AN ACT CONVERTING THE DAVAO ORIENTAL STATE COLLEGE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY IN THE CITY OF MATI AND ALL ITSSATELLITE CAMPUSES LOCATED IN THE PROVINCE OF DAVAO ORIENTAL INTO A STATE UNIVERSITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE DAVAO ORIENTAL STATE UNIVERSITY AND APPROPRIATING **FUNDS** THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 Section 1. Conversion. The Davao Oriental State
- 2 College of Science and Technology in the City of Mati,
- 3 including all of its existing satellite campuses, namely:
- 4 Banaybanay Campus in the Municipality of Banaybanay,
- 5 Cateel Campus in the Municipality of Cateel, and San Isidro
- 6 Campus in the Municipality of San Isidro, all located in the
- 7 Province of Davao Oriental, is hereby converted into a state
- 8 university to be known as the Davao Oriental State

- 1 University. The main campus of the Davao Oriental State
- 2 University, hereinafter referred to as the University, shall be
- 3 in Mati City.
- 4 SEC. 2. General Mandate. The University shall
- 5 primarily provide advanced education, higher technological,
- 6 professional instruction and training in the fields of education.
- 7 agricultural technology, agri-business management, business
- 8 administration, industrial technology, arts and sciences, health
- 9 sciences, information technology, engineering and other
- 10 relevant fields of study. It shall also undertake research and
- 11 extension services, and provide progressive leadership in its
- 12 areas of specialization.
- 13 Sec. 3. Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy.
- 14 The University shall enjoy academic freedom and
- 15 institutional autonomy pursuant to paragraph 2, Section 5 of
- 16 Article XIV of the Constitution of the Republic of the
- 17 Philippines.
- 18 Sec. 4. Curricular Offerings. The University shall
- 19 offer undergraduate, graduate and post-graduate programs
- 20 and short-term courses in the fields of agriculture and

- environment studies, pure and applied sciences, behavioral 1 and social sciences, law, culture and arts, tourism and 2 3 business-related programs, nautical and maritime programs, 4 industrial technology and engineering, education and teacher training, communication 5 and information health-related programs, 6 technology. developmental 7 management and leadership programs, agricultural 8 technology, agri-business management, administration, health sciences and other degree courses 9 10 within its areas of specialization and according to its 11 capabilities as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to
- The University may operate a reasonably-sized laboratory school under its College of Education.

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SEC. 5. Administration. – The University shall have the general powers of a corporation set forth in Batas Pambansa
Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise known as the Corporation
Code of the Philippines. The administration of the University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be

1	vested exclusively in the Board of Regents and the President
2	of the University.
3	SEC. 6. Governing Board The governing body of the
4	University shall be the Board of Regents, hereinafter
5	referred to as the Board, which shall be composed of the
6	following:
7	(a) The chairperson of the Commission on Higher

- 9 (b) The President of the University, as vice
- 10 chairperson;

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- 11 (c) The chairperson of the Committee on Education,
- 12 Arts and Culture of the Senate;

Education (CHED), as chairperson;

- 13 (d) The chairperson of the Committee on Higher and
- 14 Technical Education of the House of Representatives;
- 15 (e) The regional director of the National Economic and
- 16 Development Authority (NEDA) in Region XI;
- 17 (f) The regional director of the Department of Science
- 18 and Technology (DOST) in Region XI;
- 19 (g) The regional director of the Department of
- 20 Agriculture (DA) in Region XI;

- 1 (h) The president of the federation of faculty
- 2 associations of the University;
- 3 (i) The president of the federation of student councils
- 4 of the University;
- 5 (j) The president of the federation of alumni
- 6 associations of the University; and
- 7 (k) Two (2) prominent citizens from the private sector
- 8 who have distinguished themselves in their profession or in
- 9 the fields of specialization, as members.
- The Board shall appoint the two (2) prominent citizens
- 11 from among a list of at least five (5) qualified persons in the
- 12 Province of Davao Oriental where the University and its
- 13 campuses are located, as recommended by the search
- 14 committee constituted by the President of the University, in
- 15 consultation with the Chairperson of the CHED and the
- 16 other members of the Board, based on the normal standards
- 17 and qualifications for the position.
- The term of office of the president of the federation of
- 19 faculty associations, the president of the federation of
- 20 student councils and the president of the federation of

- 1 alumni associations shall be coterminous with their
- 2 respective terms of office, as set forth in their respective
- 3 constitutions and by-laws.
- 4 The two (2) prominent citizens shall serve for a term of
- 5 two (2) years from the date of appointment.
- 6 SEC. 7. Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents. -
- 7 The Board shall have the following specific powers and
- 8 duties, in addition to its general powers of administration
- 9 and the exercise of all the powers granted to the board of
- 10 directors of a corporation under existing laws:
- 11 (a) To promulgate and implement policies in
- 12 accordance with the declared State policies and the
- 13 provisions of the Philippine Constitution on education,
- 14 agriculture, science and technology, as well as the policies,
- 15 standards and thrusts of the CHED under Republic Act No.
- 16 7722, otherwise known as the Higher Education Act of 1994;
- 17 (b) To promulgate rules and regulations not contrary
- 18 to law as may be necessary to carry out the purposes and
- 19 functions of the University;

- 1 (c) To receive and appropriate all sums as may be 2 provided for the support of the University in the manner it 3 may determine, in its discretion, in order to carry out the

- 5 (d) To import economic, technical and cultural books
- 7 (e) To receive in trust legacies, gifts and donations of
 8 real and personal properties of all kinds and to administer
 9 and dispose of the same when necessary for the benefit of the
 10 University, and subject to the limitations, directions and
 11 instructions of the donor, if any:
- (f) To fix the tuition fees and other necessary school 12 13 charges including matriculation fees, graduation fees and 14 laboratory fees, as the Board may deem proper to impose, after due consultation with the involved sectors. Such fees 15 and charges, including government subsidies and other 16 17 income generated by the University, shall constitute special trust funds and shall be deposited in any authorized 18 government depository bank, and all interest that shall 19

- 1 accrue therefrom shall form part of the same funds for the
- 2 use of the University.
- 3 Any provision of existing laws, rules and regulations to
- 4 the contrary notwithstanding, any income generated by the
- 5 University from tuition fees and other charges, as well as
- 6 from the operation of auxiliary services and land grants,
- 7 shall be retained by the University, and may be disbursed by
- 8 the Board for instruction, research, extension or other
- 9 program or projects of the University: Provided, That all
- 10 fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific purposes for
- 11 which these are collected
- 12 If, for reasons beyond its control, the University shall
- 13 not be able to pursue any project for which the funds have
- 14 been appropriated and allocated under its approved
- 15 program of expenditures, the Board may authorize the use of
- 16 said funds for any reasonable purpose which, in its
- 17 discretion, may be necessary and urgent for the attainment
- 18 of the objectives and goals of the University;

- 1 (g) To adopt and implement a socialized scheme of 2 tuition and school fees for greater access to poor but 3 deserving students:
- 4 (h) To authorize the construction or repair of its 5 buildings, machinery, equipment and other facilities, and the 6 purchase and acquisition of real property, including 7 necessary supplies, materials and equipment:
- 8 (i) To appoint, upon recommendation of the President
 9 of the University, vice presidents, deans, directors, heads of
 10 campuses, faculty members and other officials and
 11 employees of the University;
- 12 (j) To fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative officials and employees, subject to the 13 14 provisions of the Revised Compensation and Position 15 Classification System and other pertinent budget and compensation laws governing hours of service, and such 16 other duties and conditions as it may deem proper; to grant 17 them, at its discretion, leaves of absence under such 18 19 regulations as it may promulgate, any provision of existing law to the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for 20

- 1 cause in accordance with the requirements of due process of
- 2 law:
- 3 (k) To approve the curricula, instructional programs
- 4 and rules of discipline drawn by the Administrative Council
- 5 and Academic Council herein provided;
- 6 (l) To set policies on admission and graduation of
- 7 students;
- 8 (m) To award honorary degrees upon persons in
- 9 recognition of their outstanding contribution in the fields of
- 10 education, public service, arts, science and technology,
- 11 agriculture or in any field of specialization within the
- 12 academic competence of the University; and to authorize the
- 13 awarding of certificates of completion of non-degree and non-
- 14 traditional courses:
- 15 (n) To establish and absorb non-chartered tertiary
- 16 institutions within the Province of Davao Oriental as
- 17 branches and centers in coordination with the CHED, and in
- 18 consultation with the Department of Budget and
- 19 Management (DBM), and to offer therein programs or

- 1 courses, to promote and carry out equal access to educational
- 2 opportunities as mandated by the Constitution;
- 3 (o) To establish research and extension centers of the
- 4 University where such will promote the development of the
- 5 University;
- 6 (p) To establish professorial chairs in the University
- 7 and to provide fellowships for qualified faculty members and
- 8 scholarships to deserving students;
- 9 (q) To delegate any of its powers and duties provided
- 10 for herein to the President or other officials of the University
- 11 as it may deem appropriate, so as to expedite the
- 12 administration of the affairs of the University;
- 13 (r) To authorize an external management audit of the
- 14 University, to be financed by the CHED, subject to the rules
- 15 and regulations of the Commission on Audit: and to institute
- 16 reforms, including academic and structural changes, on the
- 17 basis of the audit results and recommendations:
- 18 (s) To collaborate with other governing boards of the
- 19 state colleges and universities within the Province of Davao
- 20 Oriental or Region XI, under the supervision of the CHED

- 1 and in consultation with the DBM, and work towards the
- 2 restructuring of the University to become more efficient,
- 3 relevant, productive and competitive;
- 4 (t) To enter into joint ventures with business and
- 5 industry for the profitable development and management of
- 6 the economic assets of the University, the proceeds from
- 7 which shall be used for the development and strengthening
- 8 of the University;
- 9 (u) To develop consortia and other economic forms of
- 10 linkages with local government units (LGUs), institutions
- and agencies, both public and private, local and foreign, in
- 12 the furtherance of the purposes and objectives of the
- 13 University:
- 14 (v) To develop academic arrangements for
- 15 institutional capability building with appropriate
- 16 institutions and agencies, public and private, local and
- 17 foreign, and to appoint experts or specialists as consultants,
- 18 part-time or visiting or exchange professors, scholars or
- 19 researchers, as the case may be;

- 1 (w) To set up the adoption of modern and innovative
- 2 modes of transmitting knowledge such as the use of
- 3 information technology, the dual learning system, open or
- 4 distance education and community laboratory for the
- 5 promotion of greater access to education:
- 6 (x) To establish policy guidelines and procedures for
- 7 participative decision-making and transparency within the
- 8 University:
- 9 (y) To privatize, where most advantageous to the
- 10 University, the management of non-academic services such
- as health, food, building or grounds or property maintenance
- 12 and such other similar activities: and
- 13 (z) To extend the term of the President of the
- 14 University beyond the age of retirement but not beyond the
- 15 age of seventy (70): Provided, That his/her performance has
- 16 been unanimously rated as outstanding and upon the
- 17 unanimous recommendation by the search committee.
- 18 Sec. 8. Meetings of the Board. The Board shall
- 19 regularly convene once every three (3) months. Whenever
- 20 necessary, the chairperson of the Board may call, upon three

- 1 (3) days' prior written notice to the members, a maximum of
- 2 two (2) special meetings within the same period.
- 3 A quorum of the Board shall consist of majority of all
- 4 its members holding office at the time of the meeting:
- 5 Provided, however, That the chairperson of the Board or the
- 6 President of the University is among those present in the
- 7 meeting.
- 8 In the absence of the Chairperson of the CHED, a duly
- 9 designated CHED commissioner shall represent the
- 10 Chairperson of the CHED in the meeting, with all the rights
- and responsibilities of a regular member: Provided, That
- 12 during this meeting, the President of the University as vice
- 13 chairperson shall be the presiding officer: Provided, further,
- 14 That this provision notwithstanding, the Chairperson of the
- 15 CHED is hereby authorized to designate a CHED
- 16 commissioner as the regular chairperson of the Board, in
- 17 which case said CHED commissioner shall act as the
- 18 presiding officer.
- 19 In case the chairpersons of the Senate Committee on
- 20 Education, Arts and Culture and House Committee on

- 1 Higher and Technical Education shall not be able to attend
- 2 the Board meeting, they may duly designate their respective
- 3 representatives to attend the meeting, who shall have the
- 4 same rights and responsibilities as a regular member of the
- 5 Board.
- 6 The members of the Board shall not receive any salary
- 7 but shall be entitled to reimbursements for actual and
- 8 necessary expenses incurred, either in their attendance to
- 9 meetings of the Board or in connection with other official
- 10 business authorized by resolution of the Board, subject to
- 11 existing laws and regulations.
- 12 Sec. 9. President of the University. The University
- 13 shall be headed by a President, who shall render full-time
- 14 service and who shall be appointed by the Board, subject to
- 15 the guidelines, qualifications and standards set by the
- 16 Board, upon recommendation of a duly constituted search
- 17 committee. The President of the University shall have a term
- 18 of four (4) years and shall be eligible for reappointment for
- 19 another term: Provided, That in order to effect a smooth
- 20 transition to a state university, the incumbent President of

- 1 the Davao Oriental State College of Science and Technology
- 2 shall serve as the first President of the University.
- Within six (6) months before the expiration of the term
- 4 of office of the incumbent President of the University, the
- 5 Board shall constitute the search committee for the
- 6 Presidency.
- 7 In case of vacancy in the Office of the University
- 8 President by reason of death, compulsory retirement,
- 9 resignation, removal for cause or incapacity of the President
- 10 to perform the functions of the office, the Board shall
- 11 designate an officer-in-charge of the University within six
- 12 (6) months from the date of the vacancy, pending the
- 13 appointment of a new President. The successor or the officer-
- 14 in-charge shall serve only the unexpired portion of the term.
- The powers and duties of the President of the
- 16 University, in addition to those specifically provided in this
- 17 Act, shall be those usually pertaining to the Office of the
- 18 President of similar universities, and those delegated by the
- 19 Board.

1	The salary of the President of the University shall be in
2	accordance with the Revised Compensation and Position
3	Classification System and shall be comparable to that being
4	received by the presidents of similar educational institutions.
5	The President of the University shall be assisted by a
6	Vice President for Academic Affairs and a Vice President for
7	Administration, who shall be appointed by the Board upon
8	recommendation of the President of the University.
9	Sec. 10. Secretary of the University The Board shall
10	appoint a Secretary, who shall serve as such for both the
11	Board and the University and shall keep all records and
12	proceedings of the Board. The Secretary of the University
13	shall serve upon each member of the Board the appropriate
14	notice of the Board of meetings.
15	SEC. 11. Treasurer of the University. – The Treasurer of
16	the Philippines shall be the ex officio Treasurer of the
17	University.
18	SEC. 12. Administrative Council There shall be an
19	Administrative Council consisting of the President of the
20	University as chairperson, vice presidents, deans, directors and

- 1 other officials of equal rank as members, whose duty is to
- 2 review and recommend to the Board the policies governing
- 3 the administration, management and development planning
- 4 of the University.
- 5 SEC. 13. Academic Council. There shall be an
- 6 Academic Council to be composed of the President of the
- 7 University, who shall act as chairperson, and all academic
- 8 staff with the rank of at least assistant professor, as
- 9 members.

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- The Academic Council shall have the power to review
- 11 and recommend the curricular offerings and rules of
- 12 discipline of the University, subject to the approval of the
- 13 Board. It shall fix the requirements for the admission of
- 14 students as well as for their graduation and conferment of
- 15 degrees, subject to review and approval by the Board

through the President of the University. It shall have the

- 17 disciplinary power over students of the University and shall
- 18 formulate academic policies and rules and regulations on
- 19 discipline, subject to the approval of the Board.

1	Sec.14. Faculty. – No political beliefs, gender preference,
2	cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin, and
3	religious opinion or affiliation shall be a matter of inquiry in
4	the appointment of faculty members of the University:
5	Provided, That the appointment shall be subject to the
6	guidelines, qualifications and standards set by the Board:
7	Provided, further, That no member of the faculty shall teach
8	for or against any particular church or religious sect.
9	SEC. 15. Scholarship Program and Admission The
10	University shall provide a scholarship program and other
11	affirmative action programs to assist poor but deserving
12	students who qualify for admission to the University.
13	No student shall be denied admission to the University
14	by reason of sex, religion, cultural or community affiliation
15	or ethnic origin.
16	Sec. 16. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus,
17	Equipment, Supplies and Detail of Personnel The heads
18	of the bureaus and offices of the national government are
19	hereby authorized to loan or transfer, upon the request of the
20	President of the University, apparatus, equipment or

- 1 supplies as may be needed by the University, and to detail
- 2 employees for duty therein when, in the judgment of the
- 3 head of the bureau or office, such apparatus, equipment,
- 4 supplies or services of such employees can be spared without
- 5 serious detriment to public service.
- The employees so detailed shall perform such duties as
- 7 required of them by the President of the University, and the
- 8 time so employed shall be counted as part of their regular
- 9 service.
- 10 Sec. 17. Assets, Liabilities and Personnel. All assets,
- 11 real and personal, personnel and records of the Davao
- 12 Oriental State College of Science and Technology, including
- 13 those of the extension campuses in the municipalities of
- 14 Banaybanay, Cateel and San Isidro, as well as liabilities or
- 15 obligations, are hereby transferred to the University. The
- 16 positions, right and security of tenure of faculty members
- 17 and personnel therein employed under existing laws prior to
- 18 the conversion into a University shall be respected.
- 19 All parcels of land belonging to the government
- 20 occupied by the Davao Oriental State College of Science and

- 1 Technology and its campuses in the municipalities of Banaybay,
- 2 Cateel and San Isidro are hereby declared to be the property
- 3 of the University and shall be titled under that name:
- 4 Provided, That should the University cease to exist or be
- 5 abolished or should such parcels of land aforementioned be
- 6 no longer needed by the University, the same shall revert to
- 7 the LGUs concerned.
- 8 SEC. 18. Tax Exemption on Importation and Donations.
- 9 The importation of economic, technical and cultural books
- 10 or publications, which is for economic, technical, vocational,
- 11 scientific, philosophical, historical or cultural purposes
- 12 made by the University upon certification by the CHED,
- 13 shall be exempt from customs duties in accordance with the
- 14 provisions of the Tariff and Customs Code of the Philippines,
- 15 as amended.
- 16 Donations in any form to the University shall be
- 17 exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall be
- 18 considered as allowable deduction from the gross income in
- 19 the computation of the income tax of the donor, in

accordance with the provisions of the National Internal

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2	Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.
3	SEC. 19. Appropriations The amount necessary to
4	carry out the provisions of this Act shall be charged against
5	the current year's appropriations of the Davao Oriental State
6	College of Science and Technology. Thereafter, such sums as
7	may be necessary for the continued operation and
8	maintenance of the University shall be included in the
9	annual General Appropriations Act.
10	Sec. 20. Development Plan, Management Audit and
11	Academic Structure Within the period of one hundred
12	twenty (120) days after the approval of this Act, the
13	University shall accomplish the following:

- 14 (a) Submit a five-year development plan, including its
 15 corresponding program budget to the CHED, for
 16 corresponding recommendation to the DBM;
- 17 (b) Undergo a management audit in cooperation with 18 the CHED; and

1	(c) Set up its organizational, administrative as well as
2	academic structure, including the appointment of key
3	officials of the University.
4	SEC. 21. Filing of Report On or before the fifteenth
5	day of the second month after the opening of the regular
6	classes of each year, the Board shall file with the Office of
7	the President of the Philippines through the Chairperson of
8	the CHED, and with both Houses of Congress, a detailed
9	report on the progress, conditions and needs of the
10	University.
11	SEC. 22. Suppletory Application The provisions of
12	Republic Act No. 8292, otherwise known as the "Higher
13	Education Modernization Act of 1997', shall be an integral
14	part of this Act and shall serve as part of the governing
15	charter of the University.
16	Sec. 23. Compliance with CHED Requirements. – The
17	provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the conversion of the
18	institution into a state university, shall become effective only
19	upon the determination and declaration by the CHED, based

on the recommendation of a panel of experts it shall

- 1 constitute for the purpose, that the institution has complied
- 2 with the requirements for a university status based on
- 3 CHED Memorandum Order No. 46, series of 2012.
- 4 The institution shall retain its status prior to the
- 5 effectivity of this Act until it is able to comply with the
- 6 requirements provided herein.
- 7 SEC. 24. Parity Clause. All other powers, functions
- 8 and privileges, responsibilities and limitations to state
- 9 universities and their officials under existing laws shall be
- 10 deemed granted to or imposed upon the University and its
- 11 officials, whenever appropriate.
- 12 Sec. 25. Implementing Rules and Regulations. Within
- 13 sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Board
- 14 shall, in consultation with the CHED, formulate the
- 15 guidelines to fully implement the provisions of this Act.
- 16 Sec. 26. Separability Clause. If any part or provision
- 17 of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the
- 18 remaining parts or provisions not affected shall remain in
- 19 full force and effect.

- 1 Sec. 27. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential
- 2 decrees, executive orders, rules and regulation contrary to or
- 3 inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby
- 4 repealed or modified accordingly.
- 5 SEC. 28. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen
- 6 (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a
- 7 newspaper of general circulation.
