ESTABLISHING A LABELING AND NUTRITIONAL AWARENESS PROGRAM THAT REQUIRES SCHOOLS TO POST NUTRITIONAL CONTENT INFORMATION REGARDING FOOD SERVED IN THEIR CANTEENS

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article II, Section 13 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being."

Article II, Section 15 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides:

"The State shall protect and promote the right to health and instill health consciousness among them."

Nutrition is the intake of food considered in relation to the body's dietary needs. According to the World Health Organization, poor nutrition can lead to reduced immunity, increased susceptibility to disease, impaired physical and mental development, and reduced productivity. Hence it is our objective to ensure that good nutritional choices becomes a part of their everyday life. In addition it can help them reach and maintain a healthy weight, reduce the risk of chronic diseases and promote overall health.

The proposed bill seeks to establish a program that will require schools to post nutritional content information regarding the food served at schools and guide students to make the right choices in selecting good food in order to lead them to a healthy lifestyle.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

ESTABLISHING A LABELING AND NUTRITIONAL AWARENESS PROGRAM THAT REQUIRES SCHOOLS TO POST NUTRITIONAL CONTENT INFORMATION REGARDING FOOD SERVED IN THEIR CANTEENS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Healthy Food 1 2 Choices for Kids Act." 3 Sec. 2. Definition of Terms. - For purposes of this Act, the term -4 (A) "Nutritionist-dietitian" refers to any person who meets the 5 educational and training requirements to become a licensed 6 7 nutritionist-dietitian by the Professional Regulation 8 Commission; and 9 (B) "Secretary" refers to the Secretary of the Department of 10 Education. 11 Sec. 3. School Labeling and Nutritional Awareness Pilot Program. -12 (A) In General. - The Secretary shall award grants to not more 13 than five regions to assist not more than ten schools in each 14 of such regions in carrying out a pilot program that requires 15 16 schools:

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- To post nutritional content information in school canteens regarding the food items served in the canteens; and
- (2) To teach students about how to make health food selections.
- (B) Grant Amount. The Secretary shall ensure that each grant awarded is of sufficient size and scope to carry out the pilot program.
- (C) Duration of Grants. The Secretary may award grants for multiple years to regions that meet the grant requirements.
- (D) Grant Requirement. To qualify to receive a grant, a region shall submit an application to the Secretary at such time, in such manner, and containing such information and assurances as the Secretary may require, including:
 - An assurance that the region will ensure that each school awarded a subgrant meets the pilot program requirements within one year of such subgrant award;
 - A plan to inform all the schools within the region about the pilot program and the school application requirements;
 - (3) An assurance that the region will use not less than ninety five percent (95%) of the grant funds to award subgrants to schools;
 - (4) An assurance that the region will award such subgrants to at least three, but not more than five, schools in such region that have in effect a program to provide nutritional content information regarding food items served in the canteens of such schools to students attending such schools; and

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- (5) An assurance that the region will award such subgrants to at least three (3), but not more than five (5), schools that are located in the rural areas of such region.
- (E) Subgrant Requirements. To qualify to receive a subgrant, a school shall submit an application to a region receiving a grant at such time, in such manner, and containing such information and assurances as the Secretary may require, including:
 - (1) A plan for implementing the pilot program, including:
 - (a) Efforts to ensure that nutritional content information, including caloric information, regarding the food items served in the school's canteen is posted in a visible location at the point of decision in the canteen and that such information is readable and appropriate for the students who attend the school and the parents or legal guardians of such students;
 - (b) Efforts to develop and implement, or expand a school wellness program or other nutritional awareness program to include an educational program to teach students at the school about making health food selections; and
 - (c) Efforts to consult with a licensed nutritionist-dietitian at least once a year regarding the pilot program requirements described in clauses (a) and (b) and any related nutritional matters;

9	(1)	Guidance The Secretary shall provide guidance to
10		the regions and schools receiving grants or
11		subgrants to assist such regions and schools in
12		meeting the requirements.
13	(2)	Encouragement. – The Secretary shall encourage
14		schools receiving subgrants to post the nutritional
15		content information, including caloric information,
16		regarding food items served at the school on the
17		school's website.
18	(G) Repor	ts. –
19	(1)	Each region receiving grant funds shall submit a
20		report at such time, in such manner, and containing
21		such information as the Secretary may require.
22	(2)	Not later than one year after the effective date of
23		this Act and every two years thereafter, the
24		Secretary shall submit a report to the Committees on
25		Education, Arts and Culture, and Agriculture and
26		Food of the House of Representatives and Senate
27		that contains:
28		(a) The number of schools receiving
29		subgrants; and

1 (b) A detailed description of the status of the 2 pilot program carried out by each school, 3 including a list of program 4 accomplishments and challenges, and an 5 evaluation of the effectiveness of the 6 program, in each school. 7 8 Sec. 4. Appropriations. - The funds needed for the initial implementation of this Act shall be charged against the appropriations of the Department of 9 Education. Thereafter, such amount as may be necessary for its full 10 implementation shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act as a 11 12 distinct and separate item. 13 Sec. 5. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act is held invalid or 14 unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other 15 16 provisions hereof. 17 Sec. 6. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances, or 18 portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are 19 20 hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly. 21 Sec. 7. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days 22 after its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general 23 24 circulation.
