 million in discrepancies in the Leyte provincial government's acquisition of medical and laboratory supplies in 2014;

WHEREAS, in its recently released report, the COA said the provincial government's inventory of medical, dental, and laboratory supplies in 2014 totalled only P16.55 million, way below its submitted yearend balance of P189.92 million;

WHEREAS, according to auditors, the P173.37 million disparity consisted of drugs and medicines worth P85.36 million, and medical, dental and laboratory supplies worth P88.09 million, all of which were unaccounted for;

WHEREAS, Congress must ensure that funds earmarked for the healthcare services are used judiciously and transparently;

WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the Commission on Audit Report that \$\mathbb{P}\$170 million in Leyte hospital supply contracts in 2014 were anomalous.

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE RECENT COMMISSION ON AUDIT REPORT THAT WESTERN VISAYAS REGION HAS SEVEN CONGESTED AND SIX EMPTY IAILS

	REGION HAS SEVEN CONGESTED AND SIX EMPTY JAILS
1 2	WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 11 provides: "The State values the dignity of every human person and guarantees full respect for human rights";
3	WHEREAS, the Philippine Star on 4 October 2015 reported that Western Visayas has
4	seven detention facilities that are overpopulated by 393 percent each, and six others that are
5	unused;
6	WHEREAS, the Star was quoting a recent Commission on Audit (COA) report, which
7	discovered the unique situation in Western Visayas jails;
8	WHEREAS, the COA said that the overpopulated detention facilities are found in
9	Dumangas, Iloilo City, Guimbal, and Pototan, all in Iloilo; Binalbagan and Isabela, both in
10	Negros Occidenal, and Jordan in Guimaras;
11	WHEREAS, state auditors claimed that the facilities, owned by the local government, can
12	accommodate up to 189 inmates each, yet these hold up to 579 individuals;
13	WHEREAS, the COA report said there were also six unused jail facilities in the towns of
14	Leon, Maasin, and New Lucena, all in Iloilo; Libertad in Antique, and Jordan and Nueva
15	Valencia, in Guimaras;
16	WHEREAS, state auditors also claimed the government spent P3.294 million to construct
17	these unused facilities;
18	WHEREAS, the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) officials reportedly
19	said they lack manpower to manage the jails;

WHEREAS, the State should develop effective and efficient measures to deal with the

chronic problem of congestion in jails;

- 1 WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct
- 2 the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the recent
- 3 Commission on Audit report that Western Visayas region has seven congested and six empty

4 jails.
