EXPLANATORY NOTE

Our Constitution mandates that appropriate steps be taken to make education accessible to all. Pursuant to this, the Special Program for Employment of Students (SPES) has been institutionalized under Republic Act No. 7323, otherwise known as "An Act to Help Poor But Deserving Students Pursue Their Education By Encouraging Their Employment During Summer and/ or Christmas Vacations, Through Incentives Granted to Employers, Allowing Them to Pay Only Sixty Per Centum of Their Salaries or Wages and the Forty Per Centum Through Education Vouchers to be Paid by the Government, Prohibiting and Penalizing the Filing of Fraudulent or Fictitious Claims, and for Other Purposes."

Since its enactment, the SPES Program has helped poor students to graduate and earn a college degree or a vocational diploma. Records show the increase of SPES placements every year, which clearly indicate that the program is indeed an effective tool for students in their pursuit of education.

With a budget of PhP 60 million when it was first introduced in 1992, the program benefited 48,121 students nationwide. Because of its inspiring success and innovative approach – private employers sharing in the cost of financing education – the SPES has become a continuing program of the government for poor but deserving students.

This bill seeks to strengthen the SPES Program through the following amendments:

- 1. adjustment of income requirement for coverage under the law;
- 2. penalize those who dishonor education vouchers;
- 3. lessen the coverage of employment size of establishment; and
- 4. make the program a year-round activity.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill, strengthening further and broadening the coverage of the SPES Program, is earnestly requested.

AN ACT STRENGTHENING FURTHER AND BROADENING THE COVERAGE OF THE SPECIAL PROGRAM FOR EMPLOYMENT OF STUDENTS, AMENDING FOR THIS PURPOSE CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7323, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Republic Act No. 7323, otherwise known as
 "Special Program for Employment of Students (SPES)," is hereby amended to
 read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Any provision of the Act to the contrary 4 notwithstanding, any person or entity employing [at least fifty 5 (50%)] MORE THAN TEN (10) persons may [, during the Summer 6 and/or Christmas vacations, J employ poor but deserving students, 7 fifteen (15) years of age but not more than twenty-five (25) years 8 old, paying them a salary wage not lower than the minimum wage 9 FOR PRIVATE EMPLOYERS AND THE APPLICABLE HIRING 10 RATE FOR THE NATIONAL AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT 11 AGENCIES: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT THEIR 12 EMPLOYMENT SHALL NOT EXCEED THREE (3) MONTHS: 13 PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT STUDENTS EMPLOYED IN 14 ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THEIR COURSE SHALL EARN 15

EQUIVALENT ACADEMIC CREDITS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES [provided by law and other applicable labor rules and regulations].

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"For purposes of this Act, poor but deserving students refer 4 to those whose parents' combined income[s], together with their 5 lincomel OWN, if any, do not exceed [Thirty-six thousand pesos 6 (P36,000.00) per annum] THE ANNUAL NATIONAL POVERTY 7 THRESHOLD LEVEL FOR A FAMILY OF SIX (6) FOR THE 8 PRECEDING YEAR AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE 9 NATIONAL STATISTICS COORDINATION BOARD (NSCB). 10 Employment Ishould be at the Labor Exchange Center of the 11 Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE)] FACILITATION 12 SERVICES FOR APPLICANTS TO THE PROGRAM SHALL BE 13 DONE BY THE PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT SERVICE OFFICE 14 (PESO)." 15

16 SEC. 2. Section 2 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2. Sixty percentum (60%) of said salary or wage shall 17 be paid by the employer in cash and forty percentum (40%) by the 18 government in the form of a voucher which shall be applicable in 19 the payment for his tuition fees and books in any educational 20 institution for secondary, tertiary, vocational or technological 21 education. The amount of the educationAL voucher shall be paid 22 by the government to the educational institution concerned within 23 thirty (30) days from its presentation to the officer or agency 24 designated by the Secretary of Finance. 25

26 "The voucher shall not be transferable except when the 27 payee thereof dies or for a justifiable cause stops in his duties in 28 which case it can be transferred to his brothers or sisters. If there be none, the amount thereof shall be paid his heirs or to the payee himself, as the case may be."

SEC. 3. Section 3 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:
 "SEC. 3. The Secretary of Labor and Employment, the
 Secretary of Education, Culture and Sports, CHAIRPERSON OF
 THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION and the Secretary
 of Finance shall issue the corresponding rules and regulations to
 carry out the purposes of this Act.

9 "The Secretary of Labor and Employment shall be the 10 [Project Director of this] Program Chairman."

SEC. 4. Section 4 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 4. Any person or entity who shall make any fraudulent 12 or fictitious claim under this Act, regardless of whether payment has 13 been made, AND ANY PERSON OR ENTITY WHO REFUSES OR 14 DISHONORS AN EDUCATION VOUCHER, shall, upon conviction, 15 be punished with imprisonment of not less than six (6) months and 16 not more than one (1) year and a fine of not less than Ten thousand 17 pesos (P10,000.00), without prejudice to their prosecution and 18 punishment for any other offense punishable under the Revised 19 Penal Code or any other penal statute. 20

"In case of partnerships or corporations, the managing
partner, general manager, or chief executive officer, as the case
may be, shall be criminally liable."

24 SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the 25 Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of national circulation.
