AN ACT ESTABLISHING A GRANT PROGRAM FOR PRE-DISASTER HAZARD MITIGATION ENHANCEMENT

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill authorizes the Secretary of the Department of National Defense to give grants on a competitive basis to local government units (LGUs) to assist pre-disaster hazard mitigation strategies, and the use of technical and financial assistance to support programs that provide grants to low income homeowners for wind and flood inspections of their principal residences and for implementation of hazard mitigation improvements.

The enhancement program would provide LGUs with funds for projects that have a direct, on-the-ground impact for residents of low to moderate income homes, as well as the less addressed population of apartment residents and small business owners.¹

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AN ACT ESTABLISHING A GRANT PROGRAM FOR PRE-DISASTER HAZARD MITIGATION ENHANCEMENT

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Pre-Disaster Hazard 2 Mitigation Enhancement Program Act." 3 SECTION 2. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act, the term: (A) "Eligible entity" means any of the local government units, as defined under 4 5 the Local Government Code, that -6 (1) has a mitigation plan approved by the Secretary; 7 (2) implements public awareness campaigns to encourage 8 improvements to structures to mitigate hazards relating to natural 9 disasters; and 10 (3) takes steps to encourage mitigation actions with respect to 11 repetitive loss structures within the jurisdiction of such entity; and (B) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Department of National Defense. 12 SECTION 3. Predisaster Hazard Mitigation Enhancement. -13 (A) Purpose. - To provide grants to eligible entities to assist hazard mitigation 14 15 strategies that save lives, improve the structural integrity of property affected

1		by natural disasters, and provide hazard mitigation cost savings to the
2		Philippine Government.
3	(B)	Grants Authorized The Secretary may award grants, on a competitive
4		basis, to eligible entities.
5	(C)	Application To be eligible for a grant, an eligible entity shall submit an
6		application to the Secretary in accordance with regulations issued by him not
7		later than six months after the date of effectivity of this Act.
8	(D)	Minimum Standards An eligible entity that receives a grant shall carry out
9		any repair, construction, renovation, or retrofit assisted by such grant in
10		accordance with the following:
11		(1) Applicable standards of safety and sanitation.
12		(2) Applicable codes, specifications, and standards of the National
13		Building Code.
14		(3) Safe land use and construction practice standards.
15	(E)	Allocation of Amounts Of the amounts appropriated for making grants in a
16		fiscal year, the Secretary shall require eligible entities to allocate:
17		(1) 50 percent of grant amounts to programs that address the mitigation
18		needs of single family housing units;
19		(2) 30 percent of grant amounts to programs that address the mitigation
20		needs of multi-family housing units and residential rental dwelling
21		units; and
22		(3) 20 percent of grant amounts to programs that address the mitigation
23		needs of small businesses.
24	SEC	CTION 4. Appropriations. – The funds needed for the initial implementation of
25		hall be charged against the appropriations of the Department of National

- 1 Defense. After that, such amount as may be necessary for its full implementation shall be
- 2 included in the annual General Appropriations Act as a distinct and separate item.
- 3 SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act is held invalid or
- 4 unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other
- 5 provisions hereof.

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- 6 SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances, or
- 7 portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby
- 8 repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
- 9 SECTION 7. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
- its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
