PROHIBITING A MANUFACTURER FROM DISTRIBUTING PERSONAL AUDIO PLAYERS UNLESS THERE IS A WARNING LABEL ON THE PRODUCT WHICH PROVIDES THAT IT MAY CAUSE HEARING DAMAGE

EXPLANATORY NOTE

According to scientific studies, noise from personal music players threatens permanent hearing loss for many people who use them. People who use these personal music players do not realize the damage until years after it is done.

Scientific studies indicate that those who listened for only five hours a week at high-volume settings exposed themselves to more noise than permitted in the noisiest factory or workplace. Maximum volume on some devices can generate as much noise as an airplane taking off nearby.

This bill is in response to the harmful volume levels at which users of portable audio players (e.g., MP3 players or iPods) are able to listen. This bill prohibits a manufacturer from distributing a personal audio player unless the manufacturer affixes a warning label on the personal audio player that reads as follows: "WARNING: This product may cause hearing damage. A volume level of 115 decibels may cause permanent hearing damage after 15 minutes of exposure."

AN ACT PROHIBITING A MANUFACTURER FROM DISTRIBUTING PERSONAL AUDIO PLAYERS UNLESS THERE IS A WARNING LABEL ON THE PRODUCT WHICH PROVIDES THAT IT MAY CAUSE HEARING DAMAGE

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act may be known as the "Music Player Noise
- 2 Warning Act".
- 3 SECTION 2. Definitions. For purposes of this Act, the term:
- A. "Manufacturer" means a person who manufactures or imports a personal audio
 player for distribution; and
- B. "Personal Audio Player" means a personal, electronic device that allows the user to listen to audio while mobile.
- 8 SECTION 3. Prohibition. No manufacturer shall distribute a personal audio
- 9 player unless the manufacturer affixes a warning label on the personal audio player that
- 10 reads as follows: "WARNING: This product may cause hearing damage. A volume
- 11 level of 115 decibels may cause permanent hearing damage after 15 minutes of
- 12 exposure."
- 13 SECTION 4. Penalties. Any manufacturer who violates this Act, shall be liable
- to a fine of not less than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P50,000.00).

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part thereof, is held invalid

2 or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall

3 remain valid and subsisting.

4 SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. - Any law, presidential decree or issuance,

5 executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to,

or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended

7 accordingly.

8 SECTION 7. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days

following its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general

10 circulation.
