EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article XIV, Section 4(1) mandates the State to exercise reasonable supervision and regulation of all educational institutions. The crime incidence in campuses has steadily risen. There is a need to inform the parents and guardian, as well as their children and wards, about crimes that happened in a particular educational institution and about its security policies and procedures.

This bill aims to provide a safe and healthy environment for students by requiring educational institutions:

- 1. To develop security policies and procedures;
- 2. To report crimes on campuses; and
- 3. To develop policies and procedures to address violent crimes on college campuses.

AN ACT TO PROMOTE CRIME AWARENESS AND SECURITY IN CAMPUSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. – This Act may be cited as the "Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. – It shall be the policy of the State to provide a safe and healthy environment for students by requiring educational institutions to disclose crime statistics that occur within the campus and its security policies and procedures.

SECTION 3. Definition of Terms. -

- (1) The term "campus" includes -
- (a) any building or property owned or controlled by an institution of higher education within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support of, or related to its educational purposes;
- (b) any building or property owned or controlled by student organizations recognized by the institution.

In cases where branch campuses of an institution of higher education, schools within an institution are not within reasonably contiguous geographic area, such entities shall be considered separate campuses for purposes of the reporting requirements of this Act.

(2) The term "Secretary" refers to the Secretary of Department of Education.

SECTION 4. Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics

(1) Disclosure Requirements -

(a) Upon effectivity of this Act, each eligible campus shall begin to collect the

following information with respect to campus crime statistics and campus security policies and

each year thereafter, prepare, publish, and distribute, through appropriate publications or

mailings, to all current students and employees, and to any applicant for enrollment or

employment upon request, an annual security report containing at least the following information

with respect to the campus security policies and campus crime statistics of that institution;

(b) A statement of current campus policies regarding procedures and facilities for

students and other to report criminal actions or other emergencies occurring on campus and

policies concerning the institution's response to such reports.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part thereof, is held invalid or

unconstitutional, the reminder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall remain

valid and subsisting.

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. - Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive

order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to, or inconsistent

with, the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

SECTION 7. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its

publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
