EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Philippines, being in the so-called Circum-Pacific belt of fire and typhoon, is constantly subjected to disasters and calamities. According to a Philippine National Red Cross statement, the Philippines leads the world in the types and frequency of natural disasters and ranked fourth in the number of people killed or affected by floods, tsunamis, typhoons, landslide, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and man-made disaster.

With each disaster comes considerable damage to infrastructure, property and natural resources. Other effects include severe soil erosion, food shortage, and loss of life.

Disaster management encompasses a wide range of disaster-related activities that are undertaken before, during, and after the occurrence of a disaster-causing event, namely: hazards assessment and zoning, disaster protection and risk reduction, monitoring and prediction, contingency planning, emergency response, recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction or redevelopment. As observed, the most effective strategy to minimize the adverse effect of disasters remains to be mitigation and preparedness. Part of Philippines' preparedness strategy is to strengthen linkages with various volunteer groups nationwide.

The government needs to effectively address the issue of rehabilitation and restoration of the affected areas. A coordinating body, headed by the most authoritative leader of the affected region, is therefore the most logical organization for dealing with disasters. Thus, this bill seeks to amend Section 3 of Presidential Decree No. 1566, also known as "An Act Strengthening the Philippine Disaster Control, Capability and Establishing the National Program on Community Disaster Preparedness" to provide a more responsive Regional Disaster Coordinating Council. It shall act as the central agency in evacuating victims as well as rehabilitating areas affected by the natural disasters.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

AN ACT

AMENDING SEC. 3 OF PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1566, ALSO KNOWN AS AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE PHILIPPINE DISASTER CONTROL, CAPABILITY AND ESTABLISHING THE NATIONAL PROGRAM ON **COMMUNITY DISASTER PREPAREDNESS**

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Republic of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Sec. 3 of Presidential Decree No. 1566 is hereby amended to be read as:

"Sec. 3. Organization of the Regional Rehabilitation Council. - At the regional level, there shall be constituted a Regional Disaster Coordinating Council [with Regional Commissioner or the official so designated by the President as Chairman]. The Council shall be composed of the [executives of regional offices and field stations at the regional level DENR REGIONAL DIRECTOR, DPWH **REGIONAL** DIRECTOR, THE **PROVINCIAL** CITY/MUNICIPAL ENVIRONMENT OFFICE (PEO), 10 ENVIRONMENT OFFICE, AND CITY/MUNICIPAL ENGINEERING OFFICE. THEY SHALL ELECT AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE REGIONAL REHABILITATION COUNCIL THE CHAIRMAN THEREOF. The Council shall establish an operating facility to be known as the Regional Disaster Operations Center.

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THE REGIONAL REHABILITATION COUNCIL SHALL APPOINT AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THREE (3) TECHNICAL STAFF TO TAKE CHARGE OF THE TECHNICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS OF THE REGIONAL REHABILITATION COUNCIL.

A. POWERS OF THE REGIONAL REHABILITATION

COUNCIL. – IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE THE GOALS AND

OBJECTIVES UNDER THIS ACT, THE REGIONAL

REHABILITATION COUNCIL SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING

POWERS:

- (1) TO FORMULATE POLICIES AND PLANS FOR THE EVACUATION AND REHABILITATION OF VICTIMS IN THEIR SPECIFIC AREAS OF CONCERN;
- (2) TO COORDINATE AND CONSULT WITH THE CONCERNED NATIONAL AND LOCAL OFFICIALS, BOTH ELECTIVE AND APPOINTIVE, AS WELL AS ACCREDITED NON-GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATIONS (NGOs) IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ITS EVACUATION AND REHABILITATION EFFORTS;
- (3) TO CALL UPON ANY OFFICE, INSTRUMENTALITY, AGENCY, OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE GOVERNMENT FOR SUCH ASSISTANCE, AS MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE ATTAINMENT OF THE OBJECTIVES OF THE COMMISSION;

(4) TO PERFORM SUCH OTHER FUNCTION/ACTIVITIES TO WILLFULLY CARRY OUT THE OBJECTIVES OF THIS ACT.

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B. EFFECT OF RECOMMENDATION. — THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE REGIONAL REHABILITATION COUNCIL, DULY ADOPTED AND ISSUED, SHALL BE BINDING ON THE REGIONAL REHABILITATION COUNCIL AND OTHER CONCERNED AGENCIES OF THE GOVERNMENT.

C. CONSTRUCTION OF PROVINCIAL REHABILITATION CENTERS. THERE SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED REHABILITATION CENTERS, IN PROVINCES TO BE DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, WHICH SHALL SERVE AS PRIMARY EVACUATION CENTERS AND REHABILITATION CENTERS IN EVENT OF DISASTERS, BOTH NATURAL AND MAN-MADE CALAMITIES.

D. FUNDING. – THERE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM AS MAY BE NECESSARY OUT OF ANY FUNDS IN THE NATIONAL TREASURY NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED TO ORGANIZE THE RRC AND SUPPORT ITS INITIAL OPERATIONS. THEREAFTER, THE AMOUNT NECESSARY FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS.

E. RULES AND REGULATIONS. – THE COUNCIL SHALL ISSUE WITHIN 60 DAYS FROM THE EFFECTIVITY OF THIS ACT. THE NECESSARY REGULATIONS FOR THE EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ACT."

- SEC. 2. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and
- 2 regulations or any part thereof which are inconsistent herewith are hereby
- 3 deemed repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 3. Separability Clause. If for any reason, any section or provision of
- 5 this Act or any portion of this Act thereof, or the application of such section,
- 6 provision or portion is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder thereof
- ⁷ shall not be affected by such declaration.
- SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
