EXPLANATORY NOTE

Religious freedom in the Philippines promoted the growth of many religious groups in the country. The Iglesia ni Cristo (INC) is one of these groups.

The Iglesia ni Cristo (INC) was founded on July 27, 1914 by its current leader's father Felix Manalo. The Iglesia's first church in the country was located in Punta, Manila's Santa Ana district after its first converts were baptized in the nearby Pasig River. It has several million members and has expanded considerably to countries in all continents. By some accounts, it is considered the second largest formal religion in the Philippines after Catholicism.

The Iglesia ni Cristo rapidly grew from one church building in Sampaloc, Manila to hundreds of churches around the world and has emerged strong in the United States, Canada, England, Germany, Hawaii, Guam and Hong Kong. This is clearly a strong testament not only to the INC's growth as a religious sector in our society but a manifestation of the resilience of the Filipinos' faith.

The Iglesia ni Cristo uses vernacular languages in teaching and preaching the Gospel. Its law-abiding, disciplined leadership and members have made Iglesia ni Cristo a role model for other religious organizations. Attending not only to the religious needs of its flock, Iglesia ni Cristo also looks after their members' economic and physical well being through socio-economic projects, such as job placements, housing, and education.

The intention of this bill is to declare the 27th day of July of every year as a national holiday in observance of the founding anniversary of the Iglesia ni Cristo (INC).

In view of the foregoing, immediate approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

DECLARING THE TWENTY SEVENTH DAY OF JULY OF EVERY YEAR, A SPECIAL NATIONAL HOLIDAY, IN OBSERVANCE OF THE FOUNDING ANNIVERSARY OF THE IGLESIA NI CRISTO (INC) AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The twenty-seventh (27) day of July of every year, is hereby declared a 1 special national holiday for the observance of the founding anniversary of the Iglesia ni Cristo 2 (INC). 3 4 Section 26, Chapter 7 of Executive Order No. 292, otherwise known as the SEC. 2. Revised Administrative Code of 1987, is hereby amended to read as follows: 5 "SEC. 26.
