AN ACT DECLARING AUGUST 30 OF EVERY YEAR AS "NATIONAL PRESS FREEDOM DAY" AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. August 30 of every year is hereby declared as "National Press Freedom Day", a working holiday, in honor of Marcelo H. del Pilar, the father of Philippine Journalism, who wrote under the pen name "Plaridel", and who was born on August 30, 1850.
- 6 SEC. 2. To ensure the meaningful observance and 7 celebration of National Press Freedom Day, all government

- 1 agencies and instrumentalities, the Armed Forces of the
- 2 Philippines, the Philippine National Police, government-
- 3 owned and controlled corporations, local government units,
- 4 as well as the private sector shall afford sufficient time and
- 5 opportunity for their employees to engage and participate
- 6 in any related activity to be conducted in the premises of
- 7 their respective offices or establishments.
- 8 SEC. 3. The Department of Education (DepED), the
- 9 Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and the
- 10 Technical Education and Skills Development Authority
- 11 (TESDA) in consultation with the Office of the President
- 12 (OP), government and private media organizations shall
- 13 lead public and private schools at all levels in organizing
- 14 consciousness-raising activities on the importance of the
- 15 press, their rights and social responsibilities, and the
- elimination of all forms of violence against the press.
- 17 SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
- 18 after its publication in the Official Gazette or in any
- 19 newspaper of general circulation.
