AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE BALIK SCIENTIST PROGRAM, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as
- 2 the "Balik Scientist Act".
- 3 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. The State recognizes
- 4 that the utilization of the expertise of expatriate Filipino
- 5 scientists and technologists is a vital component of the
- 6 nation's political, economic and social development efforts.
- 7 Hence, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to
- 8 encourage Filipino scientists and technology experts from

- abroad to return to the Philippines and share their
 expertise to accelerate the development of the country.
- Towards this end, any foreign-based scientist, 3 4 professional, technician, or any person with special skills 5 or expertise, who is of Filipino descent, shall be allowed to 6 share his or her profession or expertise in the Philippines 7 in accordance with the implementing rules and regulations 8 which shall be promulgated by the Department of Science 9 and Technology (DOST) in consultation with relevant 10 government agencies of the and nongovernment 11 organizations.
 - SEC. 3. General Objectives. This Act aims to strengthen the scientific and technological human resources of the academe, public institutions and domestic corporations in order to promote knowledge sharing and accelerate the flow of new technologies into the country.

Towards this end, DOST shall award short, medium, and long term engagements to Balik Scientists, and ensure their participation in the mentorship activities, training, lecture, and other similar activities in any institution,

1	subject to the agreement between the Balik Scientist, the
2	host institution, as approved by the DOST.
3	SEC. 4. Definition of Terms As used in this Act, the
4	following terms shall mean:
5	(a) Balik Scientist - a science and technology expert
6	or professional, as certified by the DOST, who is currently
7	or who was formerly a Filipino citizen or a foreigner of
8	Filipino descent, residing abroad, and contracted by the
9	government to return and serve in the Philippines along
10	his or her field of expertise under short, medium or long
11	term engagement;
12	(b) Balik Scientist Program – the Program institutionalized
13	under this Act;
14.	(c) Short-Term Engagement - the term of engagement
15	under the Program with a minimum duration of fifteen
16	(15) days to maximum duration of six (6) months per

award;

- 1 months but not to exceed one (1) year per award to be
- 2 served within two (2) to three (3) years from the date of the

- 4 (e) Long-Term Engagement the term of engagement
- 5 under the Program with duration of more than one (1) year
- 6 to three (3) years, subject to renewal to be determined by
- 7 DOST and to be served within five (5) years from the date
- 8 of the award.
- 9 SEC. 5. General Benefits, Incentives and Privileges. -
- 10 All Balik Scientists under short, medium, or long term
- 11 engagement, shall be eligible for the following general
- 12 benefits, incentives, and privileges:
- 13 (a) Exemption from the licensing or permitting
- 14 requirements of the Professional Regulation Commission
- 15 (PRC): Provided, That the DOST shall submit to the PRC
- 16 the list of Balik Scientists with the corresponding duration
- 17 of awarded engagement;
- 18 (b) Accident and medical insurance covering the
- 19 duration of the engagement awarded by the DOST;

1	(c) Reimbursement of expenses for excess baggage
2	allowance related to scientific project or activities;
3	(d) Exemption from renouncing their oath of
4	allegiance to the country where they took the oath, unless
5	the Balik Scientist after the service decides to repatriate
6	and retain the government position, as applicable;
7	(e) Tax and duty exemption in the donation of
8	equipment, instruments, and materials to DOST: Provided,
9	That DOST shall bear the freight and storage expenses
10	related to the importation and transportation of the
11	donated equipment, instruments, and materials; and
12	(f) Tax and duty exemption in the importation of
13	professional equipment, instruments, and materials of the
14	Balik Scientists.
15	SEC. 6. Term-Specific Benefits, Incentives, and
16	Privileges Balik Scientists shall be eligible to benefits
17	incentives, and privileges under the following terms of the
18	engagement:

(a) Short Term Program:

1	(1) One (1) free round-trip business class airfare
2	originating from a foreign country to the Philippines,
3	exempt from Philippine Travel Tax;

- 4 (2) When applicable, DOST-subsidized and -facilitated
 5 application for a visa whose validity shall cover the
 6 duration of the awarded engagement;
- 7 (3) Tax exempt daily allowance in accordance with
 8 the prevailing rates prescribed by the United Nations
 9 Development Programme (UNDP) as determined by the
 10 DOST; and
 - (4) Participation in Grants-in-Aid (GIA) research and development projects of the DOST subject to guidelines to be provided in the implementing rules and regulations. A lump sum research subsidy of Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) shall be granted to the Balik Scientist in accordance with relevant government regulations and the need of the program involved.
 - (b) Medium Term Program:

- 4 (2) When applicable, DOST-subsidized and -facilitated application for a visa whose validity shall cover the 5 duration of the awarded engagement; 6
- (3) Tax exempt daily allowance in accordance with 7 prevailing rates prescribed by the UNDP 8 determined by the DOST; 9
- (4) Participation in GIA research and development projects of the DOST subject to guidelines to be provided in the implementing rules and regulations. An initial lump sum research subsidy of at least Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00), and at most Two million pesos (P2,000,000.00) shall be granted to the Balik Scientist in 16 accordance with relevant government regulations and the need of the Program involved; and 17
 - (5) Monthly housing or accommodation allowance.
- (c) Long Term Program: 19

- 1 (1) One (1) free round-trip business class airfare
 2 originating from a foreign country to the Philippines,
 3 exempt from the Philippine Travel Tax, for the awardees,
 4 their spouses, and minor dependents;
- 5 (2) Special Relocation Benefits:

- (a) Special non-immigrant visa, for awardees, their spouses, and minor children: *Provided*, That the validity of the visa shall cover the duration of the awarded long-term engagement;
- (b) Exemption from the requirement to secure an alien employment permit from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) for Balik Scientists and their spouses;
 - (c) Exemption from submission of immigration clearance certificate and payment of multiple entry fees;
- 16 (d) Tax and duty exemption in the importation of
 17 personal and household effects, professional equipment,
 18 instruments, and materials of the Balik Scientist:
- (e) Tax and duty exemption in the importation of one(1) motor vehicle whose gross vehicle weight (GVW) does

not exceed 3.5 tons, and subject to the motor vehicle

2	classification standard set forth by the Bureau of Customs:
3	Provided, That the Balik Scientist, assisted by the DOST,
4	shall ensure compliance with other applicable rules and
5	regulations in the importation of motor vehicles: Provided,
6	further, That an endorsement from the DOST shall suffice
7	as substitute to the required personal appearance:
8	Provided, finally, That the Balik Scientist shall be exempt
9	from posting bond and exportation of the motor vehicle to
10	the country of origin upon the expiration of the award;
11	(f) Admission assistance to the preferred schools for
12	the minor children of Balik Scientists;
13	(g) Assistance in securing job opportunities for the
14	spouse of the Balik Scientist;
15	(h) Relocation allowance to be determined by DOST;
16	and
17	(i) Monthly housing or accommodation allowance;
18	(3) Participation in Grants-in-Aid for research and
19	development projects approved by the Secretary of DOST.
20	A lump sum research subsidy of Two million posses

- 1 (P2,000,000.00) shall be granted to the Balik Scientist in
- 2 accordance with relevant government rules and
- 3 regulations and the need of the program involved; and
- 4 (4) Funding for the establishment and development of
- 5 a facility or laboratory: Provided, That the facility or
- 6 laboratory shall be deemed government property.
- 7 SEC. 7. Role in the Research and Development (R&D)
- 8 Leadership Program of DOST. Awardees are entitled to
- 9 assume some mentorship, leadership, professional or
- 10 technical positions in the R&D Leadership Program under
- 11 the Science for Change Program (S4CP) of DOST.
- 12 SEC. 8. Administration. This Program shall be
- 13 administered by the DOST which shall issue the
- 14 implementing rules and regulations in consultation with
- 15 appropriate agencies ninety (90) days after the approval of
- 16 this Act.
- 17 SEC. 9. Funding. The funds necessary to carry out
- the provisions of this Act shall be included in the annual
- 19 budget of the DOST in accordance with the Annual
- 20 General Appropriations Act.

1	SEC. 10. Implementing Rules and Regulations
2	Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act,
3	DOST, in consultation with concerned agencies and other
4	relevant stakeholders, shall promulgate the necessary
5	rules and regulations for the effective implementation of
6	this Act.
7	SEC. 11. Separability Clause Should any provision
8	herein be declared unconstitutional, the same shall not
9	affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act.
10	SEC. 12. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders,
11	rules, and regulations or other issuances or parts
12	inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby
13	repealed or modified accordingly.
14	SEC. 13. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen
15	(15) days after publication in the Official Gazette or in any
16	two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the
17	Philippings
