## AN ACT EXPANDING THE APPLICATION OF THE LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND BY AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10121, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE PHILIPPINE DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT ACT OF 2010

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 25, of the 1987 Constitution provides that "The State shall ensure the autonomy of local governments". Section 2 of the Local Government Code also states that "the State shall provide for a more responsive and accountable local government structure instituted through a system of decentralization whereby local government units shall be given more powers, authority, responsibilities, and resources".

RA 10121 or the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act has placed the local government units in the frontline of disaster preparedness, response and rehabilitation. It transformed the calamity funds of the LGUs into the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund. Under the present law, the LDRRMF may now be utilized by the LGUs to fund projects and programs that enhance disaster preparedness and mitigate the effects of calamities.

In the unfortunate event that disaster or calamity strikes, it is the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office in the LGUs that are at the forefront of Mother Nature's wrath in providing safety and protection for their constituents. However, due to budgetary restrictions, LGUs are unable hire the necessary man power to provide adequate response and assistance to affected citizens during disasters.

It must also be noted, that the effects of disasters would be greatly mitigated and reduced if LGUs will have the necessary funds to provide local infrastructure projects designed to protect against natural disasters. The after effects of disasters will also be lessened if LGUs are given flexibility in providing for a swift reconstruction, repair and rehabilitation of their infrastructure damaged by disasters.

Conversely, when the LGU does not suffer and disasters or calamities, its LDRRMF accrues to a special trust fund which may only be utilized for disaster risk reduction and management. There are numerous LGUs specially located throughout the Philippines where they are seldom affected by disasters and calamities. The period where the trust fund may revert back to the general fund should be shortened to three (3) years so that the LGU may align unused funds for social services identified by the local sanggunian.

There is an urgent need to broaden the options of the LGUs in the utilization of the LDRRMF. This bill proposes the use of the LDRRMF in funding infrastructure projects designed to mitigate the effects of natural disasters as well as allowing the LGUs to use the LDRRMF to pay for obligations incurred in funding projects related to disaster preparedness and mitigation. Moreover, this bill shall allow the utilization of the LDRRMF in the hiring of the necessary personnel required to implement the provisions of this

Act.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Section 12 of R.A. 10121 is hereby amended
2	to read as follows:
3	Sec. 12. Local Disaster Risk Reduction

5	a) There shall be established an LDRRMO in

Section 21 of R.A. 10121 is hereby amended to read as 17 18 follows: Sec. 21. Local Disaster Risk Reduction 19 and Management Fund (LDRRMF). - The 20 present Local Calamity Fund shall henceforth be 21 known as the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and 22 Management Fund (LDRRMF). Not less 23 than five percent (Solo) of the estimated revenue 24 from regular sources shall be set aside as the 25 LDRRMF to support disaster risk management 26 activities such as, but not limited to, pre-disaster 27 including preparedness programs training, 28 purchasing life-saving rescue equipment, supplies 29 and medicines, for post- disaster activities, 30 CONSTRUCTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE 31 PROJECTS CERTIFIED BY THE NATIONAL 32

REDUCTION AND DISASTER RISK 1 MANAGEMENT COUNCIL AS NECESSARY IN 2 MITIGATING AND REDUCING THE EFFECTS 3 OF DISASTERS, and for the payment of 4 premiums on calamity insurance. THE LDRRMF 5 MAY ALSO BE USED TO PAY FOR WHATEVER 6 OBLIGATIONS THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT 7 THE **RECONSTRUTION**, INCURRED IN 8 REPAIR, AND REHABILITATION OF MAJOR 9 INFRASTRUCTURE DAMAGED BY 10 DISASTERS. The LDRRMC shall monitor and 11 evaluate the use and disbursement of the LDRRMF 12 the LDRRMP 13 based on as incorporated in the local development plans and 14 annual work and financial plan. Upon the 15 recommendation of the LDRRMO and approval of 16 the sanggunian concerned, the LDRRMC may 17 transfer the said fund to support 18 disaster risk reduction work of other LDRRMCs 19 which are declared under state of calamity. 20

Of the amount appropriated for LDRRMF, thirty 22 percent (30%) shall be allocated as Quick 23 Response Fund (QRF) or stand-by fund for relief 24 25 and recovery programs in order that situation and living conditions of people in communities or areas 26 stricken by disasters, calamities, epidemics, or 27 complex emergencies, may be normalized as 28 quickly as possible. 29

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31 Unexpended LDRRMF WITHIN THE GIVEN 32 YEAR shall accrue to a special trust fund solely for

1the purpose of supporting disaster risk reduction2and management activities of the LDRRMCs within3the next [five (5)] **THREE (3)** years. Any such4amount still not fully utilized after [five (5)]5**THREE (3)** years shall revert back to the general6fund and will be available for other social services7to be identified by the local sanggunian.

THE LDRRMF SHALL BE LIABLE FOR THE 9 SALARIES, WAGES AND BENEFITS OF ALL 10 APPOINTED RESCUE RESPONSE AND 11 PERSONNEL BY THE LOCAL DISASTER RISK 12 REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE 13 FALLING UNDER SECTION 12, PARAGRAPH 14 (C), SUB-PARAGRAPH (26). 15

16 SEC. 3. *Separability Clause. -* If any provision of this Act is declared 17 invalid or unconstitutional, the provisions not affected thereby shall remain in 18 full force and effect.

19 SEC. 4. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, presidential decrees, executive 20 orders, presidential proclamations, rules and regulations or parts thereof 21 contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified 22 accordingly.

23 SEC. 5. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after 24 its publication in the Official Gazette or at least two (2) national papers of 25 general circulation.
