

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORT THAT PLASTIC WASTE REMAINS A PROBLEM IN MAKATI CITY DESPITE A LOCAL BAN

WHEREAS, the Constitution provides, in Article 2, Sections 15 and 16:
Section 15. The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them.
Section 16. The State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature.
WHEREAS, the Manila Bulletin on 29 November 2015 reported that plastic waste
remains a huge problem of Makati City despite the implementation of an ordinance banning the
use of plastics in packaging;
WHEREAS, the Bulletin quoted the latest Makati Waste Analysis and Characterization
Study, which showed that plastic waste consisted 19.92 percent of the total garbage collected in
the city, following kitchen waste at 29.23 percent and paper at 22.87 percent;
WHEREAS, acting Makati Mayor Romulo Peña claimed that sustained stakeholder
support for the city-wide plastic ban and its advocacy for recycling will produce positive
outcomes, including reduction of flooding in the city;
WHEREAS, Congress must address the persistent use of plastics by some cities despite
local policies, and consider a law totally banning the plastics for packaging;
WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PHILIPPINE SENATE to direct
the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the report that plastic
is still among top waste in Makati City despite ban.
