Amen.



SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF SENATOR VILLANUEVA

As he presented for the consideration of the Body Proposed Senate Resolution No. 82, Senator Villanueva delivered the following speech:

My heart is filled with joy and excitement just with the thought that we are surrounded by amazing individuals – our **teachers** who cultivate the treasure within every child; our **soldiers** who are prepared to risk their lives to keep our country safe; and our **police officers** who weed out criminal elements and maintain peace and order in our communities.

Allow me to talk about our teachers since I believe that some of our colleagues will also share their thoughts about our dear soldiers and police officers.

Gusto ko pong sabihin na proud son po ako ng dalawang public school teachers, si Bro. Eddie Villanueva at si Sis. Dory Villanueva. Wala po ang isang Joel Villanueva kung wala sila, kung wala ang mga mahuhusay at mapagkalingang mga guro na humubog sa aking pagkatao at pumanday sa aking isipan mula elementary, high school, at kolehiyo.

That is why I felt honored and privileged for having been chosen by the Metrobank Foundation, Inc. as the chairperson of the Final Board of Judges for this year's Search for Outstanding Teachers.

Thank you also to our then presumptive Senate President Koko Pimentel for allowing this Representation to attend and chair the Final Board of Judges.

Listening to these teachers gave me the conviction that indeed, teaching is the noblest profession. With the big reforms in the Philippine educational system today, these teachers strive harder to do more than the minimum requirements: **to transform lives, to build communities, and to bring the Philippines to the world.**

These teachers transform lives through their creativity; they can explore their ideas freely and find time for continuing personal and professional development activities. At the end of the school year, it is them who made students enjoy in class – who get remembered most and whose lessons would surely stick for a longer period of time.

They build communities by embracing the dual role of a teacher: as classroom manager and community leader. They have the extra energy to do more than regular school assignments. They are easily spotted because everyone comes to them for help. Oftentimes, they are on top of the list of the district office or the local government unit to do extra assignments. They serve as powerful role models and intellectual leaders to the communities they serve.

Above all, they bring the Philippines to the world by welcoming the idea of globalization while preserving our own cultural and educational heritage as a nation. They epitomize the teachers of the 21st century – passionate and committed to the profession, giving their best to teaching in spite of the many challenges they face.

It is for this reason that I filed Proposed Senate Resolution No. 82, honoring and commending the Outstanding Teachers of 2016 awarded by the Metrobank Foundation, Inc.

For the last 32 years since 1984, the Metrobank Foundation, Inc. has honored 346 outstanding teachers of the Philippines, and 140 of them have been recognized by the Senate from 2002 to 2015.

Today, in our midst are the Ten Outstanding Teachers of 2016 consisting of four teachers in the elementary, four in secondary, and two in the higher education levels.

May I acknowledge Mrs. Winona Y. Diola from Muntinlupa City; Ms. Rujealyn R. Cancino, from Lingayen, Pangasinan; Mr. Arnol M. Rosales from Naujan, Oriental Mindoro; Mrs. Josephine Chonie M. Obsenares from Butuan City; Dr. Roy B. Basa from Bacolod City; Mr. Nelson G. Agoyaoy from Caloocan City; Mrs. Ma. Regale A. Olarte from Muntinlupa City; Dr. Katherine Faith M. Bustos from Nueva Vizcaya; Dr. Ernelea P. Cao from Quezon City; and Dr. Mark Anthony J. Torres from Iligan City.

These teachers stood out because they exemplify how teachers must go beyond their duties in the classroom – to teach what is proper, what is morally right, what is healthy, and what will make life better. Thank you so much.

I challenge you to pursue excellence and to continue making a difference in the life of our students.

COSPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF SENATOR BINAY

So today, we honor this year's Ten Outstanding Teachers and we also honor every Filipino who has chosen teaching as a vocation.



MANIFESTATION OF SENATOR ZUBIRI

At the outset, Senator Zubiri congratulated the honorees of the Metrobank Foundation's outstand-



ing teachers, police and soldiers of the country. He then called out the names of the awardees for the Outstanding Soldiers and Outstanding Policemen in Service, to wit:

Senator Zubiri said that he stood up to recognize the awardees, having been once co-chair of the foundation's Board of Judges. He likewise thanked the men and women of the Metrobank Foundation under the leadership of Mr. Chito Sobrepeña for giving excellence awards to the teachers, soldiers and police officers who toil day in and day out, sacrificing their safety and lives in doing good for the nation. He expressed hope that the Body would not only recognize the feat of the awardees but could also give financial incentives to them.

COSPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF SENATOR GORDON


Preliminarily, Senator Gordon commended the awardees of the Metrobank Foundation's outstanding teachers, law enforcement personnel and soldiers.

Senator Gordon said that looking at the teachers, people are reminded of the Latin phrase *loco parentis* — people performing the role of parents — especially in the day and age when citizens work very hard to eke out an existence. He said that teachers are tasked to educate, hone the values of the students, and make sure that they become leaders of the country either by being moderators of their extra-curricular activities or by making them experts in their chosen field in college.

He stated that politicians owe a lot to teachers but that while they would speak very well about them, they have always been short in their delivery. He believed that it is about time, since the budget is about to be discussed, to give more attention and to discuss the plight of the educators in the country.

Senator Gordon averred that in the Philippines, a teacher's pay starts at P19,000 a month, a far cry from the minimum pay rates of China at P50,000, Malaysia at P90,000, and Singapore at P133,000 per month. He said that there have been various calls to adjust teachers' wages but Congress would only give slight increases, with teacher's pay to reach only P24,000 a month by 2021 as mentioned by Senator Drilon, and they would have to wait a long time before getting any financial remuneration for their sacrifices. He said that he was certain that many senators have been educated by public school teachers, like Senator Villanueva, Senator Defensor Santiago, and Senator Claro M. Recto whose mother was also a teacher. He stressed that the country's leaders should not only be vocal but should also walk the talk.

Senator Gordon said that he was happy that the teachers, policemen and soldiers are being honored for their sacrifices, recalling the recent story of a mother who called up her son and was surprised to learn that he was beheaded and that she too would be beheaded if she would come to get her son. He said that as a Red Cross volunteer, he had seen the scars of war, like the battle in Tipo-tipo, Basilan where 11 marines were beheaded, prompting one of the soldiers to leave the service out of sheer disgust for the measly attention given to them by the government.



As for the policemen, Senator Gordon stated that they work practically 24/7, especially during times of great stress. He said that more often than not, police officers are branded as corrupt even when many of them reject entitlements, bribes or special privileges.

He reiterated the need for the citizenry and government to give attention to the sacrifices of the teachers, soldiers and police officers who volunteered and were not forced to enter government service despite the miniscule pay. He said that teachers give choices to the young, while police officers and soldiers bring peace to the country.

Senator Gordon thanked Metrobank's Mr. George Ty and his family, and Mr. Chito Sobrepeña for honoring the teachers, police officers and soldiers. He said that he also had the privilege of being the chairman of the board for outstanding teachers in 2008, a proud moment to be able to select the best teachers, one of whom was a mathematician from Samar. He commended the Ty family and the Metrobank Foundation for exercising great corporate social responsibility.

Senator Gordon said that more than the monetary award, the work of volunteers are priceless and the award is just a little bonus, while the medal that the awardees will receive is something that they can show to their grandchildren.

In closing, Senator Gordon expressed great pride and appreciation to the sacrifices and efforts made by the awardees and to the Metrobank Foundation for its corporate social responsibility. He ended by stating, "*No todos del milan en la noche en nuestros abuelos,*" — They were those who kept vigil in the night of our forefathers. He said that the awardees are the people who have been keeping vigil all throughout in spite of the difficulties they face.

MANIFESTATION OF SENATOR LEGARDA

Senator Legarda informed the Body that she had filed Proposed Senate Resolution No. 108 recognizing the awardees of the Metrobank Foundation. She then proposed that all Members be made coauthors of the resolutions commending the teachers, police officers and soldiers.



Following is the privilege speech of Senator Pacquiao:

Mga kasama kong senador at sa ating mga kababayan, isa pong mapagpala at ligtas na hapon sa ating lahat.

Bawat pikit ng aking mata, nakikita ko ang kalunus-lunos na sinapit ng mga biktima ng pagsabog sa night market sa Davao, one of the most popular and beloved cities in Mindanao.

As Christians and Muslims, more so as Filipinos, we must condemn in the strongest terms possible this senseless terroristic attack which took the lives of 15 innocent civilians and inflicted harm to more than 60 others.

Malinaw ang mithiin ng mga taong nasa likod nito. Gusto nilang manaig ang takot sa bawat mamamayan, habang pinili nila ang Lungsod ng Davao bilang entablado ng kanilang kapusukan sa mithiing ipahiya ang ating Pangulo sa mata ng mundo at mga pinuno ng iba't ibang bansa na ngayon ay kasama niya sa ASEAN Summit sa Laos.

Huwag po sana nating hayaan na manaig sila sa kanilang misyon, lalo't nadarama ko ang takot na umiiral ngayon sa puso ng ating mga kababayan, which is the main reason why these soulless perpetrators came through with this senseless and inhuman attack.

The Abu Sayyaf has been named as the group behind this savagery but we cannot discount the possibility that narco-terrorists might be pulling the strings.

To all the terrorists and those who want to sow terror in our country, we will not allow your wickedness to decide for our future. The government and our authorities — the armed forces and the police — will not let their guards down.



For now, I hope and pray God will touch your hearts so you can feel the agony of the families left behind by your victims.

And while the smoke has not yet cleared, let us all continue to believe that Mindanao is predominantly safe despite this recent deplorable act of terrorism.

To the grieving families of the victims, my deepest sympathy and condolences.

COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 1 ON SENATE BILL NO. 1112

(Continuation)

Upon motion of Senator Sotto, there being no objection, the Body resumed consideration, on Second Reading, of Senate Bill No. 1112 (Committee Report No. 1), entitled

AN ACT POSTPONING THE OCTOBER 2016 BARANGAY AND SANGGUNIANG KABATAAN ELECTIONS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9164, AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9340 AND REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10656, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Senator Sotto stated that in the previous session, the Body terminated the period of individual amendments, and he announced that clean copies of the bill as amended, have already been distributed to all senators for their perusal.

Senator Sotto, however, manifested that Senator Recto wanted to introduce same minor corrections.

RECONSIDERATION OF THE TERMINATION OF THE PERIOD OF INDIVIDUAL AMENDMENTS

Acting on the request of Senator Recto, upon motion of Senator Sotto, there being no objection, the Body reconsidered the termination of the period of individual amendments and reopened the same.

1. On page 2, line 6, insert the word DULY between the words "been" and "elected"; and
2. Still on the same page, line 17, insert the phrase A PERIOD OF before the word and figure "ten (10)".

TERMINATION OF THE PERIOD OF INDIVIDUAL AMENDMENTS

There being no other individual amendment, upon motion of Senator Sotto, there being no objection, the Body closed the period of individual amendments.

APPROVAL OF SENATE BILL NO. 1112 ON SECOND READING

Submitted to a vote, there being no objection, Senate Bill No. 1112 was approved on Second Reading.

SUSPENSION OF CONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 1112

Upon motion of Senator Sotto, there being no objection, the Body suspended consideration of the bill.


COMMITTEE VICE CHAIRMANSHIP

Senator Sotto manifested for the record the designation of Senator Honasan as vice chairman of the Committee on Energy.

MANIFESTATION OF SENATOR SOTTO

Senator Sotto said that he was in receipt of the request from the Office of Senator Gatchalian to refer to the Committee on Economic Affairs, Proposed Senate Resolution No. 123 (Economic Effects of the *Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program* - 4Ps) which was previously referred to the Committee on Social Justice, Welfare and Rural Development and to the Committee on Finance, the same committee referral of Senate Bill Nos. 687, 310, 65, 33 and 12 covering the 4Ps.

Considering that Proposed Senate Resolution No. 123 aims to look into the economic effects of the 4Ps, he said that it would be proper to likewise refer the same to the Committee on Economic Affairs as a secondary committee.



ADDITIONAL REFERRALS

Upon motion of Senator Sotto, there being no objection, the Chair referred the following Senate resolutions to the committees hereunder indicated:

1. Proposed Senate Resolution No. 123 to the Committee on Economic Affairs as secondary committee; and
2. Proposed Senate Resolution No. 126 to the Committee on Justice and Human Rights as secondary committee.

CHANGE OF REFERRALS

Upon motion of Senator Sotto, there being no objection, the Body approved the change of primary referral of the following Senate bills:

1. Senate Bill No. 133 (One Family, One Graduate Act) from the Committee on Social Justice, Welfare and Rural Development to the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture as the primary committee; and


2. Senate Bill No. 309 (Magna Carta of Workers in Informal Economy) from the Committee on Social Justice, Welfare and Rural Development to the Committee on Labor, Employment and Human Resources as the primary committee
